Ann Arbor Pioneer showed why it is the defending Class A state girls track champion by racking up 99 points to win the West Bloomfield Invitational Saturday at West Bloomfield High.

The Pioneers scored 99 points. Pontiac Central and Rochester Adams tied for second with 39 points and was followed by Pontiac Northern (38) and Detroit

Country Day (36).

In the boys meet, Southfield won the team crown with 78 points.

Pioneer's triumph was not as surprising as the two Pontiac

schools' performances.

Ravaged by the pay-for-play program and budget cuts, each team fields only about 14 athletes.

Nevertheless, they made their

presence known.

Pontiac Northern's Lisa Miles won the shot put (34-8) and discus (109-2) and ran a leg on the Huskies' second-place shuttle hurdle relay team along with Felecia Brooks, who was third in the 300-meter hurdles (48.4).


