

## Cass wins prep track title

Excellent weather conditions helped the state's prep trackmen set four records in the state Class A high school boys' track championships Saturday.

Detroit Cass won the team championship with 43 points. Flint Southwestern finished second with 34 and Redford was third with 30. Cass' title was only the second by a PSL squad since the Detroit public schools returned to the state meet in 1962. The only other PSL winner was Detroit North-ern in 1971.

Shelby Johnson of Taylor Center edged Detroit Cass sophomore Marcus Allen by 3/10ths of a second in setting a record in the 330-yard low hurdles. Johnson's time was 37.0 with Allen finishing in 37.33.

The old record of 38.8 was set last year by John Harvey of Flint Southwestern.

**ALLEN ALSO SET** a record in the 120-yard high hurdles with a 13.8. His effort erased the record of 13.9 by Bill Tipton of Pontiac Central, set in 1967.

Cass teammate Curtis Cady was second in 14.2 seconds. Richard Watkins of Pontiac Central was third in 14.4.

"The 1-2 Allen-Cade finish helped us the most," Cass Coach Robert Glenn said. "But we also picked up quite a few points as contenders in the relays."

Deon Hogan of Detroit Kettering was one of two double winners. Hogan, who set a state 440-yard record of 47.1 a year ago, won the 100 and 220-yard dashes in 9.8 and 21.8, respectively. In both sprints, Hogan was followed by PSL rival Bob Johnson of Central in 9.9 and 27.3.

Although he didn't set a record, Erik Henriksen was the other double winner for Portage Northern in the one and two-mile events with times of 4:13.5 and 9:04.9.

**PAT KELLY OF** Grand Rapids Union set a record in the discus with a throw of 166 feet, 10 inches. It erased

the 1977 mark of 161-8 by Andy Gheen of Alpena.

Bob Jurczynski of Livonia Stevenson, who never was ranked in The News' weekly listings, was second with a throw of 163-5. Mike Petsch of Redford Union was third with a throw of 162-11. Highly rated Dave Kieley of Livonia Churchill was fourth with a 161-8.

Petsch later won the shot put with a toss of 61 feet, 1 1/4 inches. He was followed by Phillip Wells of Warren Mott in 58- 3/4 and Fred Bieganski of Warren Cousino in 56-7 1/2.

In the other record performance, Paul Piwinski of Warren Cousino high jumped 6 feet, 10 1/2 inches. It bettered by a half inch the 6-10 that Dennis Lewis of Ypsilanti jumped last year.

Randy Woodson of Redford won the 440 in 47.8 as Hogan didn't compete. Torrence Lindsey of Pershing was second at 48.9 and Mike Traylor of Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills was third in 49.4.

Mark Prunte of Pontiac Central won the 880 in 1:53.7, with James Baker of East Kentwood next with 1:55.1. Dewayne Reed of Detroit Northwestern was third with 1:55.9.

In other field events, Jon Lunderberg of Holland won the pole vault with an effort of 13 feet 11 inches and Brian Carpenter of Flint Southwestern won the long jump with a leap of 23 feet 6 1/4 inches.

Redford won the one-mile relay in 3:20.8 to Pershing's 3:21.6.

Flint Southwestern won the 440 and 880 relays with times of 42.4 seconds and 1:28.4. The foursome of Anthony Battle, Reggie Mitchell, Carpenter and Norm Graham ran both times. Cass was second in the 440 and 880 with times of 42.5 and 1:28.6.

