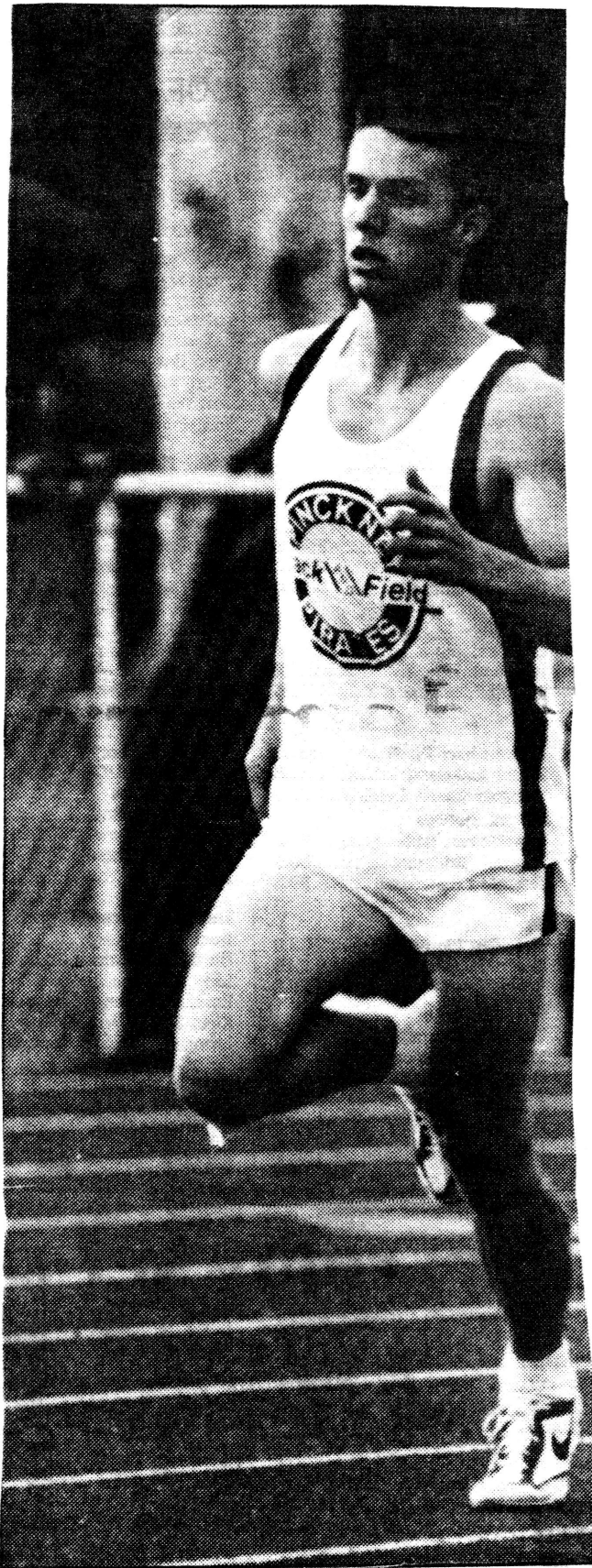

Wallace qualified for the state finals and also led Pinckney to ninth place with 20 points. Pioneer won the regional with a score of 87.

Swan put forth a very gutsy performance in the 1,600, an event he nearly won. The Pirate took the lead from the start and held it until the final lap, when Pioneer's Don McLaughlin moved into contention. The twosome then ran with each other until with about 200 meters to go, McLaughlin pulled away to win in 4:24.5. Swan settled for second in 4:27.0.

Later in the meet, Swan qualified for the state meet in another event—the 800—when he checked in at 1:59.5, good for fourth place. He beat the qualifying standard of 2:00.3.

Following the 1,600, Swan said he felt he should have won the race.

"I thought I could hold (McLaughlin) off," he said, "but my legs really started tying up at the 200. I just couldn't stay with him."

Swan said he not only wanted to win the race but also had his eyes set on breaking the Pirate school record of 4:25, set by Gar Eddings in 1990. Now, he said, he'd like to eclipse that mark before or at the state finals.

Pinckney's other 1993 state qualifier is Wallace, who pole-vaulted a career-best 12-10, good for third place and four inches better than the automatic qualifying mark.

In other events for Pinckney, freshman David Mortensen just missed qualifying in the high jump when he soared 6-1 to place third. He needed to get over 6-3 in order to advance to the state finals. In addition, Chris Wehrman finished the 3,200 in a best-ever 10:03 to place 11th.

Leaders hold on

Boys' track squad has power in field and distance runs

There's no question the Pinckney High boys' track team is loaded in the middle and long distances this season.

With such runners as Casey Lince, Ryan Swan, Chris Wehrman and Bryan Nance—to name only a few—all coming off a strong cross country campaign, their success should no doubt carry over to the oval.

The key to the Pirates' success in the Southeastern Conference, then, is how well their rather inexperienced sprinters and young field-event performers develop. Pinckney placed third in the 1992 SEC campaign.

