

Southfield finishes 3rd in track regional

Troy High School literally showed its strength in winning the 15-team boys' Class A regional track meet over the weekend at West Bloomfield High School.

The Colts, a perennial Oakland County track power, swept the top three places in the discus, and took the first two places in the shot put. Troy also won the mile relay to finish with 94 total points.

Birmingham Brother Rice, the Catholic League Central Division champion, was second with 89 points and Southfield was third with 81½ points.

"Going into the meet those (Troy, Southfield and Rice) were the three favorites to win," said Troy coach John Bancroft. "We just happened to come out on top that day."

"And it was nice because Southfield beat us in a dual meet, and it's always nice to beat Brother Rice," he said.

The first- and second-place finishers in each event automatically qualified for the Class A state meet, which will be June 6 at Flint Northwestern High School. An individual who made a predetermined state cutoff mark in a particular event also qualified.

The Colts had five individual qualifiers and one relay team that qualified.

Bradd Morse won the discus and finished second in the shot put, and Al Meacham was second in the discus. Derrick Perry won the shot put.

In the 400-meter run, Jack Johansson was second.

Troy's winning 1,600-meter relay team included Rob McA Dow, Johansson, Darrin Deese and Daryl Strecker.

SOUTHFIELD, which won the Southeastern Michigan Association (SMA) dual-meet title, won both the 800- and 400-meter relays. In addition, the Blue Jays also won three individual events.

Terrence Robinson and Cornelius Edwards won the 100-meter dash and 110-yard hurdles, respectively. Glenn Williams took the 300-meter low hurdles.

Southfield's second-place finishers included Edwards in the low hurdles and Robinson in the 200-meter dash.

The Blue Jay 800-meter relay team included Darryl Sailor, Mark Harris, Edwards and Robinson. The 400-meter relay team was Robinson, Edwards,

Harris and Mike McCaskill.

Rice's state qualifiers included Ward Bobitz in the 800-meter run, Joe Davey in the 3,200-meter run, Matthew Sennett in the pole vault and John McCleary in the long jump. The Warriors were second in both the 800- and mile-relays.

The only other individual state qualifier from the meet was David Krafur of Southfield-Lathrup. Although he finished third in the 3,200-meter run, he made the state cutoff time in that event to advance to the state meet.

GIRLS' TRACK

West Bloomfield had an easy time winning the girls' state Class A regional track title over the weekend on its own course.

The Laker girls swept the top three places in the 800-meter run and took the first two 200-meter low hurdle spots in mustering 113 total points. Royal Oak Kimball was a distant second with 62.8 points, followed by Bloomfield Hills Lahser with 54.
