The Mansfield-Mehock Relays is an annual track/field event steeped in tradition. If you are a coach planning to bring a team to Mansfield for the first time, prepare your boys to face fierce competition. The best athletes from a seven-state area and Ontario, Canada will be here.

Almost from its inception in 1927, this interscholastic classic has proven to be a spring-board for budding world-class athletes. Early-on, the Relays showcased future Olympians such as Jesse Owens, Dave Albritton and Harrison Dillard.

Next came the great hurdlers of the 1950's and '60s - Hayes Jones, Warren Cawley, Willie Davenport and Glenn "Jeep" Davis, all Olympic champions. Although Mark McCoy, 1992 Olympic high hurdles champion from Canada, failed to win here, his famous teammate, Ben Johnson, was victorious in three events in Mansfield.

And the beat continues on today, with former Relays champions such as Chris Nelloms, Todd Williams, Rob Kennedy, Glenn Terry, Dion Bentley, Atlee Mahorn (Ca.) and Duaine Ladejo (GB) making their marks on the international scene.

We have a great two-day meet. And remember, we provide lodging accommodations with private families for teams traveling more than 150 miles. These accommodations are also offered to all athletes competing in first-day events. This includes free lodging Friday night and breakfast Saturday morning. See you in Mansfield, April 15 and 16!

RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, New York, West Virginia, Indiana, and Canada.

The Ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Each individual entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in his event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of third place.


Bronze medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of fifth place.

RELAYS DIRECTOR - Doug Castle, in his 16th year as meet director, has been associated with the Relays for twenty-eight years. He is a Mansfield native and a graduate of Marietta College and Akron University. In addition to his duties as Relays Director, Doug serves as the Principal at John Simpson Middle School.

The Relays Committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 62nd renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 15-16, 1994. This independent interscholastic classic will be staged at Malabar Middle School's Mehock Field Track.

This Booklet contains general information concerning the 1994 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1993 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1993 renewal drew 140 high schools from six states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky, New York and Canada. Seventy-two of the schools were from outside of Ohio. The field numbered 1100 athletes.

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

Sanction - The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

Deadline for Entries - Friday, April 9, 1994

Lodging - Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night April 15th and breakfast Saturday Moming. These accommodations are also provided all 4 x 1600-meter relay teams, 4 x 800-meter relay teams, medley teams, 3200-meter run contestants, triple jump, and pole vaulters. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you to your hosts when you return. NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.

Track - We have an all weather track composed of a newly resurfaced Latex. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand:

ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-EIGHTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE LATEX SURFACES. However, if the athlete desires to wear rubbersoled shoes that is his privilege. The athlete's shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.

Eligibility - All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals. Eligibility list must accompany entry forms,

Classification - There is no classification.

Points - Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows - 10-8-6-4-2-1.

Lunch - The Concession stand will be available for lunch.

Shot-Discus Events - Shot puts and Discus will be furnished by the Relays. Athletes may warm up with their own implement, but will be required to throw the Shot and/or Discus provided by the Relays.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

* Entry Fee \$4.00 per Athlete. Payable with the entry.

FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

Preliminaries - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the 1600-meter, 4x 800-meter relay, 4 x 100-meter relay, 800-meter run, distance medley, shuttle hurdles, 4 x 1600-meter relay and 3200-meter run which will run in sections against time.

Relay Exchange - The 4 x 100 meter relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

Pole Vault and High Jump - The starting height in these events will be determined after all entries are received. Please note that the entry standard for the pole vault is 12 ft. 6 in. and the high jump is 6 ft. 1 in. Pole vaulters must be ready to jump within 2 minutes of their name being called and within 1 1/2 minutes in the high jump or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at the height.

Rules - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

Out-of-State Schools must adhere to their regulations where there is differential between the standards set up by the Ohio High School athletic Association.

Restrictions - Boy's Track - A participant may compete a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

Uniform Rule - The track and field uniform consists of a school issued jersey and shorts, which are not objectionable, and shoes, which may be supplied by the contestant. Any other visible apparel must be of a single color and wom under the uniform jersey and shorts. In relay races each team member shall wear the same color and design of school uniform (jersey and trunks). When other apparel is wom under the school uniform, it shall be of the same color for all teammates choosing to wear them.

300 meter Hurdles - Prelims will be run on the south portion of the track and finish at the north end. The finals will start on the north and finish at the common finish line. Hurdle height is 36 inches.

200 meter - Prelims will be run on the straight away at the north end. The finals will be run on the curve with the finish at the common finish line.
