

## DeWitt girls, Mason boys run off with Circuit titles

MASON — Since DeWitt High's girls had only beaten Mason High's by one point in the dual meet coaches were offering interesting predictions Tuesday in the Capital Circuit track meet at the Bulldogs

Mason coach Jim Glazier figured his team would win the meet by 22 points and walk away with a cochampionship. DeWitt coach Barry Kloenhamer thought his girls would win by 26 points.

NEITHER COULD claim the accuracy of a prophet, but Kloenhamer came closest. DeWitt outscored Mason, 138-122, to claim the

The boys' winner was no surprise as Mason won its second outright championship in three years. The Bulldogs avenged last year's Circuit-meet loss to DeWitt by stomping the Panthers, 169-11442.

Glazier's prediction was partially
oiled when team leader Becky Horon suffered a pulled tendon in her
right thigh while running the 880yard relay.

GLAZIER WAS counting on Hor ton for either first or second place in the 40 and first in the 890, where she holds the arres' fastest time of 2:233. Instead, she couldn't run the quarter and hobbled to a seventh place finish in the 890, about 10 sec onds behind the 2:29.7 winning time of DeWitt's Sharon Nichlase

Glazier knew DeWitt would wir the meet after Horton's injury, but even after her painful half mile she was telling the coach not to give up "The first thing she asked is, Whan do we have to do to win the meet? She wanted to run the mile relay, I'd say, 'Hey, I've got to have you (in the mile relay),' she'd go out and

But DeWitt's field-event strengther proved too much to overcome. It fact, Kloenhamer said his tean should have beaten Mason by an even wider margin. "It was mostly the discus and long jump that hur us," he said. "We could have scored a lot more points there."

BESIDES LOSING 10 points in those two events, Kloenhamer said DeWitt lost 12 points in running events before regaining some on Nichlas' first place and Marcy Blizzard's third in the 890. His point was obvious – even if Horton was healthy, he wasn't planning on losing the meet

Reying Dewitts will was the sorelay of Tami Noyce, Sheri Schmittl Cindy Faggion and Teresa Kirchen which set a school and track recon at 1:47.3. Kirchen nipped Mason' Kathy Hall at the tape, as the Bull dogs were timed in a school-recon 1:47.33.

Jamie Grant broke her own school

record by 9.8 seconds, beat Charlotte's Liesl Charron and moved atop the Honor Roll list by breaking

THE PENCIL-THIN Grant had lost to Charron in the dual meet when she stayed back and tried to kick. But this time, Glazier changed the strategy, telling her to run with Charron all the way. "We felt that if with 330 yards to go she was within five yards of her (Charron), she would beat her," Glazier said.

Mason's boys had no trouble beating the field as Tony Glowacki won the 100 and 220 dashes and anchored the victorious 440 and 880 relays. An example of Mason's power came in the 220, when John Akers and Mark Pine followed Glowacki across the finish line.

Bulldogs have gone un defeated for the last three season in Capital Circuit dual meets, beat ing every league opponent this sea on by over 39 points. And the league-meet showing is more impressive considering the absence of Mark Waite, who is out for three on the control of t
