

WHERE'S THE STOPPER?

Is there any team capable of derailing the Toronto (Ont.) Central Tech express this spring? Who has the depth to clip Central Tech's recording-tying winning string at four?


Not until 1973 did a Canadian school — Toronto Michael Power — capture the team title at the Mansfield Mehock Relays. Recently, the Central Tech Blues have been making a habit of carting the championship trophy over the border each year.

Last April, Central Tech made it four straight titles to match Mansfield Senior's record skein set when the now-prestigious meet was barely more than a local affair (1927-30). A fifth consecutive triumph would place the Blues on a pedestal by themselves.

There were six records broken and a seventh set in a new event (intermediate hurdles) during last year's meet, which featured more than 1,500 athletes from 176 high schools, representing six states and Canada.

At least four former individual champions are expected to compete this year, including 1987 gold medalists Bob Kennedy of Westerville North (1500-meter run) and Chris Nelloms of Dayton Dunbar, who won the 200-meter dash as a freshman. Kennedy finished first in the national high-school cross-country championship meet in San Diego last December.

In this Olympic year, it is only fitting that we mention Ben Johnson of Canada, the world-record holder in the 100-meter dash. Johnson, who won his specialty here in 1980 and '81, could become the **eighth** Mansfield Relays individual champion to win an Olympic event this summer in Seoul, South Korea.



RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 10th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty-two years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College and Akron University. In addition to his duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays committee is priviledged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 56th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 15-16, 1988. This independent interscholastic classic will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1988 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1987 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1987 renewal drew 176 high schools from five states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky and Canada. Ninety of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1500 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Deadline for Entires - Friday, April 8, 1988

Lodging - Accomodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 18th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600 relay teams, 4×800 relay teams, medley teams, 3000 meter run contestants, triple jump, and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track • We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-EIGHTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES.

However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privelege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals. Eligibility list must accompany entry forms.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch · The Concession stand will be available for lunch.

Shot-Discus Events - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS — ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries • Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1500-meters, the 400-meters, 4 x 800 relay, 4 x 100 meter relay, 800-meter run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles, 4 x 1600-meter relay and 3000-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange -The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - The starting height in these events will be determined after all entries are received. Please note that the entry standard for the pole vault is 12 ft. 6 in. and the high jump is 6 ft. 1 in. Pole vaulters must be ready to jump within 2 minutes of their name being called and within 1½ minutes in the high jump or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohlo High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boys' Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Shot Put - Only puts of over 50 feet will be measured. Discus - Only throws of over 140 feet will be measured. Long Jump - Only jumps over 21 feet will be measured. Triple Jump - All jumps will be measured.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line. New hurdle height is 36 inches.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on Straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.

RUNNERS WILL BE DISQUALIFIED ON THE FIRST FALSE START!

It is a false start if a runner fails to comply with the starters' commands, or if a runner is in motion after the command "set", or if a runner leaves the mark with a hand or foot after the "set" instruction but before the pistol is fired, or if a runner leaves the mark without pistol being fired. THE OFFENDER OR OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.


