Red Hawks rule girls' meet Colts' boys own city track

In the battle of city supremacy on the high-school track and field circuit Monday, Troy High ruled the boys' meet by a convincing margin, while Athens pulled out a narrow victory in

the girls' meet.

The Colts boys won 11 of 16 events en route to a lopsided 90-42 victory. John Faulkiner was a bright spot for the Red Hawks as he placed first in three events. Faulkiner won the 100-meter dash (11.6), the 400 (53.5) and the 200 (23.9). Teammate Chris Kramer broke the school pole vault record of 13 feet as he cleared the 13-3 mark for first place.

Red Hawk Joe Molnar won the 300 low hurdles in 40.6.

Those were the Athens' highlights.
The rest belonged to Troy.

The Colts won all three relays and had one double-winner. Derek Perry finished first in both heavy field events with a toss of 165-0 in the discus and a heave of 46-9½ in the shot put.

Tom Gagne topped the high-jump competitors with a leap of 6-0, and Mike Hoppe won the long jump with a distance of 17-9½.

Pat LaReau was the high-hurdle winner as he cut the distance in 15.5. Daryl Strecker won the 800 in 2:03.7, and Ken Nash won the two-mile run in 10:28.8. Bill Robins won the mile with a time of 4:44.3.

Troy (2-0) hosts Berkley today while Athens (1-1) hosts Southfield-Lathrup. Both meets start at 4 p.m.

Saturday, the Colts finished sixth in the 18-team West Bloomfield Invita-

tional, which was won by Flint Northern.

Bradd Morse was second in the discus (149-1) as was the 400-meter relay team of Duane Losey, Ken Tanoury, Darren Deese, and Bruce Dorhala (45.3).

IN THE GIRLS' meet, a secondplace finish in the two-mile by Athens freshman Jill Thauvette clinched the dual-meet victory for the Red Hawks as they came out on top of a 63-60 score.

Thauvette knocked 30 seconds off her previous best time to finish second behind Troy's Shelly Reimer in 12:23.0. Reimer clocked in at 12:22.9.

"We needed a second in the two-mile to clinch it," Athens coach John Wencley said. "It was a tremendous effort from Jill. She really ran her heart out."

Athens took firsts in nine of 15 events to clinch its second win in as many meets. Troy evened off to 1-1 after the loss.
