## Beecher's Burgess leaps 6-10

Last week, despite heavy wind and rain, the Beecher High boys track team looked mighty impressive

So with Friday's cloudless 80degree temperatures, the Bucs weren't expected to be anything less than outstanding.

Beecher blitzed the field in the C.S. Mott Relays at Houston Stadium. The Bucs scored a whopping 113 points, more than 2½ times more than second-Ann Ar-


bor Huron which scored 44.

BEECHER WON eight of 13 events in winning the meet for the second straight year. It was the Bucs' seventh Mott crown, tying Flint Northern for the most first-place finishes in the 24-year

history of the meet.
"I don't think we could do a
whole lot better than we did today." Beecher Coach Martin
Crane said. "The kids really per-

formed well tonight

Junior TaRon Burgess highlighted the meet, setting a Mott Relays individual record: in the high jump at 6-foot-10. Combined with a 6-foot-2 leap by teammate

Joe Bullock, Beecher also set a team record of 13-feet in the event, breaking the record of 12feet-11 set in 1981 by Midland Dow

Burgess, who broke his school record of 6-9, barely missed on two attempts at clearing 7-feet.

"I wanted to do better, but I made a few minor mistakes," the 6-foot-7 Burgess said.

Burgess pulled up short of his jumping mark twice while the bar was set at 7-feet

"You could tell it was a mental thing with his approaches," Crane said "The second time he was on his mark, but he stopped. I think the adrenaline got him going."

Other first-place finishes for the Bucs were: 800-meter C.S. Mott relay; shuttle hurdle relay; long jump relay; sprint medley relay; 3200 meter relay; 400 meter relay; and the 1600 meter relay.

In the other five events, Beecher placed second twice, third once and fifth once. The Bucs were blanked only in the pole vault.

"Every time I turned around, somebody was running a great sprint," Crane said "We didn't botch any passes today. This was just one of those nights you'd love to have."

After sweeping through opponents for the past few weeks, what could be next for the Bucs?

"The state meet - that's the one that means the most," Crane said. "I'd like to take these guys there right now."

Saginaw High won the girls meet with 89 points Defending champion Brighton was second with 44 points and Midland third with 35. Flint-area teams were shut out from first-place medals as Saginaw took six, and Brighton, Midland and Arthur Hill two apiece.

The closest any Flint girls squad came to winning were seconds by Southwestern Academy in the discus and 400 meter run.
