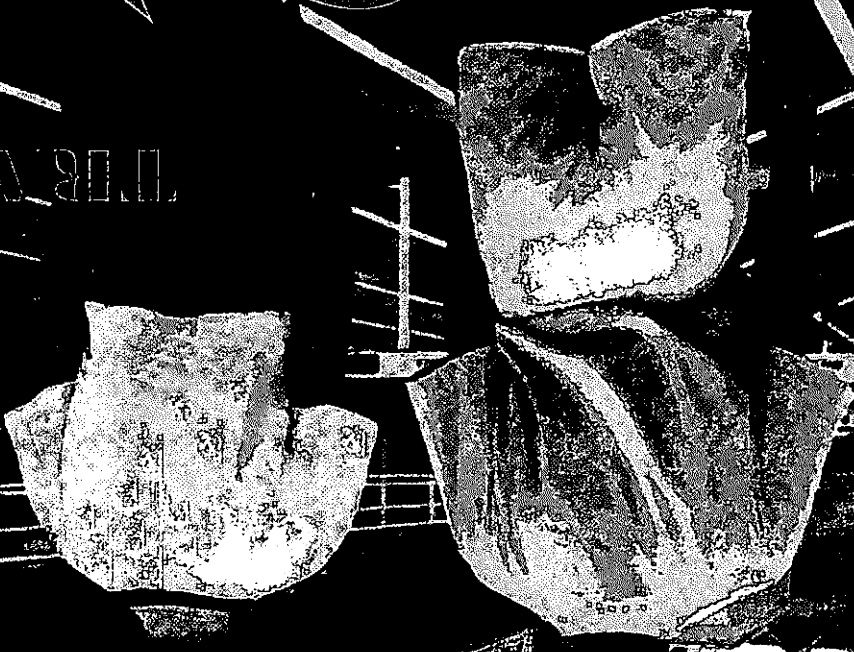

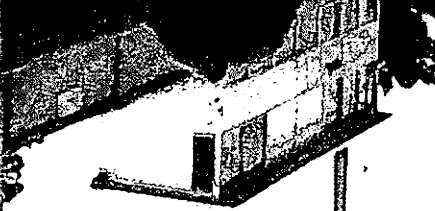

There is something special about high school athletics.

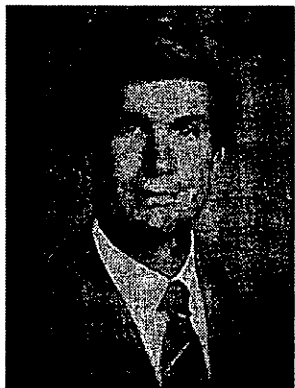

Spectators attend high school athletic events in numbers that dwarf programs sponsored by other entities in the same sport for the same kids. They identify with the local school program above all others.

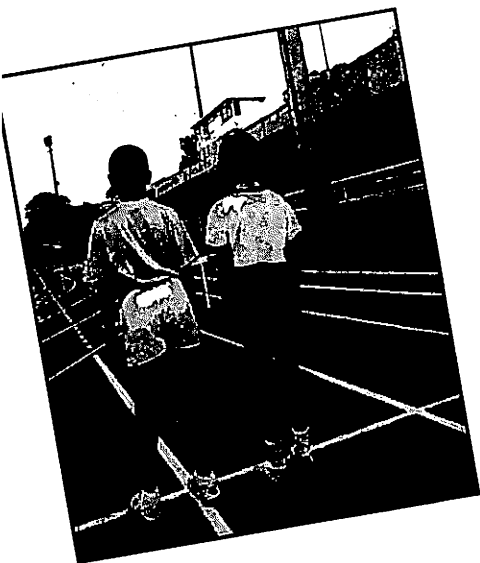

Back Tracking

1992 finals produce different twists

Upper Peninsula: *Mother Nature doesn't damper meet's excitement*

Some of the incentive was gone for the Upper Peninsula's top sprinters when the public address announcer told athletes that their wind-assisted times would not count toward records during the 1992 MHSAA U.P. Track and Field Finals last May at Marquette High School.

Each race became a struggle against the elements, but the excitement was still there.

The light snow and 37-degree temperatures, including a 17-degree wind chill factor, provided less than ideal conditions for the U.P. Finals participants. The 16-25 mile per hour winds gave sprinters quite a push during the 100-meter dash, and knocked the wind out of them on the back stretch of the 200.

"I wish there wasn't so much wind," said Escanaba senior Nathan Chylek, a

Lower Peninsula: *Teamwork leads to titles*

So you think that track and field is an individual sport, and that teamwork doesn't count?

Think again.

At the 1992 Michigan High School Athletic Association Lower Peninsula Finals, the Traverse City boys team finished first in Class A without once finishing first — in an individual event, that is.

Depth did it for the Trojans, who scored heavily in the field events.

