Three records were
broken: Athens' trio of Chris

and Bill Schenden in the
pole vault (37-6); Rice's
team of Hadeen McKay, Jim
Post, John MacManus and
Ward Bobitz in the 3200-
meter (8:03.2); and Cran-
brook's squad of Richard
Reid, Fred Roth, Tim Can-
non and Javair Saulsberry in
the 4x400 (3:24.6).

There were two new
events, the sprint medley
(400-200-200-800 instead of
400-200-200-400) and shuttle
hurdle (intermediate instead
of low hurdles), so records
were set in those by the
Cranbrook team of
Saulsberry, Reid, Roth and
Cannon (3:32.8) and the
Southfield squad of Jim
Kanaby, Cecil Battles, Dar-
ryl Darden and Cornelius
Edwards (60.6).
