County meet showcases

Macomb Daily Sports Editor STERLING HEIGHTS - Karen Burr can win races anytime, even when she's hobbled with a case of

shin splints.

Mott's ace sprinter proved that beyond the shadow of a doubt when she won two dashes and anchored a winning relay in The Macomb Daily Invitational Meet of Champions Friday night at Sterling Heights High School.

And Bob Finazzo displayed the versatility that made him a quadruple winner earlier in the week at the Bi-County League meet with standout performances in

three events.

Their efforts were rewarded with selections as the overall outstanding performers in the county-wide meet for high school teams.

Other special trophy awards went to Tim Okon, Clintondale, outstanding runner, and Chris Makdisi, Lincoln, outstanding field events performer in the boys portion of the meet.

Janet Julien, L'Anse Creuse, was named best in field events for the girls competition. And Linda Backus, Stevenson, was chosen the outstanding runner.

By her own admission Burr was subpar. Her leg troubles cut her maximum effort by 15 percent, she

estimated afterward.

But it was hard to tell in the 100 yard dash that she won handily in :11.3 seconds. "Usually I get a pretty good start; today it was just average," she said. "But the last half of the race I picked it up."

The 220 yard dash was a different story. Linda Kammer of Richmond pressed her to the finish line. Burr won by a tenth of a second in :25.7.

"I kept seeing her out of the corner of my eye," said Burr. "She really pushed me."

Burr also brought home Mott's victorious 440 relay and anchored a third place mile relay, to boot.

Meanwhile, Finazzo of Lakeview was busy picking up medals with a first place in the 220 yard dash, a runnerup finish in the high jump and a leg on the second place 880 relay.

His big moment was in the 220. Lincoln's Dan Biebuyck matched him stride for stride and both were clocked in :22.7. But it was Finazzo by a hair.

"We were neck-and-neck the whole way." said Finazzo. "I had to get him coming out of the turn." It was a duel that Finazzo aptly described as "guts all the way.

Finazzo ran 22 seconds flat for his split on the 880 relay. And in the high jump he cleared 6-5, the same as Mott's Bob Miller who won the event on fewer misses.

Makdisi won the discus (155-31/2) and shot put (55-73/4) as expected but got some stiff competition in both from Mike Brunner.

Makdisi saved his best for last in the shot and needed that mighty heave to beat Brunner's 53-534. "I was tensed up earlier," he commented. Of his winning finale, he added, "it's all mental, psyching

Okon knew about pressure, too. He and Joe Mihalic of Tower had a photo finish in the 880 yard run. Both were clocked at 1:58.8 with Okon getting the nod. Okon was a tenth of a second off the winning pace of Sterling Heights' Larry Kubiak in the quarter mile.

L'Anse Creuse didn't have its premier performer, Kathy Kost, Friday - an injury forced her to sit out the meet. But the lady Lancers had others to pick up the slack.

Like Julien. She won the long jump (16-43/4) and put on a burst of speed in the stretch to take the two mile in 11:48.8. Cousino's Robin Champagne gave her all she wanted in the distance event and it took a come-from-behind effort by Julien to win it.

"We practice sprints and I figured that last 110 yards was just a wind sprint," she said. "I knew she was going to fight me but I thought I could outkick her.'

Backus also doubled her pleasure, winning the 880 (2:19.2) and the mile (5:12.9) in addition to relay.

In the boys section Mount

Scott Dadswell of Sterling Heights had his hands full winning the 100 yard daash in :10.1. Two other sprinters were clocked at :10.2.

"I didn't think I had it until the finish," he said. "This meet and the Regional (where he also won the sprint race) were very tough. It was tight all the way up to 90 yards. I just pulled it off in the last 10 vards.

The boys mile run turned out to be one of the finest races in meet history. Dale Martin of Mott was a tenth of a second winner over Center Line's Don Johns with a 4:26.1.

The pair were stride for stride around the last turn but Martin beat Johns by a lunge.

"I kept forcing him out (on the

turn)," said Martin. That meant extra distance for Johns to run anchoring a medal-winning mile which probably was Martin's margin.

Another notable performance Clemens swept the relays and saw Mott's Frank Soave repeat his broke a record in the mile relay championship in the long jump