The highest finish for Traverse City was by the 3,200-meter relay team which placed second. Rob Sharp in the the 110 hurdles, Jeff Gregory in the high jump

and Shawn Aplers in the discus captured thirds.

The Flint Beecher boys and girls likewise failed to win an individual event, but their relay teams won seven of eight races to propel both to the Class B crown. The Beecher boys team won its seventh title in the last 11 years, and the crown for the girls fourth since 1981.

Maple City-Glen Lake's girls are a good example, just two girls — Marnie Peplinski and Theresa Proost — scored enough points to lift the Lakers to their second straight Class D crown.

Each won three individual events and ran a leg of a championship relay team to finish brilliant careers that included 22 individual and relay MHSAA meet titles.

"Theresa is my best friend and I couldn't be happier for her. We wanted to finish in a big way and we did," said Peplinski after helping the Lakers to the championship.

The victory put Maple City-Glen Lake in unique company.

Four different schools have gone back-to-back since 1985 to win the Class D meet. *(continued on page 4)*

quadruple winner who clocked a :10.89 to win the Class A-B 100 dash and a :23.38 to place first in the 200. "I thought I had a chance for the record in the 100. If I broke it, it wouldn't have mattered. When I heard that..."

The Class A-B record in the boys 100-meter dash is :10.9, set by Escanaba's Todd LaCosse in 1987. During what Chylek called the only good race day of the year earlier last season, he shattered that mark by clocking a school record :10.85.

"I figured I'd get my best time at the U.P. Finals," said Chylek, who is playing baseball at Grand Valley State University this year.

Chylek's U.P. Finals times were not close to the records in the 200 dash or the 400 and 800 relays, but he still managed to lead the Eskymos to their first boys team title since 1987.

"I was happy with that," Chylek said. "It was what I wanted. Winning all four races was tough."

Unlike Chylek, Cedarville junior Kara Scherer did not leave the U.P. Finals wondering about what could have been.

She not only already held the girls Class D records in the 100, 200 and 400 dashes, but is expected to return this year to take one more shot at bettering those times.

"You can't comment on God-given talent," noted Cedarville co-head coach Tom Wilson on Scherer, who breezed to three individual titles despite struggling through the season and limping through the regional with nagging shin splints.

Scherer again won all three races, but her times were well off her U.P. record pace. Those times, however, were not as disappointing as Cedarville's disqualification the 800 relay due to a false start. Cedarville loaded that relay with Kara and Lindsay Scherer, Heather Applegate and Breanna Huff, and was counting on that team to clinch

the U.P. championship.

"We said it wasn't the end of the world," said Huff, whose team edged second-place Iron Mountain-North Dickinson by five points despite getting shutout with its best relay. "We said we'll focus on something else. We'll make it up somewhere."

The only U.P. record that was broken and official was set by Wade Hodge of Menominee. Jumping against the wind, he cleared 14 feet in the pole vault to better the old mark of 13-6 3/4 set by John Noblet of Escanaba in 1972.

There were several other outstanding individual performances, too, as the MHSAA finals completed the second of their three-year run in Grand Rapids.

But a day-long rain and chilly temperatures in the 50's limited meet record efforts to just three:

- Grandville's Brett Organek repeated as Class A discus champion at Houseman Field, setting the record with a toss of 196-5;
- Katja Pettinew of Lansing Eastern set the girls Class A discus record with a toss of 144-9; and
- Trinity Townsend of Muskegon Heights set the only running record of the day, breaking the boys Class B 400-meter record at Wyoming Park with a time of :48.14.

Detroit Cass Tech won the girls Class A team championship, breaking the seven-year streak of Ann Arbor Pioneer, which finished second. Vania Walters of Pioneer won both sprint titles and Alicia Bernier of West Ottawa took titles in the high jump and 100 hurdles and was second in the 300 hurdles.

In the boys Class A meet, Randy Kinder of East Lansing was the individual star, winning the 200 and 400 dashes and finishing second by a whisker in the 100.

The girls Class B meet produced a pair of double winners — Alesia McClure of Detroit St. Martin dePorres in the sprints and Kelly Smith of Petoskey in the distances.

In Class C, dePorres won the boys title (the girls competed in Class B) and Vermontville-Maple Valley, led by wins in both distance relays and double champ Tracy Kangas (shot put and discus), claimed the girls title.

Athens won the Class D boys title, edging runner-up Litchfield, which had beaten it twice during the regular season. The win kept the crown in Big 8 country as Reading won back-to-back championships in 1990 and 1991.

