

Watervliet Girls Capture Western Meet

KALAMAZOO—Watervliet girls track team won the C-3 title at the annual Western Michigan University prep track classic by a mere point here Saturday and Benton Harbor's girls lost the A-8 crown by the same margin.

Coach Ron Fares' Panthers, paced by veteran distance ace Linda Hagerb, totaled 41 points to edge out runner-up Stager in a four team battle for the top spot. Middleville, Thos Apple Kallag, was third with 28 and Covert fourth with 25.

An Arbor Pioneer registrer 41 team points to claim the A-8 title with the

figures of Coach Eddie Watson was a distance third with 25.

Watervliet was five points behind Stager and Covert and tied with Thos Apple Kallag, pointing into the final event of the day—the 100 meter relay. But the Panther unit of Nancy Stone, Mary Wankla, Rosemary and Jodie Hagerb won the race in 3:51.7 with 18.

"Going into the meet we had a chance to score some points and had already decided to lead up to our 100 relay unit," said Fares. "That it was a really a dog fight and any of those four teams could have won."

"Overall, I was very pleased with our performance and I feel our time Saturday are ahead of standards for us early in the season," Fares added.

Benton Harbor's performance was also outstanding considering the Tigers were without standout sprinter James Longjohn, who has been hobbled by muscle spasms.

"Since we didn't have the services of James, I have to be excited about our showing," said coach Wade. "It's a long time before the state meet, but from what I hear, James is back. Pioneer is supposed to be our main competition this year."

Some misfortune hit the St. Joseph girls' team at the meet as runner Beth Morrison, last year's top area quarter miler, tore some ligaments in her ankle warming up for the high jump and may be lost for the season.

"We really won't know for a couple of weeks if Beth is lost for the season or not," said a dejected Bear coach Jim Harmon. The 64 Marathon will be attending Notre Dame in the fall on a full-time basketball scholarship.

Watervliet's Hagerbath was the C-3 meet's only triple winner. Besides running 4:14 at the 100 meter, the diminutive senior also took both the 1,000 and 1,500 meter runs in 11:22.4 and 1:57.2, respectively.

"She's (Hagerbath) seems to be running quite strong for this early in the season and just did a super job for us Saturday," said Fares. "But we also have some other girls that placed helping to provide the margin of victory."

Benton Harbor's Carolyn Forsythe was a double winner at the A-8 meet, clearing 5-3 to take the high jump and clearing 4:1 second fast time to win the 100 meter low hurdles. She also ran a leg on the Tigers' second place 1,600 relay unit.

The Tigers' Linda McMillion turned in an all-time area honor roll performance by winning the 400 meter dash in 1:22.8. The time ranks third in area history.

Benton Harbor's Angela Smith was the area's best 800 meter runner in 2:23.1. Her 800 meter will put with a score of 38-3 in the C-3 meet, the area's second best time to win the 800 meter relay unit of Casey Dwyer, Jenny Froese, Valerie Singer and Paula Higgins won in 4:37.2. The Vikings Higgins also took the 400 dash in 1:22.8.

Covert's Brenda Stewart leaped 16 feet to take the long jump, while teammate Michelle Neal won the 400 meter run in 2:23.1. Next Saturday, Watervliet will host the annual boys-to-girls C-3 meet at Reed Fieldhouse.
