Port Huron Northern coach Pete Woods thought his team was better suited for dual meets than multi-team competition until it proved him wrong in Tuesday's Eastern Michigan League meet.

"I thought we had a better dual team, but then we lost twice in the league," Woods said. "Today we had a great team effort. We scored in all but three events."

PHN finished with 120 points while Port Huron, which shared the dual meet crown with Mount Clemens, was second with 118. Mount Clemens came in third with 82½ points after winning Saturday's regional at Romeo.

"I'm not surprised we didn't finish higher," said Bathers' coach Gary Sear. "We would have needed another performance like Saturday's to win. A lot of people turned in outstanding efforts in the regional and we were just plain lucky to win it."

"It was tougher for us to win here because there are fewer teams competing," Sear continued. "Instead of having 19 teams to divide up the points, there are only seven. That means you have to score more to win."

Northern's triumph was highlighted by a double victory by Harlow Meno in the shot put and discus. Woods also lauded the performances of a pair of sophomores — Todd Jackson, who won the 1600-meter run in 4:33.3 and was third in the 3200, and Jim Taylor, the high jump winner who also got a third in the long jump.
