# Novi runners eye boys state title

Blaszczyk, cross country team looking to build on 2008 success

Novi's boy's cross country team ranked 13th in the state last season behind the speed of All-State junior Mike Blaszczyk. With Blaszczyk returning as a senior, the Wildcats have a strong foundation for building another successful season.

Blaszczyk was 19th in the state last season with a 5-kilometer time of 15 minutes and 45 seconds. Four other returning runners ran times in the 16-minute frame last season and should improve this year.

Seniors Dan Egner (16:32), Alex Minghine (16:48), Geoff Giese (16:48) and junior Joe Schubring (16:55) look to speed up and fill the roles left by graduating TJ Butler (16:29), Jake Carless (16:55) and Andrew Burkhardt (17:30), all three of which maintained a perfect 4.0 GPA and are headed to the University of Michigan this fall.

"I anticipate them closing the gap between them and Mike," said Robert Smith, who returns for his 28th season as Novi's coach. "What always concerns me is the risk of injury. The Wildcats will look to build on a season that included winning the KLAA divisional meet, South Lyon Invitational, Anchor Bay Invitational and Spartan (MSU) Invitational, as well as going 5-0 in dual meets. "I believe that we can challenge for both the KLAA divisional and conference title," Smith said. "Other top teams include Northville and South Lyon in the division. Plymouth and Canton will be among the challengers for the conference title."

Smith said the team is slightly ahead of last year's pace and, although he doesn't want to make too large of predictions, the team has adopted the motto "tradition is back" for the season, referencing the 1998 and 1999 state titles that were followed up by 2000 and 2006 state runner-up finishes. The 1998 state title was the first in any sport at Novi High School.

"We're looking to at least duplicate what we did last season. I'm looking at top 10 in state, if not better. It all depends on if we stay healthy," Smith said Aug. 22, noting the team has been in the state's top 10 rankings nine or 10 times. "We started 10 days ago. These guys came in ready to compete."

Both the boy's and girl's cross country teams will kick off the season 10 a.m. Saturday defending their title at the South Lyon Invitational before taking two weeks off to rev up for the first dual meet of the season, 4:30 p.m. Sept. 15 against South Lyon East at Cass Benton Park in Northville.

# Wildcats repeat at South Lyon Invite

# ■ Runners improve on last season despite wet course

The South Lyon Invitational kicked off the start of a promising 2009 season for Novi's boy's cross country squad.

The Wildcats successfully defended their 2008 title against 10 other teams at Island Lake State Park Saturday, racing through a cool air and damp course still drenched from last Friday's downpour.

The wet conditions didn't slow the runners down much, as senior Mike Blaszczyk led the way, finishing third overall on the 3.1-mile course in 16 minutes and 29 seconds, just 44 seconds off his All-State pace from last season.

Of the 77 varsity runners representing 11 schools in the season opener, Novi had five of its seven in the top 15.

Junior Joe Schubring wasn't far behind Blaszczyk, finishing sixth in 17:01, just six seconds off his state meet time from last season.

"Joe had an outstanding summer. He put in a lot of quality miles, and now he is enjoying the fruits of his labor," said coach Robert Smith.

Seniors Alex Minghine (17:11), Geoff Giese (17:21) and junior Brett Giampa (17:27) finished 10th, 12th and 15th to round out Novi's top five racers. Giampa's time was a personal best.

"Brett has really stepped up his game. He is running about 45 seconds faster than he did last year at this time," Smith said. "Alex ran the smartest

race of all of our guys today. Last year, he often started a little too slow. Today he ran his first mile more on pace for this time of the season."

Senior Dan Egner (17:36) and junior Chase Conrad (18:13) wrapped up the race for the Wildcats at 21st and 40th.

"Dan was a little off of his game today," Smith said. "Dan ran as our number two man many times for us last season. As he makes the transition from the 800 meters (spring track) to 3.1 miles, I am confident that he will return to challenge the rest of our top five. When that happens, we will be even more solid than we are right now."

Novi was solid enough to outpace Temperance Bedford by 21 points, earning a meet low 46. All of Novi's participating KLAA competition scored between 119 and 245, perhaps forecasting how Novi's race results will fare against some of their opposition.

