THE PRESIDENT'S PODIUM

The first three months in office has proved to be quite hectic and enlightening. On January 22nd, I attended the MHSAA Track and Field committee Meeting in Lansing. This committee is comprised of principals, athletic directors, and track coaches from all classes throughout the state. I presented our membership's survey results from our track clinic. It was because of this survey, the starting heights of the pole vault and the high jump will be changed for all Regional Meets this year. The committee also recommended to the Representative Council that we rotate the order of competition in the various field events, from year to year, for boys and girls, based on odd and even years.

The committee felt very strongly on the issue of the uniform rule. The uniform rule is not an optional rule. It is to be enforced in dual meets as well as league, invitationals, regional and state championships. By coaches not enforcing the rule in dual meets, athletes do not understand the rule and believe it is alright to be out of uniform at other invitationals and championship meets. This puts and additional strain on officials and meet managers as they try to enforce the established rules. We, as coaches, can be a great help by explaining the rule to our athletes and then enforcing the rule at all of our meets.

Another area of concern (as always) is a lack of regional sites. Only six Class "A" sites were volunteered as we made regional assignments. Ten sites were needed. Other classes had the same problem. MITCA's Track Committee, chaired by Bob Bridges of Dearborn High has been asked to look into ways to get more schools with quality tracks to volunteen to host track regionals. If you have any ideas on how to solve the problem, put it in writing and send it to either Bob or my-self.

Plans, for the 1991 Track Clinic are moving along. The dates are January 10th, 11th, and 12th, 1991, at the Novi Hilton (Haggerty & Eightmile—just west of I-275). Bill Falk will talk on the pole vault and Tony Naclario, a fine high school and college coach coach, from New Jersey will discus the shot put and discus. Brent McFarlane will be asked to return to speak on sprints/hurdles. Oth speakers and topics are still being lined up for our annual event.

Kim Spalsbury is putting the finishing touches on this year's Cross County Clinic, on November 9th and 10th, 1990, to be held at the Holiday Inn in Lansing (formerly the site of the Lansing Hilton). More details on this clinic in future newsletters.

I hope the season is going well and the weather is cooperating better for you than it is for our team. As always, if there are any suggestions, comments, complaints (?) put it in writing and send it to me or any other executive board member. Believe me, we do listen and discuss any correspondence that comes our way. Best wishes.

The excitement of relay races has always motivated athletes to move the baton around the track. What motivates coaches to teach relay technique should be the knowledge that HIS baton always has a chance of beating an opponent's baton regardless of who has the faster personnel.

YOU HAVE TO HAVE AN ATTITUDE

DRILLS AND PRACTICE EVERYDAY Make your athletes "feel the baton," "TARGET PRACTICE."

Everything is mathematical. All measuring done in "shoes."

TREAT THE BATON WITH RESPECT No juggling, playing catch, sword-fighting, etc. Use the baton for drills and racing only!

WE DON'T RUN CAUTIOUSLY

If there is an error, COACH takes the responsibility.

DEFINING OUR TERMS

Exchange Zone -

Where the baton is passed to the next runner.

Acceleration Zone -

Where we get up a good head of steam before entering the exchange zone.

Hash -

Where we stand waiting PATIENTLY for the incoming runner.

Checkmark -

It consists of lines measured 2 "shoes" apart and drawn across the lane we are in. It can be placed on the track's surface with chalk or training tape. When the incoming runner touches it, we SPRINT,

"SHDES" -

The unit used to measure from the hash to the checkmark.

Hesh point -

When two runners are in the middle of the exchange zone, about 1 meter apart, running at top speed. It occurs just before the hand-off.

Blind Exchange -

We stand on the side of the hash toward the exchange zone, looking around our LEFT shoulder. When the incoming runner touches the checkmark, we SPRINT LOCKING STRAIGHT AMEAD. At the "mesh point," the incoming runner gives a verbal command. At this command, we drop the proper hand (left or right) and reach back giving a cala, perfect "target" for the incoming runner. The incoming runner moves the baton down into the target. The baton remains in the hand it is received in.


THE 4 x 100m RELAY

Hash: Use the entire 10 meter acceleration zone. Checkmark: 18 "shoes" from hash, mark a line across the lane; go 2 more "shoes" and mark another.

Lead leg: Use starting blocks; carry baton in RIGHT hand. Hum inside lane line.

2nd leg: Hash right side of lame; take baton in left hand. 3rd leg: Hash left side of lane; take baton in right hand. Anchor: Hash right side of lane; take baton in left hand.