Lince and Swan are perhaps the cream of Pinckney's distance crop. This past fall, Lince won the SEC cross-country crown as a sophomore and then cruised to Class A All-State honors. In his inaugural high school season on the track last year, he paced the Pirates with a 10:02 clocking in the 3,200-meter run. Lince was third in the SEC two mile.

Swan, meanwhile, qualified for the 1992 state finals in the 800 and turned in a best-ever time of 1:59.4. The junior, who was fourth in the SEC meet's 800, also has a 4:32.6 to his credit in the 1,600.

Among the others who will play roles in the distance events include juniors Nance, Ed Lewandowski and Wehrman, who's new to the track scene but a proven cross country runner.

In the 400 and 800, then, Swan will get added support from juniors David Carpenter and Scott Morehouse, freshman David Mortensen and senior Jayson Shore.

Speaking of Mortensen, he's an athlete to look out for this year and the coming years. A few weeks ago, the 5-foot-11 ninth-grader shattered Pinckney's freshmen high-jump record when he leaped an amazing 6-2 at an indoor meet at Siena Heights College. He easily broke the previous freshmen mark of 5-10, set 20 years ago.

"He cleared 6-4 a few times, but barely hit the bar on his way down," said Pinckney Coach David Mitchell. "(Mortensen) should have a good year. We're glad to have someone of his caliber."

Mortensen isn't the only freshman who's going to turn heads this spring. Mitchell said Adam Greenman has all the tools to be an excellent hurdler. Already, the freshman has run 8.2 seconds in the indoor 60 high hurdles.

"He's still pretty rough, but he has a lot of potential," Mitchell said. "He's the first athlete I've coached who can three-step (take three steps between hurdles) in the highs."

Greenman is also a capable long-jumper, as proven by the 19-1 he leaped at Siena Heights. The freshman school record in that event is 19-6 $\frac{1}{2}$, so that's another mark which Greenman could destroy.

Greenman will lend excellent support to senior long-jumper Steve Clark, who went in the 19-6-range a year ago. Other high-jumpers are Shore and sophomore Jim Chapman.

Turning to other field events, sophomore Tony Wallace and junior Adam Haberkorn have some big shoes to fill in the pole vault. Last year, now-graduated Mike Hietbrink and Nick Dimitroff were both state qualifiers and both surpassed the 13-0 mark.

As for the throws, senior Brett Briggs tossed the shot 43-10 last season and both he and classmate Pete

Lahm heaved the discus better than 130 feet. They will get further help from senior Aaron Simpson and juniors Chris Ancora and Pat Woyle.

Back on the track, sophomore John Kelly should anchor the Pirates' sprint, hurdle and relay corps. At the 1992 league meet, Kelly advanced to the 300 hurdle finals but then was disqualified. Other sprinters this season include Clark, Greenman, sophomore Mike Webb and senior Steve Sopha.

If there is a gray area for the Pirates, it's in the sprints.

"We've got plenty of people in the distances, but we're lacking them in the shorter events," Mitchell said. "Hopefully, we'll find a few others who can help fill the holes."

Mitchell said 55 tracksters are out for this year's team. At \$120 per athlete—Pinckney has a pay-to-participate format—Mitchell said he's pleased to have so many on the roster.

"I really didn't expect this many," he said, "and because they're paying for themselves, I expect most of them will stay on. We're really pleased." One week from today, the Pirates welcome in the outdoor campaign when they compete at Fowlerville.

Swan leads tracksters indoors

The Pinckney High boys' track team collected 20 points and placed among the top-10 teams at last Friday's Huron River Relays, held at Eastern Michigan University.

Individually, Ryan Swan led the Pirates at the indoor meet as he finished third in the 1,600-meter run, turning in a time of 4:32.9. Casey Lince, meanwhile, captured sixth place in the 3,200, checking in at 10:24.3.

Pinckney had two relay teams pick up places. The shuttle-hurdle relay unit of Adam Greenman, David Mortensen, John Kelly and Nick Paschka ran to fourth place in 32.7 seconds. The 3,200 relay squad, which featured Swan, Ed Lewandowski, Jayson Shore and David Carpenter, came in seventh place in 8:44.3.

Mortensen, Pinckney's top high-jumper, had to scratch from that event because he experienced some muscle tightness.

(3/20) Siena Heights Shamrock Inv.: The Pirate boys picked up 20 medals at the recent indoor Siena Heights Shamrock Invitational.

Mortensen was among the more impressive highlights as he cleared a freshmen school-record 6-2 in the high jump. He eclipsed the 20-year-old mark of 5-10.

Pinckney earned a pair of championships in the meet, in which no team scores were kept. Swan won the 1,600 in 4:38.5 and then he joined Kelly, Shore and Lewandowski to prevail in the Siena relay (800-400-600-800). Lewandowski, the anchor runner, clocked a best-ever 2:11.9 in the 800.

