As the Detroit Country Day girls' track team approached the announcer's stand at Jenison Field House Friday, there was no mistaking which high school had the best team at the 8th annual Spartan Relays for girls.

"You ladies showed all of it today," said Karen Dennis, Michigan State's head women's track coach, as she presented the championship trophy to Country Day. "Congratulations. You ladies are too tough."

**THE TINY** school from Motown scored 55 points to win the Class C title going away. Mason County Central was second with 36 points and Detroit St. Agatha third with 32.

Williamston turned in the best Lansing-area performance, finishing eighth with 13 points.

St. Louis, last year's Spartan Relays winner and Class C state champion, did not enter Friday's meet. The team suffered heavy graduation losses and is presently on its spring break.

**DESPITE THE** remarkable improvement over a 13th-place finish last year, Detroit Country Day coach George Prospero wasn't planning a victory celebration.

"Track is very funny, you can't count on anything," he said. "I figured fifth or sixth place, but things just snowballed. This is a big win for us. We're only four children over the limit for Class D."