The checkmark values given here are the numbers that we start with. We want our runners to "mesh" perfectly (in the middle of the exchange zone; about I meter apart; running at top speed). Finding this perfect "mesh" is a trial and error process. It is the coach's responsibility to adjust the checkmark values to find this perfect "mesh." If the incoming runner easily runs up on the outgoing runner, we add 2 "shoes" to the checkmark value. If he can't reach the outgoing runner, we subtract 2 "shoes" from the checkmark value. We make our adjustments in increments of 2 and are flexible enough to realize that each exchange may have a unique checkaark value.



EXAMPLE: Baton pass from 2nd man to 3rd man.



DRILL -- "Standing Blind"

Four athletes line up about 1 meter apart and are "staggered" (back man's right shoulder lines up with next man's left shoulder; whose left shoulder is lined up with the right shoulder of the man in front of him; and so on).

The man at the back of the line passes the baton with his RIGHT hand into the LEFT hand of the next man; who passes it into the RIGHT hand of the next man; who passes it into the LEFT hand of the man in front.

EMPHASIS

- "Staggered" position of the athletes so that the baton takes a straight-line path.
- Good posture, no silly contortions, eyes straight ahead.
- REACH back on command; be ready to GIVE on command. Simultaneous, crisp action.
- 4. Bive perfect "TARGET."
 Hit the target ... aim for the elbow.
- 5. Bring the baton DOWN into the "target."
- Adjust "mesh point" so that it is perfect. Athlete is responsible for "mesh" in FRONT of his.
- 7. Pass the baton with LOVE.

DRILL -- "Target Practice"

Four athletes perform the "standing blind" drill while jogging 800 meters on the track. The baton is continuously passed from the back to the front with emphasis the same as the "standing blind" drill.

DRILL - "Using Marks"

Binulate a $4\times100n$ relay at different speeds; jogging, striding, and accelerating into the outgoing runner.

EMPHASIS

 Athlete locates his "hash" and measures his "checkmarks." (18 shoes + 2 shoes for openers)

- Athletes take a number of "run-outs" to test for condition of track surface.
- Stand ready for the incoming runner; look around left shoulder; eyes focused on the checkmark (not the incoming runner); proper lame position; good starting posture.
- Proper take-off; eyes straight ahead; reach only on command; give a good target; give command when "mesh point" is reached — not too soon, not too late.
- Proper lane position 2nd & anchor legs stand ready on the right side of the lane; while 3rd leg stands ready on the left side of the lane. Lead leg burs left side of the lane.

THINGS I HAVE DISCOVERED OVER THE YEARS

Everything has to be done "your way" so that adjustments of checkmarks can be properly made.

The measurement of 18 shoes + 2 shoes (18 + 2) is very conservative.

One can make on-the-spot adjustments for strong minds by altering checkmark values.

One can make emergency substitutions and maintain the athletes' confidence to execute exchanges.

Bet out with a strong lead leg.

Move your "lefties" to the 2nd-leg or anchor-leg positions.

You can botch this method and still win. You can have perfect execution and still lose.

One can adjust this method to fit the 4 \times 200m relay. Use half the acceleration zone (5 m) and less "shoes" (14 + 2) for checkmarks.

This method can be adapted to the shuttle hurdle relay. Use (5 + 2) from the 4-foot restraining line.

TRACK MEET HINTS

PLACE THE BLOCKS PRIOR TO THE RACE ON THE OUTSIDE OF THE TRACK, DIRECTLY OPPOSITE THE STARTING FOR EACH LANE. WHEN THE RUNNERS ARE CLERKED INFORM THEM OF THIS SITUATION. WHAT USUALLY HAPPENS A RUNNER IN LANES 5, 6, 7 OR 8, GRABS THE FIRST STARTING BLOCK THEY SEE, THEN THE RUNNERS IN LANES SUCH AS 1, 2. 3 OR 4 NEED TO TO GO UP THE TRACK TO PICK UP A BLOCK FOR THEIR USE.

WHEN THE GUN GOES OFF AND THE RUNNERS LEAVE THEIR BLOCKS THEY SHPULD BE MOVED TO THE OUTSIDE OF THE TRACK, NOT THE INFIELD.

THE NEXT HEAT CAN BE BROUGHT UP AND THEY CAN BE ADJUSTING THEIR BLOCKS WHILE THE RACE AHEAD OF THEM IS BEING RUN. THE RUNNERS IN THE NEXTHEAT CAN CARRY THEIR BLOCKS OUT TO THEIR STARTING LINE.

THIS ALSO ELIMINATES A BLOCK HOLD-ER FROM RUNNING TO THE INFIELD AND INTERFEREING WITH A RUNNER IN AN INSIDE LANE. THIS HAPPEN-ED IN A STATE MEET. A STARTING BLOCK HOLDER HAS THROWN THE BLOCK TO THE INFIELD, NEARLY HITTING A RUNNER IN AN INSIDE LANE. THESE ARE THINGS THAT HAVE HAPPENED.

