

McGuire wins; Concord 9th

CASS CITY — Jesse McGuire closed out his spectacular prep career with a second consecutive Class C individual state cross-country title on Saturday, and Concord's boy's team finished ninth in the meet at

McGuire won a hotly-conteste race with James Thomas of Manc

The victory was the 35th straight over two years for McGuire. He also finished his three-year cross-country career with a sparkling 49-1 record.
