MEET HIGHLIGHTS

Sarah Chrzanowski of Walled Lake Central is now Pole Vault record holder at 11 - 5.

Emily Franks of Strugis is now 3^{rd} on the all – time Pole Vault list at 10 - 10.

Jennifer Vander Meer of Holland is now also 3rd on the all – time Pole Vault list.

Candice Davis of Ann Arbor Pioneer is now 4th on the all – time 100 hurdle list.

The Michigan girls trailed Indiana and Ohio until the lst and 2nd place sweep by Laingsburg's multi-state champion Julie Johnson and strong straight-a-way running by Ypsi Lincoln's Jennifer Horn in the 400 dash ignited the team.

Then Benton Harbor's Shuntia Lucas and Johnson produced another sweep in the 200 dash.

Solid placing in the field events, where the blue and white team scored 64 points, carried the Michigan women to its seventh straight team victory.

The men's team put up a good effort, but could only win one event (Belleville's Evan Walker long jump victory), but strong runner-up positions by Flint Powers' John Childress in the 110 hurdles (where 1^{st} and 2^{nd} had identical times); by Dan Orozco of Lawton and Harley Rohloff of Grosse Ile in the 800 run; and by Damion DeRosia of Mt. Morris, where his last toss moved him into first place with a career best 58 - 1.25. Then DeRosia had to watch Indiana's Tyler Miller respond with a winning 58 - 6.75 effort.

A reminder to athletes that all split times in the results are hand-timed. However, all final times are fully automatic times (FAT); and any final times may be used as school records.
