

The Mansfield Mehock Relays will be taking on a new and exciting look April 13 - 14. For the first time since the Relays' 1927 inception, all running events will be staged over metric distances.

Malabar High School's Mehock Field track has been cut back slightly to become a meter oval and --better yet--the super-fast, 10 lane all-weather facility has been completely resurfaced, at a cost of \$45,000, to insure an excellent running surface.

Tougher eligibility standards should produce a smaller, but more competitive, field of participants. Relays officials are seeking quality athletes.

Anticipate seeing the best athletes available from a five-state area and Ontario, Can. Four individual champions from the 1978 Relays are expected to defend their hard-earned titles.

New director, new distances, new surface, new records, new young stars, but the same old Mansfield-Mehock Relays--the finest early-season high-school track and field meet in the United States.

Cooperation of competing schools is of vital importance in the successful development of publicity for the Relays. Please send pictures (you can probably get them from your newspaper) and stories concerning your top athletes. We need individual records of your stars for release to wire services and other newspapers. RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

Please be sure your athlete can meet these standards.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fifth place.


Sixth Place will receive no awards other than one team point.

For Coaches and Athletes**

There is an area at the end of the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field. (With present facilities this is the best we can do).

The POLE VAULT PITS have been moved to the North side of the field in order to establish a finish line. Port-A-Pits are installed for the high jump and pole vault.

Scores for events will be announced over the Public Address System.



RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle became only the third meet director in the 48-year history of the Mehock Relays this year. He replaces Al Ward, who resigned last year after directing the event for the past two years. The late Henry Mehock, who originated the meet, guided the Relays through its first 36 editions.

The Relays committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 48th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 13, 14, 1979. "America's largest independent interscholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1979 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1978 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1978 renewal drew 273 high schools from six states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, West Virginia, Kentucky and Canada. One hundred and twenty-five of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 2,286 athletes.

FORTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL RELAYS

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Entry Fee - \$2.00 per athlete.

Deadline for Entries - April 4, 1979.

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 13th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600 relay teams, 4 x 800 relay teams, medley relay teams and 3000 meter run contestants. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track - We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discuss pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-FOURTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privilege. The athletes' shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

Heat leaders - Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch - Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for a nominal sum starting at 10:30 A.M.

NOTE TO COACHES

Ohio Track Rule - 1979

No fault start rule —

Rule 7 Article 6 Page 35

RUNNERS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED ON THE FIRST FALSE START!

It is a false start if a runner fails to comply with the starters' commands, or if a runner is in motion after the command "set", or if a runner leaves the mark with a hand or foot after the "set" instruction but before the pistol is fired, or if a runner leaves the mark without pistol being fired. **THE OFFENDER OR OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.**

SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1500-meters, the 400-meters, 4 x 800-relay, 4 x 1600-relay, 800-relay, medley relay, 800-meter run, shuttle hurdle relay, 1600-meter relay and 3000-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 800 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 13 FT., and in the high jump at 6-1 FT.. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the event starts. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitor's trial or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - **Eoys' Track** - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 52 feet will be measured.

Discus - Only throws of over 150 feet will be measured.

Long Jump - Only jumps over 21 feet will be measured.

300 meters - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line.

200 meter - Prelims will be at the north end. The finals will be Olympic style on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.
