MAYVILLE - The Brown City Green Devils held off rival Ubly by one point last Tuesday to claim their first-ever GTC East girls cross country championship.

The Lady Green Devils, with four runners earning First Team All-League honors, finished with 29 points while Ubly was runner-up with 30.

"I am very excited about winning the girls race," said Michelle Blake, BC coach. "I hope more big things come the next few weeks. The girls are looking for the Regional title and State."

BC boys settle for 2nd

MAYVILLE - The Brown City boys cross country team could not match last year's league championship, but did settle for second at Tuesday's GTC East meet at Mayville.

Ubly won the title with 20 points while the Green Devils were next with 35.

"The boys finished five, six, seven, eight, nine, 11 and 12, so I just cannot complain. They ran tough and Ubly is hard to beat," commented BC coach Michelle Blake.

Mike McPhail (5th, 18:18) and Glenn Martus (6th, 18:28), both sophomores, and Kevin Hooker (7th, 18:35) earned First Team All-League honors for Brown City.

Junior Theresa Iwinski and senior Meghan Sanson led the way for Brown City. Iwinski finished second overall with a time of 20:57 and Sanson was third in 22:00. Seniors Kim Martus (6th, 22:22), and Melinda Byers (7th, 18:35) also both garnered First Team status.

Cass City's Sarah Zawilinski was also an honorable mention with a 17th place finish.

Unionville-Sebewaing's Katie Diehl was a second team all-conference choice for the Patriots with a 10th place finish.

USA's Cameron Wildner was in ninth place for second team all-conference and Reese's Erik Palm and Joe Jimenez also were second team all-conference finishers.
