Bears rolled over by Colts' stampede

The streak goes on at Troy High School.

The Colts' boys' track and field team ran its win streak to 14 Thursday with a convincing 106-26 thrashing of Berkeley. The Colts are 3-0 this season and have won 46 of their last 47 meets.

Duane Losey sparked Troy against the hapless Bears as he placed first in the 100-meter run (11.8) and the 200 (24.0). Losey also was a member of the winning 400 and 800 relay teams.

The 400 squad of Losey, Bruce Woehrle, Darrin Deese and Ken Tannoury clocked in at 45.7, while the 800

team of Losey, Jack Johansson, Rob McAdow and Deese was timed in 1:34.6.

The Colts' mile relay team of Johansson, Rick Meeks, Larry Wells and McAdow finished first with a time of 3:32.4.

Pat Lareau was a double winner, as he took both hurdle events. Lareau won the 100 highs in 15.8 and the 300 lows in 40.4. Daryl Strecker won the mile (4:32.0). Ken Nash was the two-mile winner (10:22.1), and Johansson won the 400 (51.2).

In the field events, Derek Perry was the discus winner (154-0). Bradd Morse won the shot put (51-2). Mike Hurley won the pole vault (10-0), and Mike

Hoppe won the long jump (20-2).

of 15-5.

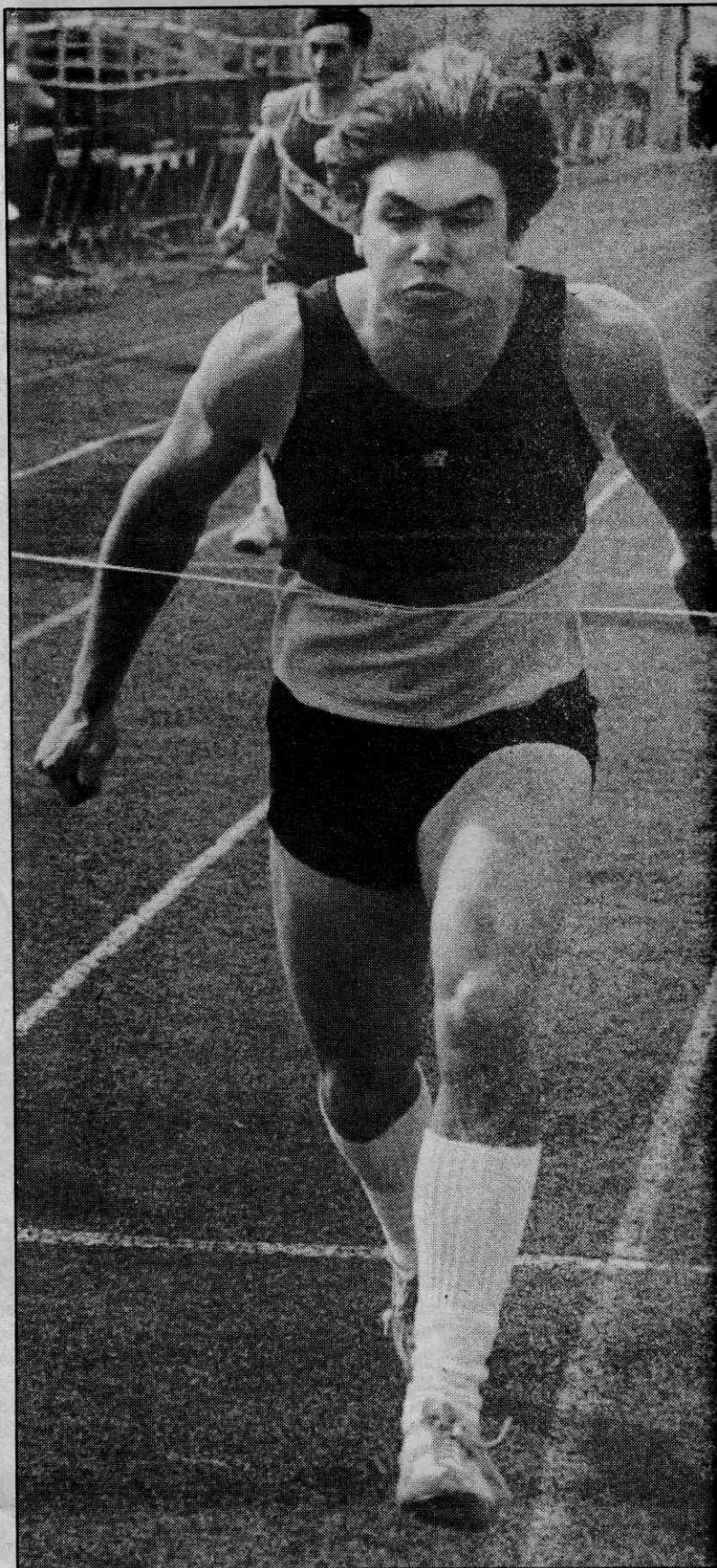
Tuesday, Athens visits Bloomfield
