The girls won 62-61, while the boys won 70-62 in Metro Suburban Activities Association action. The Athens' boys improved their league record to 3-0, while Adams' record evened at 1-1-1. Athens' girls are now 2-1 in the league,

and Adams is 1-2.

The boys' meet was decided by the winning mile relay team of Mark Muczynski, Joe Molnar, Paul Tefelski and John Faulkiner, which finished in 3:31.2.

THE RED HAWKS won the other relays as well. Bill Schendon, Tafelski, Molnar and Faulkiner won the 800meter relay, while Schendon, Molnar,

Tafelski and Chris Davies won the 400 relay.

Faulkiner won the 100-meter dash in 10.9 (which equates to a 10.0 100-yard dash), and the 200 in 22.5. Molnar won the 300 low hurdles in 40.9. Dave Holland won the discus (122-2), and Chris

Kramer won the pole vault (12-0).

Adams was led by triple-winner
Brett Logsdon, who was first in the 110
low hurdles (15.2), the long jump (20-7)

and high jump (6-6).

Jim Cooney won two events, with a 2:04.4 in the 800 and a 4:38.1 in the 1,600 (mile). Jeff Harris won the 400 in 52.9, and Rick Wood won the 3,200 in 10:43.8. Mike Strauss won the shot put

for Adams (41-91/4).

Athens will run Thursday at Royal Oak Dondero in a meet between two unbeaten teams in the league. Adams hosts Groves Thursday.

IN THE GIRLS' meet, the mile relay team of Carolyn Swink, Sandy Krupp, Bonnie Merana and Molly Acton decided the Red Hawks' 62-61 win over Adams. The foursome finished in 4:15.3. Acton also won the 100- (12.6) and

200- (26.0) meter dashes for Athens. Athens won the 800 relay in 1:50.8 with Merana, Leslie Barr, Acton and Lisa Preckel. Adams won the 400 relay in 53.6.

Kathy Kubicki was a double-winner for Adams, with wins in the 1,600 (5:38.0) and the 3,200 (12:37). Diane Klein won the 300 low hurdles in 31.4.

Athens won three of the four field events, including Renee Eickholt's two wins. Eickholt won the shot put (36-2%) and the discus (89-2). Tracy Smith won the high jump for Athens (5-2), and Adams' Jana Hale won the long jump (15-2).

Athens will compete at Dondero Thursday, while Adams is home against Groves.
