

■ CLASS C: In Bangor, there were no surprises in the the girls competition, as Country Day rolled to its fourth straight title. Junior Shirley Evans captured the 100-meter and 200-meter dashes, while also participating on the Yellowjackets' winning 800 and 1,600 relay squads. Country Day compiled 85 points, followed by Hart (34), DePorres (31) and Tawas (30).

"It was so hot, the sun took away a lot of my energy," said Evans, who despite becoming a three-time champ in both the 100 and 200, was not happy with her performance. "I wanted to improve my times. I'm glad we won and all, but next year I'm going for some records."

In the boys' meet, the story of the day was Galesburg-Augusta senior Rory Stace. He captured the high jump (6-7), long jump (23 feet) and 100-meter dash (10.81).

"I thought I had a good chance to do well," Stace said about the long jump. "I have no idea how I jumped that far." Stace tollowed up with a strong kick in the 100 meters, coming from behind and upsetting top-ranked Darryl Stallworth of Ecorse in 10.81. Stallworth won the 200 meters (22.25) and 400 meters (49.43).

Lutheran West won the boys title with 51 points, followed by Ecorse (41) and Galesburg-Augusta (36).