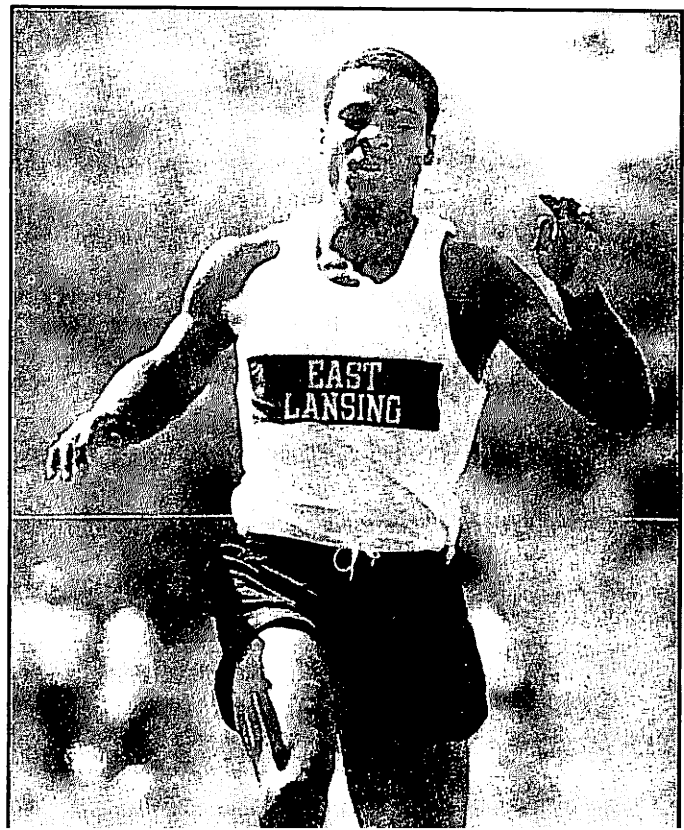

The Scholar-Athlete Award Class of 1993

Farm Bureau Insurance presents twenty-three \$1,000 scholarships

The Michigan High School Athletic Association Scholar-Athlete Award, underwritten by Farm Bureau Insurance, is in its fourth year of recognizing the top student-athletes in all sports in which the MHSAA sponsors post-season competition.

The Scholar-Athlete Award was expanded last year to include all 23 sports. Previously, only six student-athletes were honored, a male and female recipient during each of the fall, winter and spring sports seasons.

Recipients of the 1992-93 Scholar-Athlete Award receive a \$1,000 college scholarship to be used at the college, university, or trade school of their choice during the 1993-94 school year.

Applicants for the Scholar-Athlete Award must meet the following criteria: A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale; and must have previously

won a varsity letter in the sport in which they are applying for the award. Applicants should also show involvement in other school and community activities; submit two letters of recommendation and a 500-word essay describing how co-curricular activities have enhanced their educational experience.

A record 1,744 applications from 444 schools were received for the 23 scholarships, a 54 percent increase over last year. Each MHSAA member school was allowed to submit one applicant in each sport. A student could be a candidate in more than one sport.

All scholarship recipients were honored in ceremonies at halftime of the Class B Boys Basketball Finals at The Palace of Auburn Hills in March.

Applications for the 1993-94 Scholar-Athlete Award will be available in the fall from member school principals.

