while Delisa Walton sparked Mackenzie to the girls' Class A championship.

As far as individual performances, Kettering's Deon Hogan, who was nursing an injured knee, made perhaps the most inspired effort among PSL athletes.

Hogan scored a double victory in the sprints. He sped over the Guy Houston Stadium course at Flint Northwestern High to win the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds and the 229 in 21.8 seconds. A year ago, Deon set the 440 Class A record of 47.1 seconds competing unattached.

"Hogan has to be one of the finest natural track athletes around," said Bruce Waha, the assistant Michigan State coach who compiles The Detroit News boys' track listings. "He's not the weight-lifting muscular type, but he's solid and has tremendous running

"Hogan was giving himself a stiffer test than if he had only made a 440 title defense. The sprints require more real strength and more running of heats to reach the finals. There are no preliminaries in the 440." Hogan, who is bound for the Univer-

sity of Kansas on a scholarship, twice edged his PSL rival, Bob Johnson of Detroit Central. In the 100 dash, Hogan's winning margin was only onetenth of a second, 9.8 to 9.9. In the 220, Hogan had a slightly better edge on Johnson, 21.8 to 22.3.

Hogan's double victory came off a knee injury suffered during the football season that required surgery last fall. The PSL also was well represented by Allen, who sparked the team tri-

umph by Detroit Cass.

*

The 6-foot-3, 16S-pound Allen set a record in the 120-yard high burdles in 13.8 seconds after being edged by Shelby Johnson of Taylor Center in the 330 low hurdles. Johnson was clocked in a state record time of 37.0 seconds to Allen's 37.33 in lows.

Allen's high hurdles time erased the second oldest Class A record of 13.9 seconds set by Bill Tipton of Pontiac Central in 1967. Curtis Cady of Cass was second in 14.2.

Cass took the team title under Coach Robert Glenn with 43 points to Flint Southwestern's 34 and Redford's 30.

In Class A, four records were set. Besides the two hurdles marks, Paul Piwinski of Warren Cousino leaped 6 feet, 10% inches in the high jump, and Pat Kelly of Grand Rapids Union tossed the discus 166 feet, 10 inches. Both former records had been set last year: 6-10 in the high jump by Dennis Lewis of Ypsilanti and 161-8 in the discus by Andy Green of Alpena.

In the girls' state championships, Walton remained unbeaten in the 880 and 440 at the Class A meet to lead Mackenzie to the title.

Walton, a junior, took the 880 in a national record time of 2:07.7, smashing the four-year state record of 2:14.4 set by Sue Parks of Ypsilanti.


She also knocked more than two seconds off Ruth Hubbard's record in the 440, winning easily in a time of 54.5.

Later this month, Walton will compete in the National AAU Junior Women's Track and Field Championships, where she is entered in the 800 meters and mile relay.

Mackenzie, which scored 41 points, also picked up first-place points from Carmen Rivers in the 220 and from its mile relay team.


