Southfield and Troy, the season-long leaders in Oakland County boys and girls track respectively, proved it again by winning the 30th annual Oakland County track and field meet Friday at Birmingham Groves High.

Southfield overwhelmed its opposition with 129 points. Pontiac Central took second with 55 and was followed by Pontiac Northern (48), Troy (35½) and Rochester (21).

On the girls' front, Troy, winning its first Oakland County meet title ever, scored 76 points. Pontiac Central was second with 48, Clarkston finished third with 47 points and Rochester Adams had 32.

The Bluejays, the defending Class A state champions, were relentless as they piled up 10 first places.

They won the sprint events, three of the four relays and both hurdle events. Jeff Reynolds won the 100- (10.55) and 200- (21.45) meter dashes and Cassidy Wright took the 110-meter hurdles (14.03) and 400-meter (49.0) dashes to pace the Bluejays.

Anna Jontony won the high jump (5-4) and the 400 (59.24), Kristie Westerby took the 800, and both ran legs on the winning 1600-meter relay team in leading the Colts.

"Things didn't start out the way we wanted, but I'm happy with the outcome," said Troy coach Kevin Spencer, whose Colts (9:31.57) were nipped at the wire by West Bloomfield (9:31.29) in another thrilling 3200-meter relay.

Last week, Troy nipped West Bloomfield in the same event at regionals. Both Pontiac Central's girls and boys squads were depleted because the school's prom night coincided with the meet. Still, the
