Relays Athletes Shine in "84" Olympics

Long heralded as a springboard to international stardom for outstanding track and field athletes from the United States, the Mansfield Mehock Relays is rapidly gaining a similar reputation for Canadian youngsters.


Former Relays participants were quite prominent as members of the Canadian Olympic team last summer in Los Angeles. Ben Johnson (100-meter dash champion in 1980 and '81 and 200-meter dash champion in '81) captured a bronze medal for his third-place finish in the Olympic 100-meter dash, as well as picking up another bronze for his leadoff leg on the third-place-finishing 4 x 100-meter relay team.

Also pocketing bronze medals as members of the relay quartet were former Relays standouts Anthony Sharpe, present 100-meter dash record holder (10.4, set in 1979), and Sterling Hinds. Helping the unit during preliminary heats was Atlee Mahorn, who anchored the winning 4 x 400-meter relay team from Toronto Central Tech in Mansfield last spring.

Sharpe was an Olympic finalist in the 100-meter dash (eighth), while former Relays placers, Mark McCoy and Jeff Glass, came in fourth and eighth, respectively, in the 110-meter high hurdles. Milton Ottey, a threetime Relays champion, leaped to a sixth-place finish in the high jump.

Will Toronto Central Tech have the necessary depth this spring to defend its 1984 Relays crown? Last year, Central Tech became only the second Canadian school to snare the team title at this prestigious classic that annually draws the top high-school athletes from a six-state area and Ontario, Canada.

Four records were broken and another tied in 1984. This year, there probably will be another onslaught on the records, as the athletes just keep getting better and better. The Mansfield Mehock Relays is — as advertised — the finest early-season high-school track and field meet in the United States. See you at Mehock Field!



RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 7th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College and Akron University. In addition to the duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays committee is priviledged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 53rd renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 19-20, 1985. "America's largest independent interscholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1985 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1984 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1984 renewal drew 150 high schools from five states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky and Canada. Ninety of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1200 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Deadline for Entries - April 12, 1985

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 19th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600 relay teams, 4 x 800 relay teams, medley relay teams, 3000 meter run contestants and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track - We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-FOURTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privelege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

Heat leaders - Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points • Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch · Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for nominal sum starting at 10:30 A.M.

Shot-Discus Events - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries • Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1500-meters, the 400-meters, $4 \times$ 800-relay, $4 \times$ 100-meter relay, 800-meter run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles, $4 \times$ 1600-meter relay and 3000-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 12 Ft. 6 In., and in the high jump at 6-1 Ft. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the event starts. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault and high jump, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitor's trial or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boys' Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 50 feet will be measured. Discus - Only throws of over 150 feet will be measured.

Long Jump - Only jumps over 21 feet will be measured. 300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on Straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.

RUNNERS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED ON THE FIRST FALSE START!

It is a false start if a runner fails to comply with the starters' commands, or if a runner is in motion after the command "set", or if a runner leaves the mark with a hand or foot after the "set" instruction but before the pistol is fired, or if a runner leaves the mark without pistol being fired. THE OF-FENDER OR OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.


