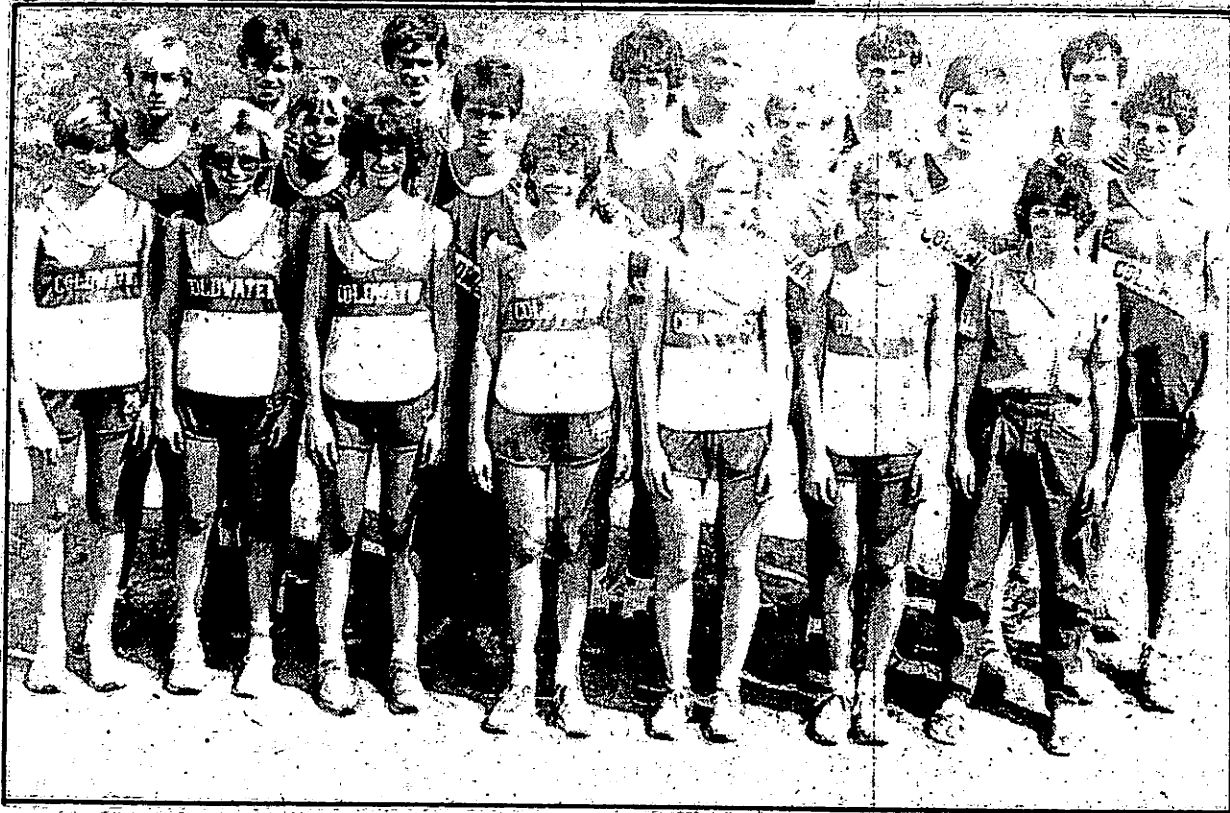

Card boys win 2; girls forfeit

THREE RIVERS — Coldwater High's boys' cross country team got its season started on the right foot here yesterday by beating host Three Rivers 25-32 and Centreville 20-39 in a non-league double-dual meet.

In the heat-stifling weather Tuesday, the Cardinals Scott Gleason and Brian Licht opened up sizable leads after only the first half mile. Gleason ended up winning easily in 17 minutes, 28 seconds.

Three Rivers' Greg Westfall caught Licht, however, to take second at

18:39. Licht was third at 18:39, just ahead of Centreville's Jack Hunter (18:44).

Jeff Ryder and Shane Finney of Coldwater took fifth and sixth, respectively, to ensure the Cards of their sixth consecutive win over the Wildcats. Pat Angle rounded out Coldwater's five scorers by finishing 15th.

The Lady Cards had better individual results than the boys but did not have enough runners to field a

complete team and thereby had to forfeit.

Dawn Valle easily outdistanced the field to lead Coldwater's finishers at 22:28. Teammate Jill Strawser was third while Michelle Laughry and Robin Brodt were less than 30 seconds behind.

A full team of Lady Cards is expected to toe the line Saturday at the annual Centreville Invitational, which is the next action for both Coldwater cross country teams.
