

# Bruised and sick Pirates stumble to 10th

Injuries and illnesses took their toll on the Pinckney High boys' track team Friday, as the squad wound up in 10th place at the Huron River Relays.

The Pirates, competing in the under-1,000-students division in the meet at Eastern Michigan University, were plagued with a virus and some nagging injuries throughout last week. Their top pole vaulter, Nick Dimitroff, was put of commission after bruising himself in a recreational

vehicle accident, and Steve Liebert, Pinckney's top long-jumper and sprinter, was suffering from an upper-respiratory problem, as were several others on the team.

"Considering the shape we were in, placing 10th wasn't actually too bad," said Pinckney Coach Dave Mitchell. "I think we could have done better had things been better and everyone was healthy."

Steve Smith offered the Pirates' best showing of the day when he took third place in the 55-meter high hur-

dles, clocking a 7.91. Smith, Liebert, John Kelly and Doug McIntosh also combined to place fourth in the shuttle hurdle relays in 32.6.

In the field events, Rocky Minghini and Mike Hietbrink both came through with 10th places. Minghini launched the shot put 47-5 and Hietbrink vaulted 12-6.

Pinckney also placed ninth in the 3,200 relay. Jayson Shore, Ryan Swan, David Carpenter and Jeff Massoll joined to run 8:39.7. In one other event, freshman Casey Lince made

an impressive showing in the 3,200, checking in at 10:40.1.

Pinckney's Southeastern Conference rival Lincoln placed third at the meet. Mitchell said the Railsplitters looked strong in several events.

"We'll just have to get healthy now," Mitchell said. "I still feel confident about the upcoming season."

Weather permitting, the Pirates were scheduled to host Fowlerville today in their outdoor season-opener. Saturday, Pinckney will go back indoors to the Spartan Invitational at Michigan State University.

# Sexton boys place second

Tradition can be a powerful thing.

The Sexton Big Reds didn't win Saturday's Class A Spartan Relays at Jenison Field House, but they did finish second in their first meet with coaches Brian Murley and Anthony Norris.

"Sexton has always had a good track program," Norris said. "As a coach you do think about that, and it makes you want to do a really good job."

Murley and Norris took over the boys' track program following Sexton coach Paul Pozega's retirement last June after 26 seasons with the Big Reds.

One of the benefits of following Pozega, Norris said, is that he left a strong base of talent. Although Sexton was missing a significant chunk of its team Saturday because of spring break, the Big Reds got wins from state champ Matt Beard in the shotput and Octavius Long in the 55-meter dash.

The sprint medley team of Saddi Washington, Darius Cunningham, Octavius Long and Jason Husband placed third, and an experimental mile relay team of Husband, Chris Moore, Sterling Armstrong and Washington pulled off a sixth-place finish.

Like Sexton, most area teams were missing a good number of athletes who had headed for warmer places over spring break.

East Lansing boys coach John Plough said he told his athletes that Cancun was more important than Spartan Relays.

"The kids were a little confused, but they went," he said with a laugh.

The Trojans sent only one girl, Eileen Fleck, and a handful of boys to the relays. Alone, Fleck pulled off a tie for 10th place, the highest local finish in the girls' competition. She won the mile and placed fourth in the two-mile to score all 14 of her team's points.

The Trojan boys finished 21st, with six points from sprinter Randy Kinder's third-place finish in the 55-

meter dash.

The Grand Ledge boys were the second-highest area finishers, edging into a four-way tie for ninth.

Pole Vaulter Micha Gaudio had a personal-best vault of 14 feet-seven inches for the win, and the shuttle hurdle relay team of Gaudio, Darren Brendahl, Jeff MacNoughton and Doug Larner placed second.

"This is just kind of a warm-up for the season," said coach Jim Brandt, "But it's nice to start the season with a first and a second."

The meet's highlight for 14th-place Lansing Eastern was when Mark Anderson propelled himself 21 feet, 9 1/2 inches through the air to win the long jump.

The lowlight came when sprinter VaShawn Williams pulled a muscle in the 55 hurdles and coach Keith Pochert was forced to make substitutions in two relays.

