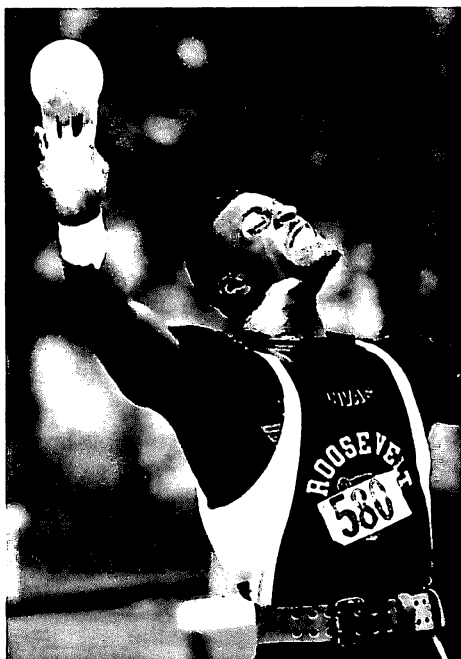

STATE MEET REPEAT?

A repeat performance by the top three team finishers at last year's Ohio Division I State Meet could be in the offing for this spring's talent-laden 60th Mansfield Mehock Relays.

State champion Cleveland John Marshall still has one of the nation's finest scholastic sprinters in Jonathan Burrell, while state runnerup and defending Mehock champion Cleveland Heights will feature overall depth and strong relay entries.

Third-place finisher Cleveland John Adams could move to the top on the legs of its excellent corps of sprinters. The Cleveland powerhouse is expected to enter experienced foursomes in at least five relay events.

Caldwell's exciting junior, Brian Hesson, will try to duplicate his 1991 Mehock record-setting effort in Friday's 3200-meter run. Hesson, who came in third at the high-school national cross-country meet, is considered to be Ohio's premier distance runner.

As many as five former gold medalists could be entered in this year's Mehock Relays. As usual, the field of more than 1,000 athletes from six states and Canada is expected to converge on Mansfield's Mehock Field for this early-season track/field classic.

Ohio schools have captured the last three team titles, after watching Toronto (Ont.) Central Tech reel off an unprecedented five consecutive championships, piling up more than 60 points in four of its victories.

RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 14th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty-six years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College and Akron University. In addition to his duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays Committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 60th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 17-18, 1992. This independent interscholastic classic will be staged at Malabar Middle School's Mehock Field Track.

This Booklet contains general information concerning the 1992 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1991 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1991 renewal drew 145 high schools from six states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky, New York and Canada. Eighty-two of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1100 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Deadline for Entries - Friday, April 11, 1992

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 17th and breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600-meter relay teams, 4 x 800-meter relay teams, medley teams, 3200-meter run contestants, triple jump, and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you to your hosts when you return. **NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.**

Track - We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-EIGHTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privilege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals. Eligibility list must accompany entry forms.

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch - The Concession stand will be available for lunch.

Shot-Discuss Events - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1600-meter, the 400-meter, 4 x 800-meter relay, 4 x 100-meter relay, 800-meter run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles, 4 x 1600 meter relay and 3200-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - The starting height in these events will be determined after all entries are received. Please note that the entry standard for the pole vault is 12 ft. 6 in. and the high jump is 6 ft. 1 in. Pole vaulters must be ready to jump within 2 minutes of their name being called and within 1½ minutes in the high jump or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boy's Track - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Uniform Rule - The track and field uniform consists of a school issued jersey and shorts, which are not objectionable, and shoes, which may be supplied by the contestant. Any other visible apparel must be of a single color and worn under the uniform jersey and shorts. In relay races each team member shall wear the same color and design of school uniform (jersey and trunks). When other apparel is worn under the school uniform, it shall be of the same color for all teammates choosing to wear them.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line. New hurdle height is 36 inches.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on the straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.

It is a false start if a runner fails to comply with the starters' commands, or if a runner is in motion after the command "set", or if a runner leaves the mark with a hand or foot after the "set" instruction but before the pistol is fired, or if a runner leaves the mark without the pistol being fired. THE OFFENDERS SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED.

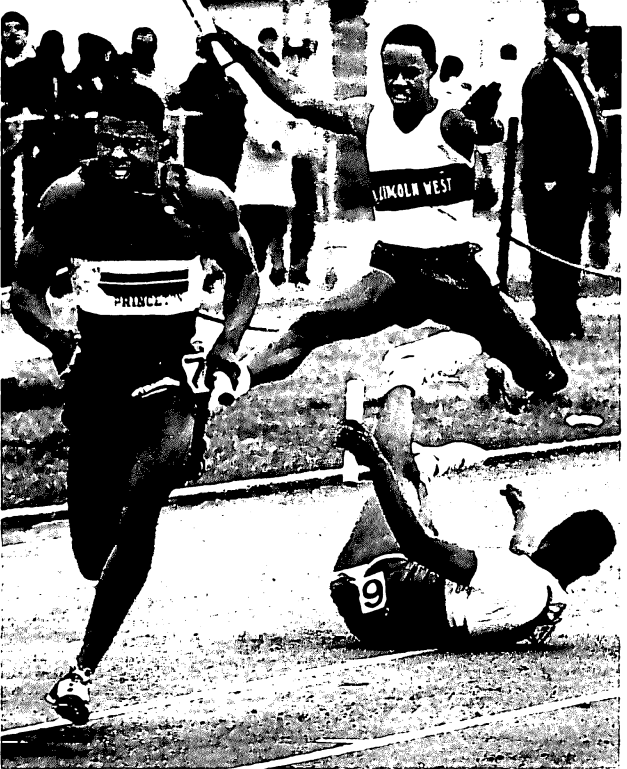

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, New York, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Each individual entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in his event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.
