DREAM RACE

Looking for a "Dream Race" involving two of the flashiest high-school sprinters in the United States? Then plan to attend the 58th edition of the Mansfield Mehock Relays, April 20-21.

Always recognized as one of the finest interscholastic track and field meets, the Mansfield Mehock Relays — as usual — will feature an abundance of top-notch talent, with Dayton Dunbar's superb sprinter, Chris Nelloms, leading the entries.

Nelloms, shooting for his fourth consecutive Relays gold medal in the 200-meters dash, will be dueling Euclid's All-American football standout, Robert Smith, in "dream" 200- and 400-meters dashes. Nelloms, an All-American in three track events last year, is considered the nation's premier sprinter/hurdler.

Smith posted the fourth-best national time (46.41) in 1989, while chasing Nelloms to the Ohio Class AAA 400-meter crown. Nelloms, who holds the Ohio record of 45.80, was No. 2 in the nation last year with a 46.19 clocking. His 13.71 in the 110-meters high hurdles ranked No. 2, also.

For the first time, athletes from New York state have been sanctioned to compete in the Mansfield Mehock Relays. Two new events, the 1600- and 3200-meters runs, will replace the 1500- and 3000-meters events.

Spirited competition is expected in the long jump, shot put and discus events. Three state champions could liven the action in the long jump. A record is a distinct possibility in the pole vault, where defending champion Adam Smith of Owensboro (Ky.) Davis Co. has cleared 16'-6½". Individual champions will be returning in eight events.

RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

TROPHIES AND MEDALS

All Trophies and Medals are the compliments of Mansfield people interested in the success of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays. Your thanks should be addressed to the donor listed in the program.

A rotating Mansfield-Mehock Relays Trophy will be awarded the team compiling the most points. This is a 36-inch trophy.

A beautiful plaque will be awarded the team making the most points in the field events.

A beautiful plaque will be presented to the team making the most points in the track events.

This does not include relays.

Plaques will be awarded the 2nd Place through 10th Place in scoring. 20" Trophy for 1st Place Team.

A beautiful plaque will be given the winner of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fourth place.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fifth place.

Sixth Place will receive no awards other than one team point.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS For Coaches and Athletes

There is an area at the end of the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field. General Admission section is open to the coaches and athletes.

Scores for events will be announced over the Public Address System.



RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 12th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty-four years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marletta College and Akron University. In addition to his duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 58th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 20-21, 1990. This independent interscholastic classic will be staged at Malabar Middle School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1990 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1989 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1989 renewal drew 174 high schools from five states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky and Canada. Eighty-two of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1350 athletes. The addition of New York state to the field should bring further excitement.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way. This mileage limitation depends on individual state sanction.

Deadline for Entries - Friday, April 13, 1990

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 20th and breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600-meters relay teams, 4 x 800-meters relay teams, medley teams, 3200-meters run contestants, triple jump, and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track - We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-EIGHTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES.

However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privilege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals. Eligibility list must accompany entry forms.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch - The Concession stand will be available for lunch.

Shot-Discus Events - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS — ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1600-meters, the 400-meters, 4 x 800-meters relay, 4 x 100-meters relay, 800-meters run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles, 4 x 1600-meters relay and 3200-meters run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - The starting height in these events will be determined after all entries are received. Please note that the entry standard for the pole vault is 12 ft. 6 in. and the high jump is 6 ft. 1 in. Pole vaulters must be ready to jump within 2 minutes of their name being called and within 1½ minutes in the high jump or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boys' Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Uniform Rule - The track and field uniform consists of a school issued jersey and shorts, which are not objectionable, and shoes, which may be supplied by the contestant. Any other visible apparel must be of a single color and worn under the uniform jersey and shorts. In relay races each team member shall wear the same color and design of school uniform (jersey and trunks). When other apparel is worn under the school uniform, it shall be of the same color for all teammates choosing to wear them.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line. New hurdle height is 36 inches.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on Straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.