Few area teams can match NOVI's strong tradition, which includes an annual appearance at the state meet - the Wildcats were 13th last year and a Central Division title to go with Spartan and Anchor Bay Invitational crowns, And guess what? The Wildcats are back for more.

'We have four guys who were in the state meet last year who ran in the 16s," Novi coach Robert Smith said.

Senior Mike Blaszczyk, who clocked 15:45 at state, is the leading Wildcat and he'll have support from seniors Dan Egner, Geoff Giese and Alex Minghini. Juniors Brett Giampa, Chase Conrad and Steve Pravato complete a seasoned squad.

"We're relatively young, we only have six seniors," Smith said.

Meanwhile, Scott Smith, Robert Smith's brother, is doing double duty for SOUTH LYON and SOUTH LYON EAST, entering its third season, as coach for both teams.

"We train together, but compete separately," Scott Smith said. "It's a

different experience." Seniors Robbie Kulie, Jordan Schaefer, Andy Stone, Luke Rondon, Jacob Uratehko and Chase Brisbois are key runners for South Lyon, although lunior Blake Yard may be the best of some 35 kids out for the team.

"We're definitely deeper than last year," said Smith, who is still trying to nurture the young Cougars. Spencer Leyson and Tyler Foley will be the key runners for East with help from David Hanson, Darrick Popp, Matt Darr, Riley McKenzie and Jacob Schneider.

"It's a team that has a new conscience about it, the result of athletes maturing and having some experience under their belts," said Scott Smith, who has a dilemma approaching.

# at Spartan Invite

EAST LANSING — Novi cross country coach Robert Smith, still recuperating from a recent serious bicycle accident, wasn't able to join his squad at Friday's Spartan Invitational at Forest Akers Golf Course.

But despite his absence. the scrappy Wildcats took matters into their own hands.

Mike Blaszczyk took second place in the fivekilometer race, leading five Wildcats among the top 30 finishers as Novi handily won the Green Division title. The Wildcats finished with 86 points, placing ahead of runnerup Forest Hills Eastern (152) and Okemos (163).

Meanwhile, Mike Atchoo of Troy placed first in the Elite Division, pacing the Colts to a second-place finish, and Megan Goethals of Rochester won the girls Elite Division title — her second straight Spartan Invitational title — with her trademark second-half surge. Troy's girls finished fourth in a high caliber meet featuring many of the state's top teams.

After Blaszczyk, who clocked 16:14. Novi's runners finished within 12 seconds of each other as Alex Minghine

(16th), Geoffrey Giese (17th), Joe Schubring (23rd) and Dan Egner (28th) stayed in close contact.

"We tried working on our pack for our second through five runners," Blaszczyk said. "(And) we won it (Green Division) last year, so that (winning) was our main goal. We also wanted to bring home the trophy for our coach. We talked to him after the meet ... (and) he was very happy for us. He knows what we're capable of ... and he cares about each and every one of us. Our prayers are with him."

In the Elite Division, Troy (159) was second behind Pinckney (124), which was fine with Colts coach Eric Prowse.

"I'm really happy with the way the guys performed," he said. "Our approach was to be aggressive. They're going to get real good experience out of that."

Atchoo clocked 15:38. the fastest time of the day. with teammates James Yau (ninth), William Yau (25th). Wilson Pines (60th) and Brad Pienta (64th) following, in a race of nearly 180 runners.

"My goal was to go out hard and string out the pack," said Atchoo, who won by 17 seconds and addressed the contributions of the senior-dominated lineup. "It's a lot easier to be successful as a team. You're all working together."

Milford's Nate Huff placed

10th in the Elite Division. to lead the Mays to a 10th place finish, and Lahser's Anthony Perrotta finished ninth in the Green Division in 16:47, two places ahead of Waterford Kettering's Alex Katona.

Goethals, the defending Division 1 state champ and ranked among the nation's leading prep athletes, ran with a front pack that included Churchill's Sara Kroll. Grand Blanc's Gabrielle Anzalone and Saline's Alex Leptich until just over a mile remaining.

"That's when I really started to push it," said Goethals, who quickly separated herself from the group. strained for the finish line and clocked a scorching 17:22 to finish 30 seconds ahead of Kroll. "I feel really good because I was 17 seconds slower (last year). It feels like the state meet because there's definitely a lot of competition here.'