### Class C

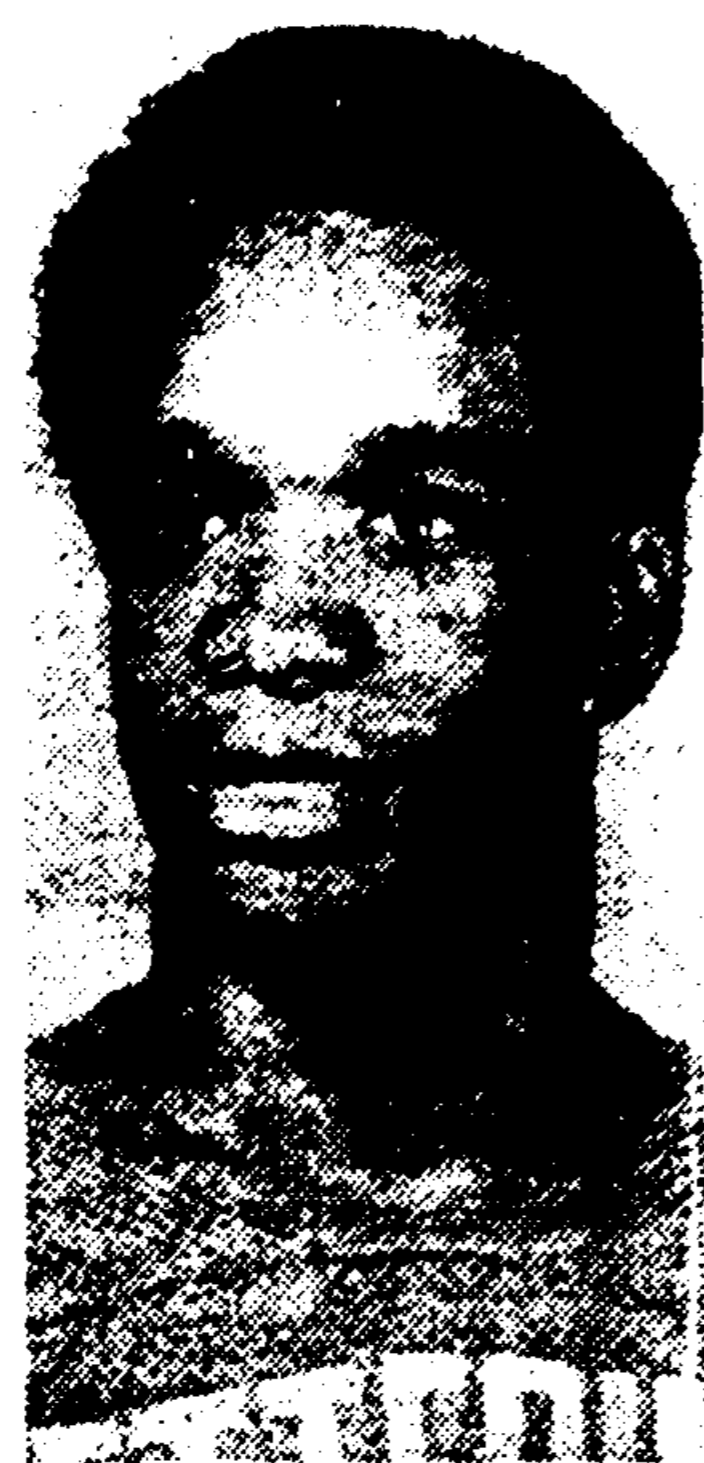
**MICHIGAN CENTER,** Mich. — (AP) — Distance runner Martin Schulist of Whitehall broke the one-mile and two-mile state

### Class B

The teams finished with 29 points each, while Linden was third with 26 and Dearborn Heights Robichaud fourth with 25.

## Mackenzie girls win track title

**BRIGHTON —** Delisa Walton set a national high school record of 2:07.7 in the 880 yard run and lowered the state record to 54.5 in the 440 to lead Detroit Mackenzie to the Class A track title with 41 points.

Finishing behind Mackenzie were Flint Northern (24 1/2), Grand Rapids Ottawa (23) and Detroit Northern (22).

Six state records were set at the Brighton High School track.

Walton, a junior, also ran a leg on the winning mile relay team that set a state record. Carmen Rivers picked up Mackenzie's other first-place points. She beat defending champ Molly Brennan of Waterford Mottin the 220 and finished second in the 100.

Josephine Mask of Lansing Sexton added almost seven feet to the state discus record with a toss of 130-3 and took the shot put at 43- 3/4.

Miriam Boyd of Port Huron was the meet's other double winner. Boyd swept the mile and two-mile, lowering her own state standard in the two-mile by 20 seconds.

Kim Turner of Detroit Mumford lowered the 110 hurdle mark by six seconds with a time of 13.9

Elaine Jones ran a wind-aided 10.8 to take the 100.

### Class B

**OTSEGO —** Rochelle Collins swept the 440 and 880-yard runs to pace Detroit Immaculata to the Class B state track crown.

Immaculata edged Holt by one point for the title with 33 points.

Collins set a state record in the 880 with a time of 2:11.7.

Kim Willis of Southgate Aquinas set a state mark of 14.2 in the low hurdles and Lori Bennett of Livonia Ladywood ran a record 5:00.3 in the mile.

### Class C

**HASLETT —** Susan Bordeaux won the 100- and 220-yard dashes and ran a leg on the record-setting 880-yard relay (1:44.8) to lead Muskegon Catholic to the girls' state Class C track championship. Muskegon Catholic, which won the state Class B title last year, had 56 points. Montrose was second with 50 points and defending champion North Muskegon was third with 46.

Bordeaux won the 100 in 11.6 and the 220 in 25.8. North Muskegon's Annette Bobach, a junior, set records of 46 feet 3/4 inches in the shot put and 127 in the discus. Blissfield's Beth Velddhoff won the long jump at 17-8 and set a record in the 880 with her time of 2:18.9.
