## Rochester nips Clarkston to win Andover Relays

BLOOMFIELD HILLS — Perchnial track power Rockester used its overwhelming depth to capture the Bloomfield Hills Andover Relays Saturday at Andover.

The Falcons, who scored &6 points, won only one event — the long jump relay — but placed second in a whopping six events to dethrone defending champion Clarkston. The Wolves were second with 76 and were followed by Pontiac Northern with 65, Milford with 51 and Andover, which tied Rechester Adams with 36 points.

The 16-team meet features two boys and two girls in each relay event.

Hal Commerson, who heads both the boys and girls teams at Rochester, got a good idea how strong his teams are with the Falcons performance.

"We ran very well. All the kids who competed ran well," he said, "We won with depth because we got a lot of kids in the meet. That's always one of my goals. We never loaded anything up. Nobody ran more than twice."

Clarkston girls coach Gordie R i c h a r d s o n w a s n ' t disappointed. "Our kids ran well," he said.

The Falcons' Nate Childers jumped a county-best 21-634 in helping Rochester to its only first-place finish. Jason Knight.

Michelle Tevlin and Lisa Warholak joined Childers in their 73-112 combined effort.

Meet records were set in the distance medley, show out-discus relay, 0,200-meter relay and 1,600-meter relay.

Andover's distance medley relay team of Ruth Feilingham, Brandon Walson, Laura Matson and Mike Wirthlin set a mark with an 11:51.8 clocking.

Athens' foursome of Keith Kluge, Mary Gregorious, Dave Wolf and Chris Shuman clocked 9:00.25; Joe Castelle, Jenny Dworek, Jerry Stanley and Becky Lemb ran 1:44.25 in the shot put-discus relay and Northern's Jackie Lumpkin, Rico Walker, Beverly Wilson and Craig McFerrin were timed in 3:42.42 in the 1,600-meter relay.

Pontiac Northern won four events — the 400, shuttle-hurdie, sprint medley and 1,600-meter relays.

The Huskies' Rico Walker ran on three winning relays while teammates Craig McFerrin, Melvin Mays and Felecia Brooks ran on two winning teams.

Andover's strength in the distances showed as Fellingham. Wirthlin and Matson each ran on the winning 4 x 1,500, distance medley and 4 x 3,200 meter relays. Matson, the national girls prep record holder in the 1.806-meter run, ran an unofficial 10:47 on her split in the 4 x 3,200 meter relay.
