Huskies shade Bathers in invitational meet

STERLING HEIGHTS — Mount Clemens turned on the speed in the running events but Lakeview's strength in the field events enabled the Huskies to prevail in the Sterling Heights Invitational Track Meet.

But it was just by a two-point margin over the runnerup Bathers, 60-58, in the 12-team meet that boiled down to a duel between Mount Clemens and Sterling Heights.

The Huskies' edge was a whopping 26-6 margin in the field events. Lakeview went 1,3,5 in the long jump, 1 and 3 in the high jump, 2 and 5 in the discus and took a fourth in pole vault. Mount Clemens got a first from Don Gleneski in the shot put but that was it.

"Our field events people came through as we hoped they would," commented Lakeview Coach Pat Wilson. "There were some other good jumpers and throwers who could have hurt us badly. But Frank Badalamenti improved his own best mark by seven inches in the long jump. Sophomore Dan Tavalieri improved by almost a foot and Skip McCain improved by almost five inches in the long jump. "And our others in the field events performed as well as we were counting on."

Lakeview built a substantial lead on the strength of the early field events but Mount Clemens surged ahead in the races. Lakeview regained first place in the team standings in the high jump. The meet came down to the last relay with Lakeview needing a fourth place to clinch it. Mount Clemens won the event, sweeping the relays, but couldn't overtake Lakeview, which finished third, for the championship.

It was the third straight for the Huskies in this meet and the hardest won of the trio.

"It kind of reminds me of our meets with Cousino in the mid-70s in this meet," Wilson mused. "But we lost those."

Three new meet records were set. Chris Makdisi of Lincoln shattered a two-year-old standard in

the discus with a throw of 169 feet, 8 inches. The previous mark was 161-5. Mount Clemens accounted for the other new records, going 1:31.5 in the 880 relay to top a five-year-old mark of 1:31.6. Another record set in '77 — :50.5 in the quarter mile — fell when Kevin Carnes ran a :50.3.

And in the low hurdles Lakeview's Badalamenti equaled his own meet record in the low hurdles with a :39.1.
