The Bucks ran to a pair of first places in the two-mile and medley relays (heat I) and the Shamrocks took a first in the second heat of the medley relay at the annual South Bend Classic Indoor Track and Field Meet held at the Joyce Athletic & Convocation Center on the campus of Notre Dame.
