"We were hoping to get into the top three," Sexton coach Camaron Johnson said. "Last year we were fifth with just Nikki running, and this year we had a relay team, too.

"But I think the team ran very well today."

East Lansing's Eileen Fleck was the only other area athlete to capture a title, winning the 3,200-meter run in 10 minutes, 55.3 seconds. She placed second in the 1,600 run with a time of 5:03.3. She led Michelle Slater of Rochester Adams until the final turn. Slater then took the lead and Fleck's sprint at the end fell half of a stride short. Fleck was not happy with the way she ran, but said first and second were still pretty good.

"I feel worse about the two-mile," she said. "I thought I could get faster than that. I don't know, maybe I was tired.

"In the" one-mile, it's not so much the place I mind. I kind of wanted to break five minutes."

Curry and Suzie von Vernuth led Okemos to a sixth-place team finish with 27 points.

Von Vernuth won the shot put with a throw of 41-1½ and placed second in the discus at 133-4.

The favorite for the title, he entered the vaulting at 13-0 and lasted till the bar was at 14-6. His best vault was 14-2, good for second.

Lesile's Joe Barratt set a school record 14-2 with his third-place finish in the pole vault.

Williamston was second in the 400 relay in 44.34 and Hornet Sam Mills was eighth in the 100 hurdles in 16-41, just behind lithach's shinsule Adachl, who ran 15.99.

In the girls' meet, Shepherd's Jodi Gelina won the 400 dash in 58.03 seconds, and Portland's Patth Marcoux was fifth in 180.15.
