Pinckney, Chelsea run away with titles

MILAN — The Pinckney boys' track team was so excited after capturing its second consecutive Southeastern Conference title Wednesday that the Pirates soaked Coach Dave Mitchell with a bucket of water — twice.

Following its victory lap and singing of the school's fight song, Pinckney then joined the Chelsea girls' in the parking lot to chant, "SEC, SEC, SEC . . .

Both Pinckney (100 points) and Chelsea (117) claimed the overall championships after going 6-0 in dual meet action.

Pinckney, which hadn't scored above 79 points all year, won the 3,200-meter relay and collected first-places from Nick Karfonta in the 800 (1:58.18) and Nick Dimitroff in the pole yault (13-0).

"The thing that got us the league win was our consistency," Mitchell said. "We didn't do anything different today. Distance events and hurdles were our strength and our field events came through."

Milan senior Blake Novak, who set records in both hurdle events last year, aggravated a pulled hamstring and only ran in the 100,

where he finished third.

In the girls' meet, Chelsea was led by sophomore Lisa Monti, who won the 1,600 and 3,200 while also running with the winning 3,200 relay. The Bulldogs also collected firsts from Leisa Schiller in the long jump (15-4), Charity Allen in the 300 hurdles (:48.40), and the 800 and 1,600 relays.

Two conference meet records were also broken as Milan junior Linda Stuck soared 5-9 in the high jump and the Dexter boys 1,600 relay team of Matt Bowsher, Tim Dittmar, Jeff Wood and Andrew Pudduck ran 3:25.39. Milan's

Thomas Smith ran the 400 in :49.24 to tie the existing mark.

"I felt confident today," Stuck said. "When I don't feel confident, I usually psych myself out."

Stuck also appreciated the 85-degree temperatures over Saturday's

chilling weather at the regionals. "When it's cold, you kind of want to stay in your clothes and huddle up in a blanket. You really don't

want to run." The weather might have had an effect on Chelsea junior Jon Royce, who won both the long (20-3) and high (6-5) jumps, despite competing

with a stomach illness. "I don't know if it's from the heat or I'm sick or just nervous," he said. "When you concentrate, it doesn't feel that bad."

Pioneer girls, boys sweep SCC

YPSILANTI — The Pioneer boys' track team, fueled by a crew of dominating distance runners, caught and passed meet-leading Huron to capture the South Central Conference track and field championships Wednesday.

The Pioneer victory ended an 11year Huron reign.

And, as expected, the Pioneer girls dominated their meet, setting three meet records — Heather Brown in the 400-meter dash, the 400 relay and the 800 relay — en route to an 82-point victory over second-place Huron.

Down 84-81 to Huron going into the boys' 800-meter run, Pioneer's Rob Cain, Heath Connett and Stephen Roth captured the first three spots, respectively,to put the Pioneers in first for good. Earlier in the meet, Cain, Roth, and Mike Milliman captured the first three spots, respectively, in the 1,600.

Other top area performers included Kercheval Patterson of Ypsilanti (first in the 100 and 200), Jules Garcia of Huron (ran on the winning 400, 800 and 1,600 relays) and Dion Woolfolk of Pioneer (first in the 110 high hurdles)

The Pioneer girls won 11 of the 16 events and finished second in three events they didn't win. They were led by sprinter Vania Nelson, who captured the 100 and 200 dashes and ran the anchor leg on the 400 and 800 meet-record relay teams. Bridget Mann won the 800 and 1,600 runs. Single event winners were Tara Kennedy (long jump) and Tanya Favers (3,200).

Huron's winners were Erica Davis in the long jump and Paula Johnson in the 300 hurdles. Ypsilanti's Renee Gardner won the high jump and the 100 hurdles.