Troy's Michelle Moriset placed seventh in 18:24, and Rochester's Brook Handler finished 11th in 18:42. Birmingham Seaholm's Mallory Wilberding placed 14th in 18:53, as the Maples finished 14th overall.

"That's our style of running and it works out real well for us," Smith said of the pack strategy. "We have confidence in each other's abilities."

Following Blaszczyk was seniors Alex Minghine (16th, 16:59), Geoffrey Giese (17th, 17:01), junior Joe Schubring (23rd, 17:07), senior Dan Egner (28th, 17:11) and junior Brett Giampa (36th, career best of 17:19).

"(Giampa)'s really stepped up. He was barely varsity last year. He's really filling the holes well," Smith said.

Following the Spartan Invitational, the Wildcats hosted Northville Sept. 22 at Cass Benton. The Mustangs, who also performed well at the Spartan Invitational with a fourth-place finish, were no match for Novi, as the Wildcats won 16-42.

"I want to say how proud I am to come back and do well against Northville. A lot of times, you come back after a big win and get beat," Smith said. "Northville's a good team, but we really came to play that day."

Blaszczyk led the Wildcats with a dominating 16:49 time, a personal course best. He was a full 39 seconds ahead of Egner, who finished second with a personal course best of 17:28. Schubring (17:29), Giampa (17:30) and Giese (17:31) rounded out Novi's five point earners as the Wildcats swept the top four spots and Giese took sixth in a decision against Northville's Frank Griffiths, who also ran a 17:31 race to take fifth place and prevent the full sweep.

"We're in pretty good shape this year. We're healthier this year," Smith said. "We're undefeated no matter how you slice and dice it."

Novi also won the Anchor Bay Invitational last Friday with 24 points, beating out Dakota (69 points) and seven other teams. Blaszczyk took first overall in a season-best 16:14, while Egner took fourth with a career-best 16:31, Schubring fifth with a career-best 16:34, Giese sixth with a career-best 16:38, Minghine eighth with a season-best 16:49, Giampa 10th with a career-best 16:55 and Chase Conrad 15th with a career-best 17:18.

"If we continue to have confidence, we'll continue to run well," Smith said. "This is a team that really clicks. They're going to do well the rest of the season."

# County meet turning 50

From modest beginnings a half-century ago to its current status as one of the state's premier events, the Oakland County cross country championships has not only survived, but thrived through the years. And as the county meet observes its 50th anniversary Saturday at Kensington Metropark, only a handful of current and former coaches have watched its evolution from then to now.

West Bloomfield coach Lee Averill and a pair of meet officials, Lou Marimonti and 98-year old Kermit Ambrose, are among those who go way back to the early days of the meet. All have coached teams which have won Oakland County titles.

Only 82 boys raced in the first county meet in 1960—there were no state-sponsored girls athletics at the time—which was held at the Multi-Lakes Conservation Club in Commerce Township, close to the present-day Walled Lake Central High School.

"It wasn't a real big meet at the time," recalled Averill.

For what was supposed to be a 2-mile course, Steve Myers of Berkley won in the unusually fast time of 7:40, with Jim Nelson of Pontiac Central a step behind.

"They started the race ... and everybody was standing around and, all of a sudden, these people are coming in and the watches are around seven minutes," recalled Ambrose, who coached Birmingham Seaholm. "I don't know if they measured the course wrong or maybe the lead kid, maybe he cut off somewhere where he shouldn't have and everybody followed him."

Whatever the reason, the runners actually ran 15 miles, according to reports. Seaholm, though, won the first meet title and the first of six it would eventually collect through the years.

Since then, the meet has been held at several sites, includ-

ing Marshbank Park and at the Highland Lakes campus at Oakland Community College before arriving at Kensington Metropark, its current home since 1996. The girls Oakland County meet was first contested in 1976.

Milford, with eight titles, and Lakeland, with seven, have col-

lected the most Oakland County meet titles, with Brother Rice and Seaholm next with six apiece. But Milford is the only team which has won titles in four different decades, with four of those championships coming from 2001-04.

