McCleary helps Rice roast CC

Birmingham Brother Rice took command of the Central Division of the Catholic League with an 81-51 victory over Catholic Central Monday afternoon.

John McCleary paced the Rice attack with wins in the long jump (20 feet, 6½ inches) and the 440- (52 seconds) and 220-yard dashes (23.59 seconds).

In the field events, Rice's Dan Hicks (high jump), Matt Sennett (pole vault) and Mark Lytle (discus) were winners. Pat Reid won the shot put for the Shamrocks.

Rice's Brian Cochran won the 100yard dash for Rice with a time of 10.35, and teammate Jim Post took the 880yard run in two minutes even. The distance-race winners were Pat Johnston in the mile (4:24.65) and Joe Davey in the two mile (9:34.15).

Brother Rice won both the mile and 440-yard relays. The Warriors were disqualified for an errant past exchange in the 880-yard relay.

SEAHOLM HIGH School won its first meet of the season Monday, defeating Berkley High School in a Southeastern Michigan Association (SMA) meet, 70-62.

Treg Scott was a double winner for the Maples, taking the 1,600-meter run in 4:25.34 and the 800-meter run in 1:59.41. Craig Keeses won the 3,200meter run with a time of 10:32.4.

Other individual winners for the Maples included Kurt Mills in the shot put (39 feet, 2 inches) and John Mayer

in the discus (133 feet, 83/4 inches).

Seaholm's winning 800-meter relay team included Dan Dooling, Bruce Redman, Kurt Kruger and John Mullet. The 1,600-meter relay team consisted of Redman, Scott, Mullet and John Ballantyne.

Seaholm is 1-7 overall.

BROTHER RICE finished third in the recent 18th annual Brother Rice Relays.

Dearborn High School was a surprising winner with 33 points, and Detroit Central — the favorite — was second with 28. Rice had 23 points.

Detroit Country Day was 10th with seven points, and Bloomfield Hills Andover was 11th in the 13-team field with six points.

The Warriors won two relay events

— the discus and four-mile relays.

Dearborn won five different relays, including a record-setting performance in the high jump relay of 18 feet, 8 inches. Central set records in all three relays it won — the sprint medley, shuttle hurdle and mile relays.
