# **HURDLERS IN SPOTLIGHT**

By Bill Rogers

Hurdlers and distance runners should share the headlines with Toronto (Ont.) Central Tech's powerful team when athletes from five states and Ontario, Canada congregate for the 55th running of the Mansfield Mehock Relays.

Central Tech will be vying for its fourth consecutive team crown, which would duplicate the all-time mark set by Mansfield Senior High (1927-30). Senior posted its streak at the expense of a handful of teams when the meet was in its infancy.

Now, this most prestigious of all earlyseason high school track and field meets annually attracts competitors from 125 or more schools. Winning a state meet is easier than capturing the team championship at the Mansfield Mehock Relays.

Two All-American hurdlers are expected to compete this year. One, Gary (In.) Roosevelt's Elbert Turner was America's fastest prep high hurdler (13.3) in 1986. The other, Keith Wheeler of Troy (Mi.) held a similar honor in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles (51.40).

This year, the Relays will introduce a new event, the 300-meter intermediate hurdles, which will replace the 300-meter low hurdle event that had been run since 1978.

Individual champions will be returning in three events, while a number of state titlists will make their presence felt, especially in the distance and field events. As usual, this 55th Relays will feature a star-studded group of contestants.

#### **RELAYS STANDARDS**

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

Plaques will be awarded the 2nd Place through 10th Place in scoring. 20" Trophy for 1st Place Team.

A beautiful plaque will be given the winner of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fourth place.

RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 9th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty-one years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College and Akron University. In addition to his duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays committee is priviledged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 55th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 17-18, 1987. This independent interscholastic classic will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1987 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1986 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regularions and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1986 renewal drew 145 high schools from five states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky and Canada. Ninety of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1150 athletes.

#### **ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION**

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

#### Deadline for Entries - Friday, April 10, 1987

Lodging - Accomodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 18th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600 relay teams, 4 x 800 relay teams, medley teams, 3000 meter run contestants, triple jump, and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track-We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-EIGHTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES.

However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privelege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

Heat leaders - Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

**Lunch** - Lunch will not be served in the School Cafeteria this year. The Concession stand will be available.

**Shot-Discus Events** - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

#### SPECIAL REGULATIONS — ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

**Preliminaries** - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1500-meters, the 400-meters,  $4 \times 800$  relay,  $4 \times 100$  meter relay, 800-meter run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles,  $4 \times 1600$ -meter relay and 3000-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - The starting height in these events will be determined after all entries are received. Please note that the entry standard for the pole vault is 12 ft. 6 in. and the high jump is 6 ft. 1 in. Pole vaulters must be ready to jump within 2 minutes of their name being called and within 1½ minutes in the high jump or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boys' Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 50 feet will be measured. Discus - Only throws of over 140 feet will be measured. Long Jump - Only jumps over 21 feet will be measured. Triple Jump - All jumps will be measured.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line. New hurdle height is 36 inches.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on Straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.

THE OFFENDER OR OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.


