

PSL boys, girls romp to City track crowns

The Public School League scored its third city track championship in four years over the Catholic League by winning both the boys' and girls' honors with wide point margins yesterday at Martin Luther King High field.

The PSL boys won by 95 points, 276-181, while girls dominated by a 161-point margin, 310-139.

Sprinter Demetrius Hallums of Central and miler Erskine Farrow of Northern scored double victories for the boys.

Hallums took the 100-yard dash in 9.72 seconds to Larry Jordan's 9.73 for De Porres. The Central ace also won the 220 in 21.5 seconds. Farrow captured the 880-yard run in 1:53.7 and the mile in 4:14.8.

Allen Chrite, an outstanding football lineman for Chadsey, also scored double. He took the discus with a throw of 154 feet, 3 inches and the shot put with a heave of 57 feet, 6½ inches.

A notable absentee was Birmingham Brother Rice, which is sparked by the state's top-ranked discus and shot put athlete, Jim Browne.

The Catholic League had only three individual winners during the boys' 16-event program. Brendan McCarthy took the pole vault for Bishop Borgess by clearing 11 feet, Don Barnes long jumped 21 feet, 6½ inches for Benedictine and Al Wood high jumped 6 feet, 4 inches for Dearborn Divine Child.

De Porres also won the mile relay in 3:19.07 to Central's 3:1.09. The De Porres foursome was composed of Greg Henderson, Vernon Lynch, Lee Hardy and Ray Robinson.

James Johnson of Cooley won the 440 in 49.8 seconds, Kevin Cleveland of Central took the two-mile in 9:38.7, while Jerome Rivers of Northern and Andre Topp of Central won the 330-yard low hurdles and 120 highs in 37.5 and 14.7 seconds, respectively.

Central also won the 440 and 880 relays in 42.5 seconds and 1:28.2. Dave Beasley and Steve Jones

SWEETNESS — Billy Sims is going to wear No. 20 and run the football for the Lions before the madding crowds in Pontiac this year.

I guarantee he will sign. He will not be signed this week. He might not even be signed by the end of June. But he will be signed and in the backfield before or sometime during summer camp. It is guaranteed.

Though the Lions' latest offer has been called comical, there has been progress between the warring negotiators. — Jerry Argovitz, agent for Sims, and Russ Thomas, guardian of Bill Ford's wallet. There was sweetening and movement as recently as yesterday, even though there remains an enormous gap.

The \$4.5 million figure always has been negotiable. So has the counteroffer of 20 cents per yard out over 20 yards



Maybe the alternative is what Russ Thomas wants.

"I guess this is the way Russ has negotiated for 17 years," Argovitz said. "My whole concern beyond my commitment to Billy is can the Detroit Lions build a winning organization?"

"STAYING AWAY from training camp in July is our only power. Every hour we miss has got to affect the coach, the quarterback, the offense. They can't do anything about working on the system until Billy is there."

All true. All typical negotiation talk when the Lions are involved. It has been that way for 17 years.

Sims will sign eventually and run for the Lions in uniform No. 20; it's guaranteed. And Thomas will beam and gloat and say the vendetta-carrying media are to blame for squeezing the whole scenario out of proportion. That's guaranteed, too.