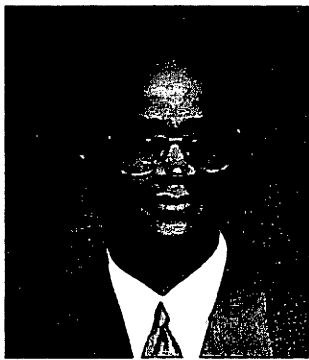

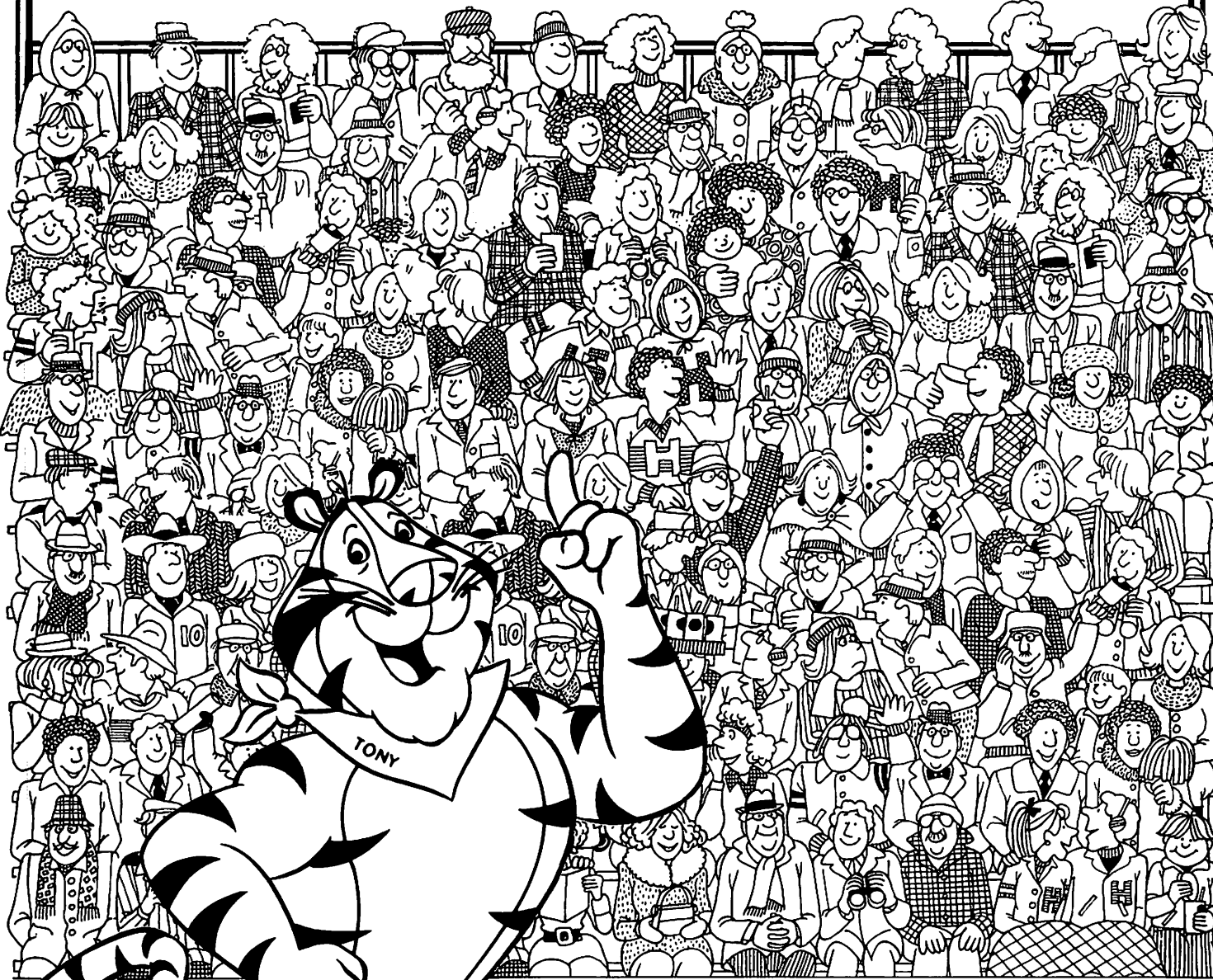

MHSAA Promotes Educational Athletics

The promotion and protection of educational athletics is the mission of the Michigan High School Athletic Association, which was created in 1924 to service the interscholastic sports community.

The stated purposes of the MHSAA are threefold:

1. Increase and promote the educational value of interscholastic athletic programs throughout the state;
2. Assist in the regulation of competition so that the athletic program exists as an integral part of the school curriculum; and
3. Promote the physical welfare of participating students.

Through their boards of education, member schools voluntarily join the MHSAA each and every year, vowing by formal resolution to abide by and enforce common rules for interscholastic athletics. Schools pay no membership or entry fees to belong.

Here are some other facts about the Michigan High School Athletic Association:

- Over 700 senior and 600 junior high/middle schools belong to the MHSAA, representing over 250,000 student-athletes.
- A major role of the MHSAA is that of an educator. Approximately 200 workshops and rules meetings are conducted for coaches, athletic directors and registered game officials each year.
- Over 10,000 game officials are registered through the Association.
- Over 30 committees, made up of school administrators and coaches, impact the decision-making process.
- The 19-member Representative Council is the school-elected legislative body of the MHSAA. The Council meets three times yearly to pass and modify regulations.
- Standards of eligibility are established for student-athletes. Local school districts are welcome to establish stricter guidelines.

- Numerous publications and other printed materials are provided to schools to assist in the administration of the Association's 23-sport championship program. This includes the monthly **MHSAA Bulletin** and separate guidebooks and newsletters for coaches and officials.

- The MHSAA provides, at no cost to schools, a catastrophic accidental medical insurance plan for student-athletes.
- This school year, 98 team champions will be crowned in tournaments, and individual honors will be given to hundreds of young men and women.
- The Association shares tournament revenue with member schools through disbursements to tournament hosts, and to cover a portion of travel expenses to selected MHSAA final tournaments.
- Member schools and allied organizations, such as associations of coaches or administrators, are welcome to submit proposals for new or modified regulations to be discussed by the membership.

