Leading Lakeview, L'Anse Creuse to onesided track triumphs

Both gave bravura performances Wednesday at Grosse Pointe North High School in the annual get-together of league track teams. Kost won an unprecedented four individual events in the girls competition leading L'Anse Creuse to a runaway triumph, its third straight Bi-County meet cham-

pionship. Badalamenti did likewise and his four wins propelled Lakeview to a onesided victory, its second league meet title in the last three years.

Although Kost's feat was an historic first in the girls meet, Badalamenti's achievement was just an encore for Lakeview. Last vear Bob Finazzo also won four individual events for the Huskies at the Bi-County meet.
