

16 Records Fall In S

 QUINCY — The meet was run for fun and with the ideals of sportsmanship in mind, but the cream of Branch County's crop

track and field athletes took it seriously enough to haul down 16 previous records as the Coldwater Daily Reporter's second annual Seton C. Bovee Area Best

track meet ran with nary a hitch last night. Top athletes from Coldwater, Quincy, Bronson, Union City, and Tekonsha gathered at the meet to com-

pete for individual honors only, but before the running, throwing, and jumping were finished 11 previous boy's standards had fallen by the wayside and five new girl's marks were established. Three new school records were also set in the meet as the area thinclads saved some of their season's best efforts for the meet.

Quincy's Mark Ludlov came away from the meet with the top individual harvest, taking home gold medals in the long jump, the high jump, and the 330 yard low hurdles, but several others were not far behind him.

Bronson's Carrie Maddox swept to victory in both the 220 yard dash and the open 440, setting Area Best and Bronson High standards in the latter event with a :60.7 clocking. Maddox' performances topped the meet mark of :62 set by Coldwater's Cathy Page in the inaugural event last year, and beat Julie Himebaugh's :61.5 BHS record.

Coldwater's Kathi Miller came up with wins in both the 110 and 220 yard low hurdles, establishing a CHS record in the 110 lows with a :15.4 clocking, beating her own time of :15.8.

Coldwater's Mike Stahly was the only other individual double winner, taking the boy's discus with a heave of 128'5" and the shot put at

46'1". Performances were consistently excellent throughout the evening. Meet boy's records fell in the 120 yard High Hurdles, the 100 yard dash, the 880 relay, the 440 relay, the 440 yard dash, the 330 yard low hurdles, the 880, the 220, the high jump, the pole vault, and the mile relay. Girl's marks were set in the long jump, the mile, the 440, the 880, and the two mile.

Quincy athletes dominated both the meet and the record performances in boy's competition. Steve Hinds bettered his own mark in winning the 120 High Hurdles in :15.7, beating last year's clocking of :15.9. Ludlow set a mark in the high jump with a 6' effort, Bryan Wymer lowered his own standard in the 220 with a :23.5 clocking, and Jim Supianowski took the 100 yard dash in :10.3 to lower Wymer's previous mark of :10.4.

Brett Cutler sailed to a blistering :52.8 440 clocking to nip Coldwater's Bret Norton after a lap-long dogfight. The effort was enough to bring down Tekonsha's Rod Rocco's mark of :53.4. Ludlow came back to break Tyler Baldwin's 330 low hurdle standard of :40.7, stopping the watches in :40.1 to win a nip and tuck duel with Coldwater's Craig Simmerman.

Coldwater's Steve Uhl ran

a blistering 880 of 2:02.3, leading fellow Cardinal Ron Bercaw (2:04.3) across the line and eclipsing Greg Miller's 2:03.7 of a year ago. Cardinal Jo Jo Wilkins broke his own mark in the pole vault, clearing 33'.

Marks also fell in all three relays. Quincy's unit of Bryan Wymer, Jim Supianowski, Brett Cutler and Todd Strane stepped to a 1:35.6 clocking in the 880 relay, and Steve Hinds replaced Cutler as the Oriole quartet came back to sprint one circuit of the track in :46.1 to break another mark. Coldwater's mile relay crew of Craig Simmerman, Steve Uhl, Ron Bercaw, and Bret Norton set a new mark in the mile relay by cruising the distance in 3:34.6, beating Quincy's mark a year ago.

The girls were more evenly matched as each school represented had at least one winner.

In addition to the 440 mark established by Maddox, records fell in the long jump, the mile run, the 880, and the two mile.

Union City's Malinda Brauker brought down teammate Debbie Spierling's mile standard of 4:43.4 when she completed the four circuits in 5:41.3. Quincy long jumper Tammie Johnston bettered her own mark by leaping 15'8", and Quincy's Kelly Johnson toured the two mile in 11:58.5 to break her own Area Best record.

Quincy's Tina Hand came up with a new school mark and an Area Best standard in the 880 by clicking off a 2:26.5, knocking five seconds off Deb Spierling's winning time of a year ago. Hand's time beat Cheri Laurel's Quincy mark of 2:26.9, set in 1978.

Quincy's Pam Loose tied the meet record of Bronson's Dena Davis and her own school mark as well by taking the high jump at 5'2".

Tekonsha's LeAnn Selby took the shot at 33'4", and Bronson's Marcia Carpenter won the discus with a 103'11" heave. Coldwater's Angela VanBuskirk took the 100 yard dash in :12.2.

Coldwater won the 880 and mile relays while Quincy took the 440 yard relay event.

When all was said and done, the competition was keen, the performances were swift, and the spirit of sportsmanship prevailed in fine fashion. Congratulations to all the athletes and coaches who help make the second running of the Area Best meet one which would live up to the standards and ideals that Seton Bovee stood for. Somewhere he must be smiling.