Other programs the MHSAA is actively involved in to help promote the standard of educational athletics include:

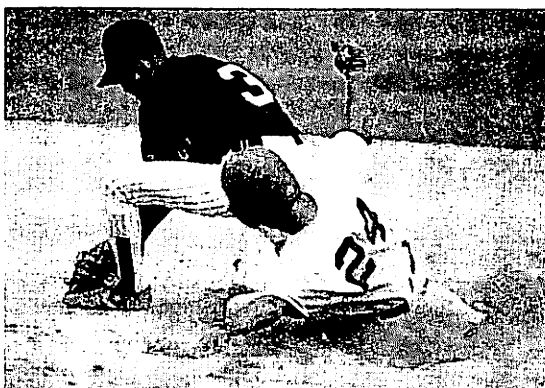
- The **Good Sports Are Winners!** program, where schools are annually provided with materials to develop their own public relations campaigns to promote good sportsmanship; and over 800 teams are recognized with awards for displaying good sportsmanship at selected MHSAA tournaments;
- The **Scholar-Athlete Award**, through which the MHSAA annually honors the state's top student-athletes, with a \$1,000 scholarship presented in each of the 23 sports in which the Association sponsors a post-season tournament;
- In partnership with the WBA Ruster Foundation of Sturgis, the MHSAA promotes athletics as a positive alternative for students to lead healthy lives;
- The **Program of Athletic Coaches Education (PACE)** helps provide training for coaches, especially those who are not faculty members at the school where they coach, in the specifics of dealing with young athletes;
- The **Women In Sports Leadership Conference** takes place annually to draw attention to the fact that women can aspire to and attain positions of leadership in the athletic community as a coach, administrator or official; and
- The MHSAA's **Masterplan For Officials** focuses on the recruiting and training of officials, to provide the quality officiating that interscholastic athletics deserve.

John E. "Jack" Roberts is the fourth full-time executive director of MHSAA. He directs the 18-member staff office in East Lansing. Previous directors were Charles Forsythe (1931-68); Allen Bush (1968-78); and Vern Norris (1978-86).

A non-profit organization, the MHSAA is a charter member of the National Federation of State High School Associations.

They Want To Be Better Officials

Summer camps provide referees opportunities to hone skills

You run up and down the basketball court as many times as Michael Jordan, if not more — and that is guaranteed. You are video-taped and critiqued. Retaped, recritiqued and rerun for five consecutive days.

The cost is \$150, which includes four days' meals and a cot to drag your weary bones into at the conclusion of each day (somewhere between 10 p.m. and midnight). Bright and early the next morn-

ing, you hit the hardwood again under the tutelage of some of the best in Michigan basketball.

But this is no Five Star Camp. Nor is it High Exposure. This is the annual Michigan High School Athletic Association officials clinic held each July in Adrian at Siena Heights College. The tutors are Jim Eastman of Lapeer, Dick Kalahar of Jackson, Dennis Mayer of Okemos, Hugh Jewell of Highland Park and Jim Robinson of Swartz Creek; a quintet with a combined total of over 100 years of basketball officiating experience. And you, if you are here, are one dedicated referee, especially since this grueling clinic, which requires most to sacrifice vacation time, is not mandatory.

Twenty-four officials participated in this week's clinic (12 in the varsity group for refs with five years or more experience, and the other dozen in the junior varsity segment) out of 10,000-plus certified "zebras" in the state of Michigan.

"A lot of officials are registered with the state athletic association and they go out and get games without any real training — and it shows," said Eastman, who also runs his own officiating clinic at Saginaw Valley State University. "We teach the basic fundamentals of officiating."

