

McGuire wins; Concord 9th

CASS CITY — Jesse McGuire closed out his spectacular prep career with a second consecutive Class C individual state cross-country title on Saturday, and Concord's boys' team finished ninth in the meet at Cass City High.

McGuire won a hotly-contested race with James Thomas of Mancelona in the boys' individual race.

The two battle neck-and-neck over the last mile, with McGuire nipping Thomas at the finish line for the title. McGuire was clocked in 15:55.8, and Thomas finished at 15:56.6. Adam Norman of Kalkaska was third at 16:27.7.

The victory was the 35th straight over two years for McGuire. He also finished his three-year cross-country career with a sparkling 49:1 record. The lone loss came at the 1983 state meet when McGuire was second in the individual race.

Concord, the defending Class D champion, finished ninth in the 20-team race with 252 points. Benze Central won the state title with 87 points.

"I thought the boys did super," Concord coach Chuck King said. "They beat 11 very good Class C teams."

Tony Hill led Concord with a sixth-place finish in 16:33. He also earned All-State honors. The Yellow Jacket girls' team finished 13th in the 16-team race with 246 points. Capue won the title with 99 points. No. 1 Bath was second at 121.

Annalisa Bauman led Concord with a 38th-place finish in 21:45. Bellevue freshman Jodi Shay was second in the girls' individual race to White Pigeon freshman Stacy Kilburn. Shay was clocked in 19:18, which was 13 seconds behind Kilburn.

Sivacek 8th in Class A race

FLINT — Rebecca Sivacek of Battle Creek Central missed her bid for a state title, but earned All-State honors Saturday in the Class A state cross-country meet.

Sivacek went out fast in Saturday's race, completing the first mile in 5:12 and staying on the heels of leader Kris Salt of Dearborn Edgewood through the first 10 miles. But the early pace took its toll in the 5,000-meter event and Sivacek wound up finishing eighth in 19:13. Salt won the team race in 18:26.

"She went for it," Central coach Ron Densbom said of Sivacek's bid for the title. "Sometimes you've got to do that. You can't just sit back and be content with third or fourth. She gambled and she lost."

But Sivacek gained some consolation in the fact that even with her less-than-spectacular time, she would have been third in the individual Class A state race and cracked the All-State team as a top 15 finisher. She also beat Brenda Pippel of Holland, the runner who finished

second to Sivacek in last weekend's regional meet.

Central finished 21st as a team in the 26-team field with 486 points. Sterling Heights Stevenson captured the state title with 127 points. Kletka Whitfield led the charge behind Sivacek, finishing 19th in 19:43.

The Bearcats' other finishers were Maria Stewart, 146th in 22:21; Jeanne Blais, 151st in 22:24; Tammy Standback, 162nd in 22:55; and Elizabeth Calderone, 180th in 25:28.

5 area runners place high in B

CHELSEA — Jennie Wytko, Jill Strawser, Rhonda Wendzi, Wayne Oom, Scott Gleason and Stosh Powell all went home with the same honor on Saturday, that of being an All-State cross-country runner.

Wytko of Lakeside, Strawser of Coldwater, Oom of Hastings, Gleason of Coldwater and Powell of Gull Lake all had times among the 25 fastest at the Class B state meet to earn all-state honors.

Wytko placed seventh in 20:00.1 in the girls' individual race. Strawser placed 11th in 19:41.9 in the girls' team race, and Wendzi was 16th in 19:26.6.

Strawser also led Coldwater to a 12th-place team finish in the 24-team girls' division. Wendzi led Gull Lake to a 20th-place finish.

"I thought they did pretty well for the first time," Coldwater coach Jim Bibbrow said.

Hillsdale won the team title with 82 points. Munter and three-time defending champion Jackson Lumen Christi was second at 100. Gull

Lake was 20th with 429 points. Gleason and Powell placed third and fourth, respectively, in the boys' individual race, while Oom was seventh in the team race.

Gleason, who was second in last year's individual race, was clocked in 16:11.4. Powell came in at 16:16.

Scott Ritter of Warren Fitzgerald won the individual race in a jime of 16:04.3.

Oom was clocked in 16:24.1, and led the Saxons to a 16th-place finish. Fremont had 52 points to run away with the boys' state title. Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook was second with 137 points.

Sturgis was 14th with 338 points, and the Trojans were led by Dave Stage's 36th-place finish in 16:54.5.