There have been highlights galore in those 50 years of racing, including dominating performances by Seaholm in the early years — the Maples recorded the lowest score (25 points) in 1963 - and Novi's commanding effort in 2000, when Chris Toloff set a thencourse record (15:39) and teammates Tim Moore and Mark Avenius completed a sweep of the first three places en route to the team title. Moore broke the course record the following year with a 15:37, a fast time for a challenging course.

However, it's a time within reach of Troy's Mike Atchoo, last year's Oakland County meet and Division 1 state meet runner-up. Atchoo is unbeaten so far and no one has come

closer than eight seconds this season. But Lake Orion's Sean Bone and Walled Lake Central's Kyle Roche are able challengers, along with Catholic Central's Ricardo Galindo, who hopes to lead the Shamrocks to a second straight county championship.

On the girls side, Clarkston, Rochester Adams, Troy, Troy Athens and Milford have been among leading teams since the meet began. The girls, though, have provided their share of top-flight performances. Katie Boyles of Rochester Adams won four county titles from 1997-2000 and Rochester's Megan Goethals set a meet and course record in capturing last year's title.

Goethals, a nationally-ranked high school runner, will be a heavy favorite to win again with Waterford Mott's Shannon Osika and Troy's Michelle Moriset in the chase.

Some 600 boys and girls varsity athletes are expected to compete along with hundreds of junior varsity runners.



#### **Boys Cross Country**

Novi's boys cross country team took first place at the KLAA Kensington Conference meet held at Possum Hollow in Kensington Metro Part last Thursday.

Of the 12 teams' worth of runners, Novi had four place in the top four and all seven scorers place in the top 29 en route to earning 34 points, 29 ahead of second-place Plymouth.

Senior Mike Blaszczyk took first overall in a season-best 16 minutes and seven seconds. He was followed in fifth place by junior Joe Schubring (16:38) and senior Dan Egner (16:39). All three were named to the All-Conference first team. Twenty-three of Novi's 28 runners had personal course records as the Wildcats improved to 110-1 overall.

Novi's junior varsity runners also performed well, taking second place behind Northville. The JV runners were led by career bests from junior Garrett Murphy (fourth in 17:49), freshman Wesley Guenther (seventh in 18:01) and sophomore Eric Gardner (19th in 18:24).

The Wildcats will race in the Redford Union Invitational Friday to gear up for the state regional meet Saturday in Brighton.

#### Novi harriers qualify for states

The Wildcats' boys cross country team edged out host Brighton by three points last Friday at the Region 6 meet, earning the third and final spot at this Saturday's state meet at Michigan International <u>Speedway</u>.

As 14 teams gathered at Huron Meadows Metro Park, only the top three teams and top 15 individuals would come out with a bid for the state meet.

Novi's top seven runners all placed in the top 40 as the team earned 91 points to get past Brighton's 94 and Northville's 105. Pinckney and Detroit Catholic Central took the top two spots with scores of 39 and 41, respectively.

"I truly believe that Region 6-1 was the most difficult region in the state this year. Pinckney and Catholic Central are currently ranked as number two and three in the state. That left only one spot for three very good teams. We're arguably a top 10 team in the state," Novi coach Robert Smith said. "As you can see, we beat Brighton by the slimmest of margins. It was their home course, too. They didn't quite perform as well as they had in the past."

Had Brighton edged out Novi, the team would have still sent two of its seven runners to MIS, as senior Mike Blaszczyk and junior Joe Schubring both placed in the top 15 of 97 individuals. Blaszczyk took third place in a season-best 15 minutes and 54 seconds despite being ill, while Schubring took 15th with a career-best 16:21.


Novi sent its cross country boys team and top girls individual to Michigan International Speedway in Brooklyn, Mich. last Saturday and both returned home with a few great accomplishments under their belts.

The boys team, who qualified for States by finishing third in their region, finished 10th in Division I despite entering the day unranked and without even so much as an honorable mention in the post-regional polls.

"The guys who really created the theme, I was really proud of them. They saw it as a chance to get back into elite status," Smith said. "The way I interpreted it was us being a top-10 team in the state because last year we were 13th. We've been top 10 in 10 of the last 12 years."