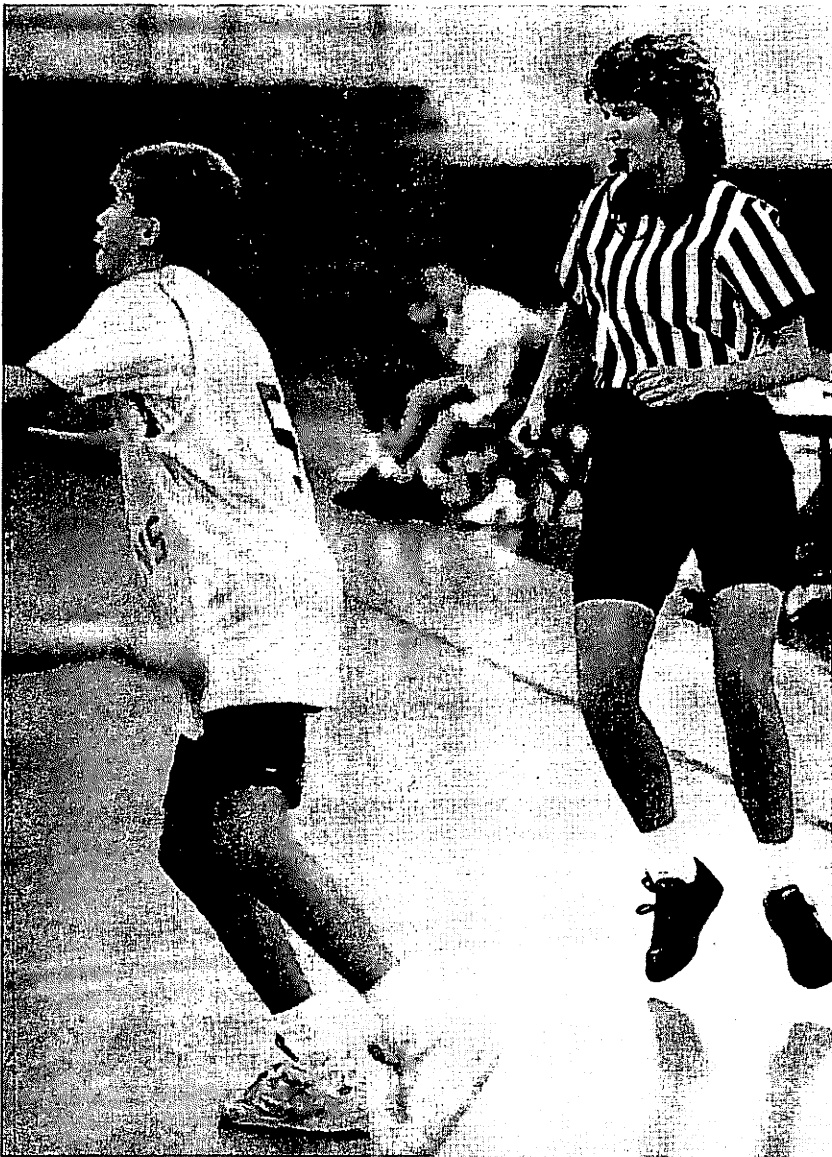
Julie Gettel, a housewife from Elkton, has been officiating boys varsity basketball for five years and has a handle on the fundamentals. She still made the trek down from Michigan's thumb in search of improvement and added expertise.

"I just came here because, all-around, I want to become a better official," Gettel said. "Everybody here wants to be better. Out of hundreds of officials, there are 12 of us (in the varsity group) here. I think that says a lot about us."

Over the course of the clinic, Kalahar and Eastman will say a lot about those officials too. Most of it is preserved on tape so that when the individual referees view their on-court performance later, they'll hear about what they did wrong (or right) and pick up some helpful pointers.

"We're trying to get consistency (from the officials), not only in calls, but in mechanics as well," Eastman said. "One of the little things we look for on video is: Are they getting their hands up when they blow the whistle?"

This may seem like a triviality, but Eastman explained that in a loud gymnasium, it is imperative for the official to signal to the

timer that there has been a stoppage of play. The timer may not hear the whistle blow and if the referee doesn't signal, valuable time runs off the game clock.

"The critiquers (Eastman and Kalahar) are great," Gettel maintained. "They have so many years experience and they know what officiating is all about. They know how to handle every situation that might come up on the court."

However, they are not infallible, Kalahar pointed out. Just like any other referee, they're only human.

"Jim and I screw up calls too. Anybody that referees makes mistakes," Kalahar stated. "We want to help these people to become better officials."

Better officials make less mistakes than most, because they do the little things that Eastman and Kalahar are trying to teach. They hustle. They get the proper angle from which to make calls. They get a hand up when they blow the whistle. They are in shape physically and not carrying extra weight. Sometimes, the less they know when they come into the clinic, the better off they are.

"We have one girl in here with zero minutes on the basketball court," Eastman indicated. "Those are the people you like to teach because they don't have any bad habits. People like that come here Sunday and make a lot of mistakes, but by Thursday they've gained about two to three years of experience."

Not every referee has that kind of growth spurt during the clinic, but they all get better, according to Kalahar. And if they keep working to improve, these officials will be so good, that packed gymnasiums everywhere will give them standing ovations when they step on the court.

Maybe not. But they will definitely become some of the best basketball referees in the state of Michigan.

Good Sports Are Winners!

Sportsmanship values taught through statewide campaign

One of the most important elements in interscholastic athletics is sportsmanship. It is perhaps the major reason the prep sports classroom differs from other levels of athletics.

Briefly defined, the elements of respect, ethics, integrity and fair play that are carried into the game of life are wrapped up into sportsmanship.

"The mission of educational athletics is to promote lifetime skills and values," says MHSAA Executive Director John E. "Jack" Roberts. "There must be learning during this process, and there is no single lesson more important than sportsmanship.

"Without sportsmanship, our youngsters

veloped which not only educates the public about good sportsmanship, but rewards it as well.

Key to the program are kits which are provided to MHSAA-member schools in the fall by True Value with materials to develop sportsmanship campaigns locally; and at selected district, regional and state tournaments, schools will again be presented awards for displaying good sportsmanship.

"We continue to be appreciative of True Value's support of the "Good Sports Are Winners!" program, by providing sportsmanship kits and recognition to our schools," Roberts said. "These items help reinforce the positive message that needs to be sent to our student-athletes, our student bodies in general, our coaches, our school administrators, and most importantly, the general public."