The distance medley team didn't place, but the 800 relay team of Mario Porco, Kenny Farrow, Anderson and David Miller rose to the occasion and took fourth.

Waverly picked up 16th place in the girls' competition, scoring eight points on Rachael Mays' second-place shotput performance.

Waverly coach Robert Lurie said his team was shorthanded Saturday because of the break, but added that he's more concerned with good efforts than high placing.

"It's a real competitive meet and we come for the experience," Lurie said. "My whole distance team is in Florida."

Holt was right behind in 17th, although assistant coach Jim Campbell predicted that hurdler Cloe Parker would be the Rams' only scorer.

True to her coach's words, Parker placed third in the hurdles, scoring all six of Holt's points.

# Pirates sail to second at Milan meet

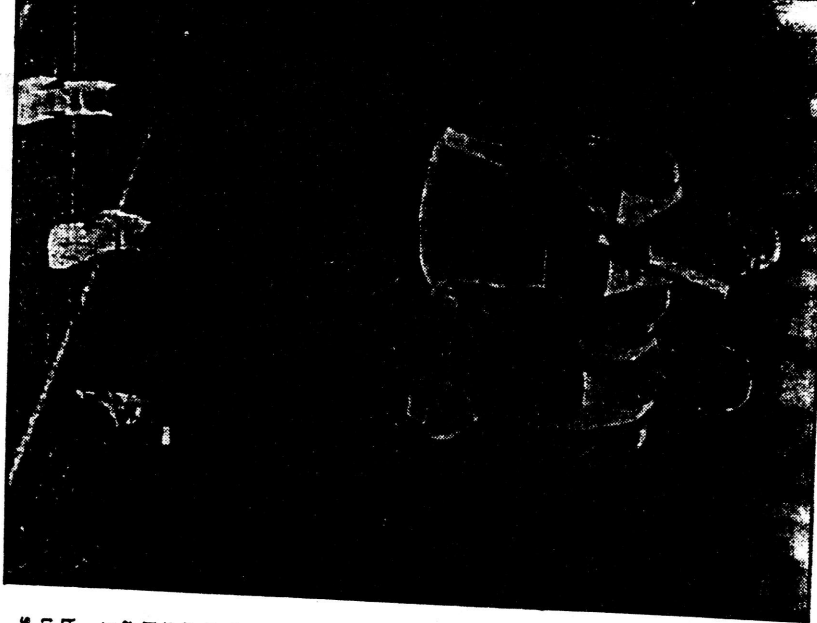

The Puddle Jumper Relays lived up to their billing Saturday as 12 high school track teams—including Pinckney and Howell—alighted their way through the competition.

In boys' action, the Pirates wound up with 96 points and second place, while Howell tied Milan for third place with 75 points. Farmington Harrison scored 110 for the win.

Pinckney notched a trio of wins during the at-times cold and wet day. In the shot-put relay, Rocky Mungblin, Pete Lahn and Aaron Simpson combined for the victory with a 117.9 effort. Mungblin had a team-best launch of 47.11.

The Pirates' strong pole-vault contingent of Nick Dimitroff, Mike Heitbrink and Tony Wallace then united to take a five-foot margin of victory with a total height of 35.0. Dimitroff topped the team with a 13.0 vault.

Also scoring first was Pinckney's shuttle-hurdle relay crew of Doug McIntosh, John Kelly, Steve Smith and Brian Raus, who checked in at 1:02.4.

Several of Pinckney's athletes had been out sick or injured but returned to give Coach Dave Mitchell some strong showings.

Other than their wins, the Pirates also picked up second place showings in the 6,400 meter relay (19:37), 800 relay (1:34.3), puddle jumper medley relay (4:00 relay (45.9) and co-ed relay.

The Highlander boys earned a pair of relay victories. Keith Flamin, Tim Wilson and Aaron Kay tied Milan for

first in the long jump event and Scott Light, Brendan O'Neill, Scott Wolfe and Jon Clark checked in at 8:16.5 to prevail in the 3,200 relay.

The Highlanders' shot-put and discus relays also came in second. Tom Starowski, Jared Kopydlowski and Marc Englund filed out both those teams.

