FRANKENMUTH - It was only 100 yards into the race and Carrie Gould found herself literally fenced inside a pack of 121 runners.

Three miles later, the 4-foot-6 freshman from Bendle stood tall as the Class C girls' state champion. Gould's time of 19:23.5 was a course record at Frankenmuth's Memorial Park and astonished the crowd of about 1,000 from around the state.

"I WAS way behind, but I had to keep telling myself I could do it." said Gould, who finished her inaugural varsity season unbeaten. "I just believed in myself. It feels good."

Gould, like many other runners Saturday, was forced inside on the first turn. The course curved closely around a fence that separates a softball field and took the competitors through several pits and holes.

The poor early vantage point pushed Gould deep into the pack.

"Everybody boxed me in and I

started crying," said Gould, no doubt the smallest runner among the 382 athletes in the four races, "I was scared. Once I got boxed in, I didn't think I could win. I was terrified I couldn't do it."

Gould inched her way into the top 10 after a half-mile and moved into the third spot near the one-mile mark, but still about 15 seconds behind front-running Traci Knudsen of Suttons Bay. Gould passed secondplace April Barfoot of Whitehall at the 21/4-mile mark and then switched places a couple times with Knudsen before pulling away with a half-mile

SHE WON by 51/2 seconds over Barfoot, who passed Knudsen near the end. Knudsen was third, 10.9 seconds behind Gould.

"Carrie's just a fantastic runner with a lot of heart," Bendle Coach Rose Wilkins said. "We knew the other two girls would challenge her, but Carrie knows what she can run. She reserves herself at the front of races and paces herself."

The old course record was 19:25. set by Laura Bell of LakeVille in 1990.

Carrie's sister, Amanda, earned All-State honors for the second straight year by finishing 12th in 20:38.4. Amanda was boxed in the same as Carrie, but fought her way into the led at the 34-mile mark before dropping back.

"Amanda almost cuts a trail and sets a pace for Carrie and the rest of the team," said Wilkins, whose squad finished in a tie for 10th, "We knew she (Carrie) would get cut off, so the rest of the team looked out for her."

AMANDA FOUTCH of Atherton won her third straight All-State medal by ending 15th in 20:45.2, just three-tenths of a second ahead of the next runner. The first 15 finishers in each race are named All-Staters.

The Wolverines' girls' and boys' team didn't fare as well, however. The girls were ranked No. 1 coming into the finals, but finished tied for sixth. The boys, ranked eighth in the polls, came in 16th.

"Like I said all season long, the rankings don't mean anything," Atherton Coach Dan Sandborn said. "We had to put it all together in the state finals and we didn't. There are so many factors. I can't get inside the kids' heads, but it may have been the pressure. I thought we got out to a good start, but then we ran a little bit timid.

"But we had an excellent season. One meet doesn't make or break a season."

Chris Kaighen of Goodrich was the highest area boys' finisher, coming in 22nd in 17:33 in the individual race. Leena Kapale of Lake Fenton missed All-State honors by 3.6 seconds when she finished 16th in the girls' individual race.

Weather conditions for the race had temperatures in the low 30s with very little wind. The course itself drew harsh criticism from people all over the state. The first mile wound back-andforth through spectators before setting out into the park.

Runners encountered mud. ditches, holes, fences, bridges, hills, ridges, trees and even had to cut past a metal soccer goal. It made for a rugged cross-county course in which many runners fell throughout the race, including a four-person pileup in the boys' team race at the first turn near the fence.

There were also no clocks on the course - not even at the finish line.

"I don't think it's a good state meet course," Sandborn said. "There are too many quick turns. A lot of kids fell, but there's no

excuses. Everybody runs the same course under the same conditions."