With True Value's underwriting, schools were sent the fourth "Good Sports Are Winners!" sportsmanship kit during the fall, with ideas for building public relations, including letters to athletes, parents and alumni, homeroom presentations, announcements to be read at games, posters, brochures, sportsmanship pledge cards and camera-ready artwork for schools to use as they see fit.

True Value will also provide "Good Sports Are Winners!" awards at the district, regional and state final level of the following team tournaments: Girls basketball, football and boys soccer in the fall; boys basketball, ice hockey, volleyball and team dual wrestling in the winter; and baseball, girls soccer and softball in the spring. Over 800 teams are recognized annually.

District winners receive certificates, regional winners plaques, and state final winners receive a crystal trophy, a banner and a \$1,000 donation.

"The efforts of schools have made Michigan a national leader in the drive to promote good sportsmanship," said Daniel A. Cotter, president of True Value's 100 percent retailer-owned Cotter & Company. Addressing Morals On The Playing Field

Women In Sports Leadership Conference looks at integrity issues

Is it possible to be a good competitor and still retain a sense of morality? Or does it all come down to the bottom line—win, at all costs.

Moral Reasoning In Sport was the topic that brought over 260 athletic administrators, coaches, officials and student-athletes together for the fifth annual Michigan High School Athletic Association's Women In Sports Leadership Conference in Lansing, February 7-8.

The topic was addressed by Dr. Jennifer M. Beller, an assistant professor at Eastern Michigan University, and Dr. Sharon Stoll, a professor from the University of Idaho. Pioneers in the field of sports ethics, the two women were instrumental in helping to found the Center for Ethics in Competitive Sport at the University of Idaho.

Both Beller and Stoll are concerned with the way athletics is progressing in the country. "We've developed great athletes who don't have the ability to reason or think constructively," Stoll said. "I actually had a student, who now plays pro football, in one of my beginning classes who told me it was his job to knee (the other guy) in the groin before pounding him into the dirt."

The professors believe that intensive educational intervention is needed to halt the disappearance of moral development within athletes.

"When we started our research five years ago, female athletes ranked significantly higher than their male counterparts in moral reasoning," Beller stated. "In the last four years we've noticed that the level of

moral reasoning among female athletes has actually begun to decline."

On-going research is currently targeting student-athletes from the high school level and above. Dr. Beller is one of the principal authors of the Hahm-Beller Values Choice Inventory in the Sport Milieu which has been shown as a promising new tool in studying moral reasoning in sport. Over 10,000 athletes across the United States, including cadets from the United States Military Academy at West Point, NCAA Division I-III and NAIA schools, as well as high school students, have participated in the studies.

"Dr. Beller, our colleagues, and I feel we have a mission to return to the classical ideas of sportsmanship and competition through applied intervention," Stoll said. "We're seeking to change a pattern of behavior which is a long haul that won't happen by being blessed. It's a long-term endeavor that isn't going to occur overnight."

A variety of workshops were held during the course of the 1993 Women In Sports Leadership Conference highlighting topics including: Working with non-starters and parents; becoming a college athlete; diversity training; coaching styles; and a special presentation by original members of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League, who have regained national attention within the past year through the release of the movie, "A League Of Their Own."

The conference also honored Jo Lake, assistant principal and athletic director at Grosse Pointe South, as the 1993 recipient of the Women In Sports Leadership Award.

Lake has worked with student-athletes from middle school to college age and been the avantgarde of a number of women's programs during her career, particularly in the areas of athletic scholarships and the initiation and implementation of new sports for women.

Lake holds a combined career win-loss record of 653-65 for the sports of basketball, softball and volleyball. In October, 1991, she was inducted into the Michigan High School Coaches Hall of Fame.

The Races

The 12th annual Muskegon Chronicle Seaway Run is scheduled for Saturday, June 26, 1993. Both races start at 8:30 a.m. from the Muskegon YFCA, 900 W. Western Ave.

The 5-K run is a mostly flat loop. The 15-K run takes runners over gently rolling terrain to Lake Michigan before looping back to the YFCA.

FACILITIES: Race headquarters is the Muskegon YFCA and the 'Y' building will be open to runners. Showers and lockers will be available. Bring your own lock and towel. Ample parking is available adjacent to the 'Y'.

ENTRY FEES: The entry fee for each race is \$12 per runner. Entrants age 10 and under and age 60 and over pay just \$8. Mail entries must be postmarked by June 18. After June 18 runners may register hours: June 25, 4-7 p.m., and the morning of the

race 6:30-7:45 a.m. The late registration fee is \$18 for all runners.

AGE DIVISIONS: Age categories for men and women in both the 5-K and 15-K races will be: 14 and under; 15-19; 20-24; 25-29; 30-34; 35-39; 40-44; 45-49; 50-54; 55-59; 60 and over. In addition, there will be a 10 and under age division in the 5-K race only.

