Northern runners travel different roads to victory

Routes were different but results were the same Friday night as Northern swept both sections of the 14th C. S. Mott Relays at Houston Stadium.

The Viking girls won eight of 11 events and scored 98 points to capture their fifth straight Mott title in a breeze but the Viking boys used seconds and thirds to support one victory while piling up 64 points for their fourth Mott crown in the last seven years.

Both victories could be considered routine. Coach George Dedrick's girls were conceded the title going into the meet and Coach Norbert Badar's boys have their best team balance in a long time.

THE GIRLS won by 43 points over runner-up Benton Harbor in a 16-team field and the boys by 20 points over Kearsley in a 21-team field.

Neither Dedrick nor Badar were surprised by the triumphs but nevertheless were pleased.

Dedrick, who has Northern pointed toward its fourth straight Class A state championship, said, "I was nervous going into the 400 relay but these kids are hard workers."

He preferred to talk about Assistant Coach Don Durrett whom he credited for a blossoming crew of hurdlers. "We're doing so well because he's brought along his group of girls," Dedrick said.

BADAR'S TEAM won despite a disqualification in the 400 relay which he expected to win. He said, "Several of our guys had personal best times to show we're coming right along. We've had some injuries but we're bouncing back."

The boys' only victory came in the 3,200-meter relay with Joe Sparrow, Stan Ruth, Nigel Banister and Mike Caldwell clocking 7:57.1.

Otherwise there were six seconds, one third and two fourths in the 13 events. An injury to Ed Willingham, Northern's best discus tosser, may have prevented another victory.

KEARSLEY AND third-place Southwestern won three events and Ainsworth two.

Tim Helms, Doug Wheeler and Craig Adas ran on Kearsley's winning 6,400 and distance medley teams. Tim Kindell and Darryl Taylor were part of Southwestern victories in the Mott 800, sprint medley and 1,600-meter relay.

Tom Kesson and Tim Fellows combined to win the discus and shot put for Ainsworth.

Central won the shuttle hurdles and Northwestern the long jump with 1981 state champion Clayton Alexander aiding the victory.

NORTHERN'S GIRLS won everything except the high jump, individual 1,600 and the discus.

Pam Brown and Marlene Isabelle figured in four victories and Monica Taylor and Terri Barber in three.

Brown won the individual 100 meters in 12.6 seconds and helped win the long jump, 800 and 1,600. Isabelle helped win the Mott 2,400, 800, 400 and 1,600. Taylor was with the winners in the long jump, 1,600

and Mott 2,400 while Barber helped win the shuttle hurdles, 800 and 400.

Beecher's Sharron Granberry and Relesia Hicks combined for 228-11 in the discus to win one of the three events which escaped Northern.

Northern also swept both divisions in 1979, the last time Badar's team won.

"You never get tired of winning," Badar said.

Dedrick just smiled. He's had four years of winning.

NEW YORK (UPI) — John
McEnroe, brewing up a new storm
of controversy, and Ivan Lendl con-
tinued along the path toward an-
other victory Friday with straight-set
victories Friday to reach the semi-
finals of the Tournament of Cham-
pions.
After engaging in a shouting
match with John Sadri, the top-
seeded McEnroe went on for a me-
thodical 6-3, 6-3 victory, following
which Lendl, the second seed, dis-
posed of Mel Purcell 6-2, 6-2.

McEnroe and Sadri exchanged
words in the eight game of the
opening set after the feisty New
Yorker had appealed several times
for the umpire to control crowd
movement and on another occasion
slammed a ball into the backdrop.
Sadri yelled out for McEnroe to
stop "carrying on around the
court," which brought a reaction
from the crowd. McEnroe called
back, "real good PR (public relations)
move." Later in the game, after
McEnroe won a point, Sadri said
to him, "Way to go, crybaby."