In other events, Greenman finished third in the 60 high hurdles (8.2) and Kelly, who hit a number of hurdles, wound up sixth (8.9).

Another top Pirate placing came in the sprint medley relay, in which Mortensen, Steve Clark, Mike Webb and Carpenter united to place third.

Pirate boys beat weather and Indians; Seiter sets 3,200 mark

PINCKNEY—The May 4 boys' track and field meet between Pinckney High and Tecumseh turned into a rapid affair when dark storm clouds moved into the area. Fortunately for the host Pirates, they acted quickly enough to complete the 300-meter hurdles and secure the victory.

With seven running events completed, the Pirates needed six points to reach 69 and guarantee the win. As it turned out, they swept the 300 hurdles to take a 71-34 lead, more than enough needed. A short time later, the lightning and thunderstorm hit and the meet had to be called. It doesn't have to be completed, though.

The victory improved Pinckney's Southeastern Conference record to

5-0. Thursday, the squad will take on unbeaten Ypsilanti Lincoln in a battle for first place in the league. The contest will be held in Ypsilanti.

Pinckney's latest win over Tecumseh was really the result of a trio of Pirate sweeps. After winning the 3,200 relay in 8:40.9, Pinckney's Adam Greenman (16.5 seconds), Nick Paschka (16.6) and John Kelly (16.8) captured the top three places in the 110-meter high hurdles.

Then as the storm got closer, David Mortonsen (54.7), Scott Morehouse (54.9) and Mike Cosgrove (56.7) completed the Pirates' second sweep. Finally, Kelly (42.7), Greenman (43.3) and Ben Kroll (46.9) and Nathan MacAinsh (46.9) closed the 300 hurdles with another shutout.

Pinckney had five other event victories for the day: Brett Briggs in the discus (126-6 $\frac{3}{4}$), Tony Wallace in the

pole vault (11-6), Ryan Swan in the 1,600 (4:37.0), and the 400 and 800 relays.

(5/4) Tecumseh 68, Pinckney 60: On account of last Tuesday's storm, the Pirate and Tecumseh girls had to complete the last few events two days later. They did, and the Indians dealt Pinckney (3-1) its first SEC loss of the year.

Despite the defeat, though, the Pirates managed some outstanding performances. Distance runner Ann Marie Seiter was perhaps the biggest highlight when she ran to a school record in the 3,200. Though she was second behind All-Stater Nicole Randolph (12:04), Seiter's 12:07.4 broke

Greenman glides to records against Glads

FOWLERVILLE—The season-opening meet between the Fowlerville and Pinckney High boys track teams didn't conclude with a thrilling 1,600-meter relay like the girls' meet, but it did begin with a highly-competitive 3,200 relay.

The Pirates, who won last Wednesday's meet at Fowlerville, 84-53, found themselves about eight seconds behind in the final leg of the opening race but Ryan Swan—who split a 1:59.7 800—could only make up three seconds on Gladiator anchor Chris Thompson.

"Fowlerville's got some good middle-distance people," Pinckney Coach David Mitchell said. "It kind of surprised me that they won that race but they looked really good."

The Glad relay unit's 8:29 clocking was 15 seconds faster than its performance one week before at the Spartan Relays.

"It was nice to see them drop that much time off," said Glad Coach Alan Leslie. "The guys gave Thompson a good lead. He could have gone even faster if it was a closer race."

Following that running event, the Pirates quickly seized control of the

meet as they swept the 110-meter high hurdles. John Kelly was first in 16.3 seconds, followed by Adam Greenman (16.4) and Nick Paschka (17.7).

Speaking of Greenman, the freshman had a record-setting day in both the long jump and 300 hurdles. His first-place, 19-foot, seven-inch performance in the long jump bettered the former Pirate freshman record of 19-6 $\frac{1}{2}$ set by Tom Reason. Later, Greenman finished second behind teammate Kelly (42.2) in the hurdles, turning in a freshman-best 43.4.

Pinckney won eight events in all. Also on the track, Casey Lince (4:50) and Bryan Nance (4:51) finished 1-2 in the 1,600; Lince won the 3,200 (10:26.1) and the Pirates were fastest in both the 800 (1:41) and 400 relays (46.0).

In the field events, Pirate Brett Briggs captured first place in both the shot put (41-9) and discus (114-8). Briggs actually led a sweep in the discus as Pete Lahm (109-10) and Chris Ancona (108-9) finished second and third.

While Thompson was the star of the 3,200 relay, he also used his impressive speed to capture the 400 and 800 (2:08) crowns. Other Gladia-
tor winners were Nick Douglass (100

dash), freshman Eric Hune (200, 24.0) and Joel Holdcraft (pole vault, 11-6).

Fowlerville closed the meet with a victory in the 1,600 relay. Jeremy Antrim, Douglass, Hune and Brian Byars formed that team.

Though it is spring break, both the Glads and Pirates will be sending teams to meets on Saturday. Fowlerville competes in the Perry Invitational while Pinckney travels to the Milan Puddle Jumper Invitational.