WATERFALL STAKIS—USE A PIECE OF CHALK OR STRIPS OF ONE/HALF INCH TAPE TO MARK A LINE SIX FEET FROM THE WATERFALL LINE AND PARAILEL TO THE WATERFALL LINE. THIS RAS BEEN USED USED AT SEVERAL DUAL AND TRIPLE DUAL MEETS, THE "CHIP" RELAYS AT CENTRAL MICHIGAN UNI. AND TWO INVITATIONS AT PORT HURON NORTHERN: IT SAVES TIME IN LINING UP THE ATHLETES, AND IT ENABABLES THE RUBBERS TO KNOW WHERE TO STAND:

OHY DO SOME CLERKS OF THE COURSE SEND ALL FOUR RUNNERS IN A 4 x 100 OR 4 x 200 UP TO THE STARTING LINE. THE STARTER DOESN'T WANT TO SEE THEM. ITS A WASTE OF TIME.





THIS WORK IS TO BE DONE ON YOUR COURSE, BEGINNING AT THE STARTING LINE. THE RUNNERS WILL BE ASKED TO TAKE OFF AS IF THEY WERE COMPETING IN A 5-K RACE. AFTER RUNNING FOR TWO MINUTES A GUN WILL BE FIRED. THEY SHOULD TAKE NOTE OF THE POSITION ON THE COURSE AS THEY CONTINUE RUNNING. A GUN WIL BE FIRED AFTER FOUR MINUTES OF RUNNING AND AGAIN THEY SHOULD NOTE THEIR LOCATION ON THE COURSE. THEY WILL CONTINUE FOR ANOTHER MINUTE AND STOP RUNNING WHEN THE FIVE MINUTE GUN IS FIRED, MAKING A MENTAL NOTE OF THEIR POSITION ON THE COURSE THEY WILL HAVE AN INTERVAL OF EIGHT MINUTES. SWEAT CLOTHES SHOULD BE PUT ON AND AND CONTINUOUS MOTION OF WALKING OR JOGGING AND STRETCHING FOR THE FULL EIGHT MINUTES.

THE FIVE MINUTE RUN WILL BE REPEATED IN THE SAME MANNER, OBSERVING THEIR POSITION AT THE SOUND OF EACH FIRING OF THE GUN. AFTER THE SECOND RUN THEY SHOULD ANALYSE THE REACTION OF THEIR BODY DURING THE TWO RUNS. ANOTHER EIGHT MINUTE INTERVAL, WHICH WILL BE FOLLOWED BY THE THIRD RUN.

YOU MIGHT USE A WHISTLE INSTEAD OF A GUN.

HIS IS NOT A TOUGH WORKOUT AND MY GUESS WOULD BE THAT MANY COACHES WOULD THINK THE EIGHT MINUTE INTERVAL IS TOO LONG. THE RUNNERS NEED TO RECUPERATE AND BE FAIRLY FRESH FOR EACH RUN IN ORDER TO GET A GOOD COMPARISON OF THEIR POSITIONS AT EACH OF TWO-MINUTE, FOUR-MINUTE AND FIVE MINUTE MARKS. THE RUNNERS SHOULD NOT BE EMULATING "CARL LEWIS" FOR THE FIRST 200 YARDS OF THE RUN.

FINISH THE DAYS WORK-OUT WITH 5 TO 8 STRIDE-OUTS OF 60 TO 80 YARDS.

PETE SPIELES, CROSS COUNTRY COACH, CHARLEVOIX HIGH SCHOOL
CLASS C STATE CHAMPIONS, '82, '83, '87, '88, '89, '90

On Friday, November 9th, Pete Spieles was caught off gaurd. The Kermit Ambrose Award was presented to Spieles, who has coached the Charlevoix Cross Country Teams for the past 15 years. Spieles "didn't have a clue" that he was to receive the award writh Matt Peterson, who has run for Charlevoix and for CMI, walked to the podium to make the presentation.

Peterson described the three most necessary qualities of good cross country coaches, including Spieles and many others at the MITCA banquet. First is a knowledge of the sport and the physiology of training. Second is an ability to inspire and motivate others to do well. And third is the fun—to enjoy the sport and the people who participate—and to share that enjoument with others.

