Kearsley, Northern win Relays

Don Marsh is back in the winner's circle at the Mott Relays.

George Dedrick is just plain back. And winning.

All of which should make track life miserable this spring for their respective opponents in the Big Nine and Saginaw Valley conferences.

For Marsh, the veteran Kearsley High boys' coach, Friday's championship in the 17th annual meet at Houston Stadium was his first since 1978.

For Dedrick, back to coaching after a one-year absence, the title was the seventh in the last eight years for Northern High's girls.

Kearsley captured 58 points by scoring in 11 of 13 events to outpoint Northern, which had 44, and defending champion Central, which was third with 40.

Northern's girls scored in nine of 11 events for 64 points, almost doubling the 34 points of runner-up Beecher. Defending champion Benton Harbor was third with 25.

"THIS IS the best balance we've had since my best team won here in 1978," said Marsh, in his 23rd season with the Hornets. "You need balance in this meet.

"Our state champion (Jeff Wilson) is out with a stress fracture but we have good depth in field

events and most of our sprinters are juniors who should improve. It took us a while to get strength in all the events."

Marsh's teams never have finished worse than second in the Big Nine, winning nine times and being second 13. He's been runner-up to Beecher the last six years.

Dedrick said, "It's good to be back. The kids asked me to come back and it feels good to win again." He was idle last year after being pink-slipped and worked on the General Motors-UAW placement and retraining program.

He teaches at Holmes Junior High and must hurry to Northern for coaching. "I step out of the van and start coaching," he said.

KEARSLEY WON the pole vault and high jump with two-man teams and was second in the 3,200-meter relay. Jerrid Heidel and Dan Ringlein combined for a 25-0 total in the vault and Mike Angus and Dan Adas combined for 12-10 in the high jump, missing the record by one inch.

Paul Adas, Joe Tobin, Steve Peek and Greg Turgeon were second in the 3,200, being nosed out in the final 100 meters by Midland.

Northern's girls won the Mott

3,200, shot put, shuttle hurdles and 800 and were second in the long jump, discus and 1,600-meter relays.

Darnella Sudberry, Michelle Strozier, Deidera Broussard and Debrah Jinnah won the Mott 3,200 in 6:49.44. Mekelia Thompson and Polly Johnson joined Broussard and Sudberry in a 1:42.72 triumph in the 800.

Sheila Mayes and Deanna Washington combined for a 72-11 shot put and Pam Fleming, Ever Graham, Aveesha Shabazz and Johnson won the shuttle hurdles in 1:04.63.

"WINNING THE shuttle hurdles was the turning point for us because it got the other girls fired up." said Dedrick, who coached the Vikings to four state championships and two runners-up before his one-year absence.

Despite perfect weather, only two records fell.

Northern's Will Palmer, Steve Kemp, Darnell Miller and Paul La-Sears took the Mott 4x200 relay in 1:29.22, breaking the record of 1:29.4 by Northern in 1983,

Michelle Rimpson of Benton Harbor, the defending Class A state champion, broke her 1984 record of 12.22 seconds with/a time of 12.15 in the open 100-meter dash