Novi was led by senior Mike Blaszczyk, who was looking to improve on his 2008 All-State 19th-place finish and personal best of 15:45. However, a strong field and stronger wind kept Blaszczyk from repeating, as he finished 40th in 16:31.3, just 9.3 seconds behind the final All-State 30th spot.

"It was insanely windy. The weather was perfect; it was warm. The wind factor threw the whole field off. It caught me off guard," Blaszczyk said. "I ran my heart out for my last race at States."

Although the mid-60s temperature was unusually warm for November, the wind slowed everyone down, as the 30th position's 16:22 time was 25 seconds slower than the 2008 state cut of 15:57.

"When Mike came into the stadium, he was about 31st. He left nothing on the course. The wind finally just pushed him back," Smith said. "When an athlete gives 100 percent, I'm 100 percent happy."

Although the wind kept the Wildcats from achieving any new personal records, the team's pack strategy continued to be effective, as junior Joe Schubring wasn't far behind Blaszczyk, finishing in 16:45.6 to claim 58th.

"The guys really have confidence in our system. Our pack times were about the same as normal," Smith said. "Joe Schubring made a difference in that pack time. Joe was not that far off from Mike. They could all see each other."

Senior Dan Egner (16:54.6) followed in 78th, senior Geoffrey Giese (17:01.1) in 82nd and senior Alex Minghine (17:12.6) wrapped up scoring with a 115th-place finish in the field of 237 runners.

"The times were slower across the board. The wind was horrible the last three-quarters of a mile," Smith said. "They're beating themselves up and they really shouldn't be. They raced extremely well. They battled.
They really gave us our top-10 win."

Junior Brett Giampa (17:22.0) and Chase Conrad (17:36.0) finished 139th and 166th, respectively.

Troy senior Mike Atchoo won the individual competition in 15:28.5, while other local notables such as senior Ricardo Galindo (CC) took third in 15:51.2 and senior Frank Griffiths (Northville) took 28th in 16:19.8.

Although the season is over, Blaszczyk said 10 of Novi's runners – including all seven runners from the state meet – are forming a unaffiliated club called Team Ivon (Novi spelled backwards) to compete in Sunday's AAU Cross Country State Championship in Rochester, hoping to qualify for the AAU National Cross Country Championships Dec. 6 in Orlando.

# CC's Galindo heads All-Area **XC** runners

No matter where CC senior Ricardo Galindo ran, he was always one of the biggest threats on the course. He's done so well that his third-place finish at the state meet was one of his worst placings of the season, although he did earn a 15:51 time and was racing against the best of Division

"Ricky Galindo put a lot of miles in this summer and wanted to improve from last years state finals," coach Tony Magni said.

Last year, Galindo finished 26th in 15:52 at the state meet. Granted, the wind slowed the entire field down this year, but Galindo's determination to earn an All-State honor and lead his team to the Division I state title was undeniable, as he obtained both goals.

"Every runner from the bottom to the top pushed each other," Magni said. "He was the one over the summer who organized the guys. He never missed a day. He took charge."

In addition to his honors from the state meet. Galindo was also named to the All-Catholic team after winning the Catholic league meet in 16:07. His season-best was a 15:32 finish in a first-place regional win.

#### FIRST TEAM Nate Huff, Milford

With a personal best of 15:50, Huff took eighth at the Oakland County Invitational and fourth at both the KLAA Lakes Conference and regional meets before finishing fifth at the state finals in 16:01.

"A returning All-Stater, Nate saved his best for the state finals. Overcoming some early season injuries, Nate provided the upfront presence the team needed down the stretch," coach Brian Salyers said. "Nate's speed and strength separate him from his competition."

#### Mike Blaszczyk, Novi

Following up on his 15:45 All-State finish as a junior at last year's state finals, Blaszczyk continually led the Wildcats to victory this fall, posting his season-best 15:54 at this year's regional meet to earn third place. Recovering from an illness and held back by a windy final quarter mile at the state meet, he finished 40th overall in 16:31.

"Mike was the whole package: leader, scholar, front-runner and spiritual leader," said coach Robert Smith. "Mike was always putting the team first. Mike is old-school, which I consider a total compli-

16:00, fourth-place finish at the regional meet, Northville's captain is a three-time state meet qualifier. He earned All-State status with a 28th-place finish this season in 16:19 and holds the third-fastest time at Northville's Cass Benton course in 16:29.