Spieles began cross country coaching at the prodding of Walt Drenth and his brother Jeff, who were students at Charlevoix High School at the time. The previous coach had moved on to another assignment, leaving the cross country team in need. Spieles had coached baseball, football and basketball, but had no running experience and needed convincing. But Jeff, who later ran for the USA Team, and Walt, who coached at CMI is now at William and Many, were persistant. And now Spieles says that the decision to accept the assignment "changed my life." His success is based on study of the sport at MTCA Clinics, reading, and analyzing training and race results. And a convert's love of the sport.

Coach Spieles manages a one-mile fun run, a 5-K and a 10-K run during the "Venetian Festival" held in July at Charlevoix. Today this run is known as the "Jeff Drenth Memorial Run" in memory of one of Charlevoix's finest runners. He also manages and directs a high school invitational cross country run during the first part of October. He has been instrumental in the operation of the regional track and field meets on the Charlevoix track.

RE: Regional Format Used For Cross Country

The qualification of teams from the regionals to the state meets has been a continuing problem. It does not allow the best teams to qualify. Some regionals eliminate teams which are easily in the top 15 year after year. The regional hosted by Holly (Class A) the past two years is a good example. Last year the qualifying teams placed 2nd, 3nd and 10th (this team was a favorite to win the state title and had won the regional). This year they placed 2nd, 3nd, and 5th. In 1987 the top 6 girls teams in Oakland County were some of the best in the state as judged by their performances at invitationals and were all in the same regional at Royal Oak Kimball High School.

This is not a memo to complain, but one to suggest an effective way to make the regionals fairer. What follows is a plan and a time table to resolve the regional problem.

September 1 - A listing of the selected regional sites is mailed to each school. Schools have until September 21 to choose their regional. This will be done by completing an enclosed form, signed by the Athletic Director and Principal. Information on which schools have entered different regionals will be available by telephoning an answering machine with a recorded and updated message.

September 21 - Teams which have not choosen a regional would be assigned to the nearest available regional, using current guidelines. Regionals would remain the same size.

October 1 - Regional Managers get a listing of the teams in their regionals.

October 7 - Regional Managers mail information to participating schools.

The dates for the regional meets and the state final wouldremain the same. Qualification would remain the same.

Advantages

- 1. The best teams will avoid each other and spread themselves out. Top coaches talk and scout each other. These teams don't want head to head competition before the state meet. Coaches would rather win the regional than finish second.
- 2. Teams with little chance of qualifying or those which do not wish to travel can select the closest regionals using their our judgement. Teams often complain about where they get assigned. Let them pick
- 3. Good teams which should qualify can select regionals where they feel they have the best chance. No more complaints about inequities. If you choose the easiest regional and can't qualify you just aren't good enough.
- 4. The responsibility for qualifying is placed squarely on the shoulders of the high school athletic departments, not the M.H.S.A.A.
- 5. This is a way of letting coaches seed their own teams. This approach will work even if only some of the coaches cooperate. Those most likely to participate are the better teams with more at risk. These are the very teams that need to be seeded.
- 6. This plan does not shorten the season or interfere with existing invitationals. It is a fine tuning of our current system.
- 7. To schools who do not get involved in this plan, the system remains the same. They receive a letter assigning them to a regional. They still benefit by getting into a regional which is not "loaded".
- 8. Regionals would be reshuffled every year instead of the same teams.

Disadvantages

- 1. A coach of both the girl's and boy's teams might have to choose one regional for both. In some years this could be a tough decision, but it would be an improvement over the current system for at least one of the teams.
- 2. Some teams might choose to travel farther for their regional in an effort to qualify, but again they have a choice.
- 3. A decision would have to be made on whether schools could split their girls' and boys' teams to different sites. Conflicts could be resolved by athletic directors. This is not new. We have schools now which have either a boys' or girls' team, but not both.

Additional Comments

What do you have to lose by trying this on a trial basis for two years? I spoke with many coaches at the MTTCA convention and believe this will have more support than the sectional meets that were proposed.

This fall - 1990, saw A-B-C Combo put together some additinal teams so that our young people could extend their seasons if so wishing. The results this past fall have been beyonf Coaches Evenson and Godefroidt's wildest dreams. On Sun. Nov. 11 the state competitions were held, once again at Buhr Park in Ann Arbor. The 15 and 16 year old girls beat out a tough Monroe all star squad to win their SATE MEET. Megan Smedley (Bucharan) was first, Lorenda Godefroidt (St. Louis) third, Heather Grigg (Onsted) sixth, Sheri Thelen (Fawler) tenth, and Mindi Ford (Hudson) twentieth. At the regional meet the A-B-C Combo scored 26 points to Morroe's 38 and Ohio Worthington Christian 56. Following is the overall place, team place, and time on the 5,000 meter course at Greenbier YMCA Camp, Huntington, West Virginia.
