## Central girls edged out in Mott Relays

Decent weather, something that has been lacking in recent years, and an enthusiatic crowd made for an exciting event at the 30th Annual Mott Relays Friday afternoon.

The meet, with its storied tradition, drew 37 teams from throughout the state to Houston Stadium. Though no meet records were set, times overall were faster than the past two years in which runners had to battle chilly temperatures and/or high winds. Those in attendence saw several dramatic finishes in various races and the girls' team standings saw only two points separate the top three teams.

In the girls' meet, Plymouth Salem edged Central to take the team title. The Rocks finished with 50 points, while Central tallied 49 and Detroit Renaissance finished with 48.

The boys' portion of the meet didn't have quite as much drama as Kalamazoo Loy Norrix won its second consecutive team title. The Huskies finished with 67 points, while Brighton was second with 59 and Pinckney was third with 53. Central was the leading area team, placing fourth with 41 points.

"We had only 10 girls participating today. We had a couple out sick," said Central coach Otha Hill. "We thought it would be tight. The girls that ran, ran great races today.

"I can't say much more about these girls. They're hard workers. If we had 25 girls, it would be better, but you can only work with what you have. Mia Malloy, Crystal Ewell, Simone Plumpp — they have no quit in them. They have injured legs, but they push one another."

The Indians' girls placed first in the C.S. Mott relay and the 400-, 800- and 1,600-meter relays as well. In addition to Malloy, Ewell, and Plumpp, Corinthian Car-

outhers and Ebony Small ran in those races to score for Central.

Carouthers, Ewell, Plumpp and Malloy set a school record in the 1,600 relay with their time of 4:06.17.

Salem scored big points in the distance races, placing second in the 3,200 relay and having the top two runners in the individual 1,600 run.

In the boys' portion of the meet, Loy Norrix did most of its damage in the sprints, winning C.S. Mott relay, the sprint medley and the 400-meter relay. The Huskies also placed first in the distance medley relay.

Central's team of Isaac Lightfoot, Jamaal Jordan, Alan Bogan and Chris Lewis placed first in the shuttle hurdle relay. Southwestern Academy's David Hatter and Brandon Womack won the long jump relay for the area's only first-place finishes in the boys' portion of the meet.

Central coach Carlos Benton said the meet was a good test for teams at this point in the season.

"There is good competition here," said Benton. "This is a good meet to see how strong the kids are and how well they can recover. This prepares you for the regionals.

"It was good to see a lot more teams here than last year. There was a pretty good crowd here, too. I think the Mott relays are coming back up to where it used to be."