Just as Harrison won the boys' crown, so too did its girls' team, which scored 102 points. Milan followed with 88 points and Pinckney netted 78 points for third. Howell racked up 31 points for sixth place.

The Pirates, led by Ann Marie Selter, picked up three victories. Jenny Haskin, Leslie Raymor, Jill Heider and Selter opened the winning with a 25.12 performance in the 6,400 relay. The Pinckney crew of Nicole Cushing, Keara Muzzin and Lori Boyer then combined to throw the shot 86.1% and Laurie Kaiser, Cushing, Raymor and Selter finished out Pinckney's first places with a 14:50 showing in the distance medley relay.

Selter came from behind in both running relays to help the Pirates to their victories. Pinckney also scored in the distance-medley relay.

Howell, which didn't pick up any wins, still had some fine showings. The team of Jamie Fuller, Angie Rice and Lisa Ballenger took second in the discus event. Heather Howe, Rice and Suzanne Rakowski were fourth in the high jump relay and Christa Starkey, Christa Mattson, Feather and Amy Dhuc placed fourth in the 800 relay.

(47) Pinckney 109-64 South Lyon 28-64; Last Tuesday, the host Pirates beat South Lyon in the boys' outing, 109-28, while the girls' teams tied, 64-64.

The Pinckney boys won 14 of 17 events, including sweeps in the 300 hurdles and pole vault. Individual double-winners included Smith in the 100 (11.4) and 300 hurdles (40.5), McIntosh in the 110 hurdles (15.7) and high jump (5.9) and Heitbrink in the 200 (25.0) and pole vault (12.0). Other Pirate champions were Mungblin in the shot put (46.2), Ryan Swan in the 800 (2:10.2) and Casey Lince in the 3,200 (10:39). Pinckney (11.0 overall) also won 3 of 4 relays.

In the girls' competition, Pinckney's Raymor, Purdy, Carrie Robbins, and Kaiser won the final event—the 1,600 relay—to force the tie. They checked in at 4:32. Other winners were Cushing in the shot put (33.10), Kaiser in the discus (85.0), Selter in the 3,200 (13:20), Raymor in the 400 (1:08) and the 400-158 (0 and 3,200 relay (11:40) teams. The Pinckney girls are 1-1-1 overall.

The Pirates were to have opened the Southeastern Conference campaign Tuesday at Dexter. Thursday they host Milan.

# Minghini, Smith break records

**PINCKNEY**—Steve Smith and Rocky Minghini etched their names in the record books last Thursday against Lincoln High, despite the host Pinckney track team losing, 90-47.

Minghini, the Pirates' ace weight thrower, launched the shot a school-best 52-2 $\frac{3}{4}$ , bettering the 1970 school record of 50-11. Smith, meanwhile, turned in the second school record of the day when he clocked a 39.7 in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles. His time was .3 seconds better than the previous record of 40.0 set in 1989.

Earlier this season, Pinckney Coach Dave Mitchell said he knew some records were going to fall in this 1992 campaign.

"They've both worked so hard to get this good," Mitchell said. "I'm glad

they're making so much progress."

Mitchell said Minghini's and Smith's performances helped comfort the blow Lincoln dealt Pinckney, fastest clocking of 45.3.

Before Pinckney's Southeastern The Pirates hadn't lost to the Rail-splitters in four years.

"Lincoln was clearly the better all-around team," Mitchell said. "It made me feel better, though, that they were worried about us. I know their coach was relieved when they finally won."

Other than in the hurdles and shot put, Pinckney only had two other victories at the meet. Minghini picked up a double win with his 129-10 effort in the discus and Nick Dimitroff pole-vaulted 12-6. Smith also ran a season-best time in the 110 hurdles, finishing in 15.0 and Pinckney's second-place 400 relay team had its

Conference dynasty of the past four years, it was Lincoln which dominated the league throughout the 1980s.

The Pirates are now 2-2 in the Southeastern Conference. Mitchell said he is looking forward to Wednesday's SEC finals, which will be held at Pinckney, Tecumseh, Lincoln, Pinckney and Saline should make for some outstanding competition.
