GOLDEN MEET

The Mansfield Relays originated in 1927 when the late Harry Mehock invited high school teams from Ashland and Galion to compete against Mansfield Senior in a season-opening track and field meet at Senior's old Stadium Field.

Now, 49 meets later, the 1927 triangular affair has mushroomed into "America's largest independent interscholastic classic," the finest early-season high school track and field meet in the United States, and is known as the Mansfield Mehock Relays, in honor of its founder.

Not only has the meet grown in numbers, both in participating schools and individual athletes, the competition has grown fierce. There are no "soft" records on the books. Remember, the Mansfield Mehock Relays is always held early in April, yet the times and distances produced usually compare favorably with those registered at state meets.

Director Doug Castle expects "several running records to drop this year." Since 1979, all running events on the lightning-fast, 10-lane Mehock Field have been staged over metric distances.

Only change in the 1981 schedule involves holding the pole vault event Friday, with the option of moving it to Saturday, if weather conditions so dictate. Inclement weather last year nearly caused elimination of the event.

Enjoy yourself at the 50th Mansfield Mehock Relays. You could be watching a future world record holder or Olympic champion.



RELAYS DIRECTOR — Doug Castle, in his third year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for sixteen years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College. In addition to the duties as Relays Director Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.



The Relays committee is priviledged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 50th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 10-11, 1981. "America's largest independent interscholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1981 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1980 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1980 renewal drew 204 high schools from six states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, West Virginia, Kentucky and Canada. One hundred and twenty-five of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1800 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Deadline for Entries - April 2, 1981

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 10th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600 relay teams, 4 x 800 relay teams, medley relay teams 3000 meter run contestants and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track - We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE—FOURTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privelege. The athletes' shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

Heat leaders - Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch - Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for nominal sum starting at 10:30 A.M.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS — ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE — Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1500-meters, the 400-meters, 4 x 800-relay, 4 x 1600-meter relay and 3000-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 800 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 12 Ft. 6 In., and in the high jump at 6-1 Ft. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the event starts. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitor's trail or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trail at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boys' Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 52 feet will be measured.

Discus - Only throws of over 150 feet will be measured.

Long Jump - Only jumps over 21 feet will be measured.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on Straight away at the north end. The finals will be Olympic style on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.

RUNNERS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED ON THE FIRST FALSE START!

It is a false start if a runner fails to comply with the starters' commands, or if a runner is in motion after the command "set", or if a runner leaves the mark with a hand or foot after the "set" instruction but before the pistol is fired, or if a runner leaves the mark without pistol being fired. THE OFFENDER OR OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.