TEAM COMPETITION: Companies may field a team by registering four regular employees as a corporate team. The team must

consist of two female and two male employees. The team competition will be scored according to how high the team members place in their individual age groups. Team members must be entered in the same race and the entries must be submitted together. Instead of the individual entry fees, there is a flat \$60 entry fee for teams. There will be no late registration for teams.

WHEEL CHAIR DIVISION: "The 15-K race will again feature several wheelchair divisions. For the information on the statewide M.U.S.C.L.E.S. series and point system, contact Scott McDonough, (313) 478-9325."

AWARDS: Special awards will go to the overall male and female winners and the first-place finishers in all categories. Medals will be awarded through fifth-place finishers in each age group. Complete race results will be published in the following day's Muskegon Chronicle and mailed to all runners.

The pre-race fitness fair is back by popular demand! This year's pre-race event will feature a wide range of running and fitness displays and demonstrations. The event, sponsored by the Muskegon FYCA and the race committee, will be in the main gymnasium at the YFCA from 4-7 p.m. on Friday, June 25. Packet pick-up and late registration also will be offered during those hours.

The Representative Council of the Michigan High School Athletic Association is the body assembled to carry out the wishes of member schools. The council meets several times annually to discuss and pass legislation concerning interscholastic athletics in Michigan.

The Representative Council is made up of 19 members, with all but seven elected by a vote of MHSAA-member schools to represent different geographic regions, different sizes of schools, private schools, and junior and middle

schools. Two members are elected to statewide at-large positions. Four members are appointed by the Council to facilitate representation of females and minorities, and the 19th position is occupied by the Superintendent of Public Instruction or his designee.

The officers and two other representatives form the MHSAA's Executive Committee, which meets on a monthly basis during the school year to review eligibility appeals and other current business.

All season long, I'll be ripping off parents from all over the state.

The high school sports season is in full swing. I'll be out there on the field, in the gyms, and on the courts, stealing parents blind almost every day.

They'll let me do it.

They'll never see it coming.

Every football game I go to, there are some 60 players out on the field. When you add the cheerleaders and band members there are some 100 kids involved each night.

And there are at least that many kids who I'll see at weekly basketball games, tennis matches, cross country and track meets, on the golf course and soccer fields and the baseball and softball diamonds.

This season is going to be special to them; high school is a special time to every kid. It goes by so fast, and it goes by only once. A lot of kids never even get the chance to play on a varsity team. Some have to work. Some have to settle for just watching.

Playing high school varsity sports is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, and I get to see them grow from game to game, year to year.

With a few exceptions, however, I'll see only about 20 percent of their parents out at the games, sharing this precious time in the life of their kids.

Of course, the other 80 percent will have a reason not to be there. Maybe they have to work.

Maybe they have other plans. Maybe they asked their kid if the kid cares if they come. The kid always says, "Nah, it's OK."

If you have to ask, don't bother going.

The parents who aren't out there in the stands are the ones I steal from. While they're off playing bridge games or going bowling, I'm out watching their

kids grow up. I'm enjoying their special moments.

I get to talk to them after they score the winning touchdown. I'm in the gym watching them jump around after the winning basket. I'm watching as they push themselves past their limits and run all out to the finish line.

I'm also out there when they've been knocked down. I see the hurt in their eyes when the ball bounces the wrong way. I watch them walk off the field when they get beat.

That's when I wonder most if their parents are going to be there to give them some support, to let them know everything is going to be OK, to let them know this time will pass.

I've been doing this too long. I've asked myself too many times at all too many games in all too many cities, "Where are the parents?" I see 20 kids on the field. I see six parents in the stands.

Where are the rest? Don't they know what they're missing? It doesn't matter if the kid is a star, a starter, or the last player on the bench. They're all part of the team, and this is one thing they can share with their parents.

And all their parents have to do is be there.

Be there.

If you're not, I will be. I'll get to watch your kid make that great tackle. I'll get to watch their first basket. I'll see how hard they work running up that last hill. I'll watch that putt sink from 20 feet out.

And the parents who aren't there? To heck with them. I'll take a moment like this any day. I do it almost every day on the job.

I don't feel guilty, but I feel sorry for the parents who aren't there.

They're the ones stealing from themselves.

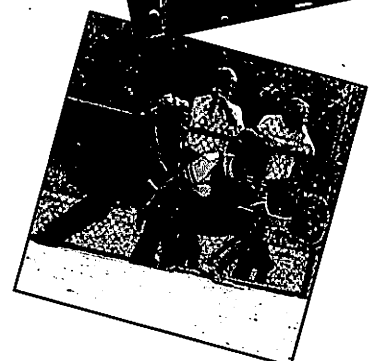