"Frank is one of the most impressive big race runners I've ever coached. He has a nose for the hardware and, when he runs with motivation, he is truly a force," said coach Chris Cronin. "I love coaching Frank because he listens. We might try something new in the first mile and Frank can do it. He is a rare talent. I will miss him on this team."

#### Andrew Garcia-Garrison, CC

"Andrew didn't have a very good track season last spring, so he came every day and tried to run with Ricky (Galindo). He never missed a day," coach Tony Magni said. "I challenged him after the regional. He didn't run a smart race, but he ran a good race."

The determination to improve earned Garcia-Garrison a 16:07 time at the state meet, good for 11th overall and an All-State honor among individuals. He was also named to the All-Catholic team after finishing third at the Catholic league meet in 16:26, improving further at the regional meet after a quick start landed him a 16:11, seventh-place finish leading into the state meet.

#### Stefan Morell, Lakeland

Hitting his best time early in the season with a 16:12 finish at the Jackson Invitational Sept. 26, Morell's 10th-place finish nearly repeated at the state meet when he earned All-State honors in 16:14, landing 18th overall.

"He's run varsity for four years. This was the first year in his fouryear career we didn't make it (to States) as a team. He really built up his experience over four years on varsity," coach Randy Wilkins said. "He's our captain, our MVP and. our best runner. He comes from a pretty good family of runners."

#### Blake Yard, South Lyon

With a season-best 16:13 at the regional meet in Brighton, Yard led the Lions throughout the year. He improved on his 2008 state finish by 45 spots to finish 51st in 16:41.6.

"Blake is a tough competitor, a hard worker and a team player. He was an exceptionally reliable front runner and he got steadily faster throughout the season," coach Scott Smith said.

#### SECOND TEAM Viktor Puskorius, CC

The Shamrock senior ran to All-State status by finishing 23rd overall at the State Finals. His finish of 16:17.4 also finished 14th in team scoring for the State Champs.

#### Austin Zebrowski, CC

Austin ran in a tight back that helped the Shamrocks claim the 2009 State Championship. He finished 20th in team scoring and 31st overall, missing All-State by one place in 16:22.0.

Last Saturday the Novi Men's Cross Country team traveled to Island Lake State Park to compete in the South Lyon Invitational. Eleven teams from across

Michigan and Ohio accepted the invitation to race in their first competition of the season. It has been 9 months since their last race and there was a lot of anticipation in the air for the field of 77 harriers.

At the gun the field exploded towards the first turn 200 meters away. Soon the runners settled into their pace to complete the 3.1 mile course.

"I think that the front pack went out a little too fast" commented Coach Robert Smith. "A sub 5 minute mile is a bit too ambitious for a race in August."

The defending champion Wildcats hung on and won the race with a comfortable margin. In cross county the low score wins, and Novi's score was 46, twenty one points ahead of their nearest rival (Temperance Bedford).

Mike Blaszczyk paced Novi with a third place personal finish. His time of 16:29 proves that he is ready to compete at the front again this year. As a junior Blaszczyk was an all-state runner at the State Finals.

Junior Joe Schubring finished 6th with a time of 17:01. "Joe had an outstanding summer. He put in a lot of quality miles, and now he is enjoying the fruits of his labor" noted Coach Smith.

Alex Minghine was the third Wildcat to come across the finish line. "Alex ran the smartest race of all of our guys today" said Smith. "Last year he often started a little too slow. Today he ran his first mile more on pace for this time of the season". Alex raced to a 10th place finish with his time of 17:11.

Close behind Alex was Geoff Giese. "Geoff started the season injured last year. With him in the line-up we are a much better team". Giese came in 12th place; running 17:21.

Rounding out the top 5 (scorers) for the Wildcats was Brett Giampa. "Brett has really stepped up his game. He is running about 45 seconds faster than he did last year at this time. In fact, Brett ran a career best time of 17:27 to give him 12th place".

Dan Egner came in 6th for his team (21st overall) running 17:36. "Dan was a little off of his game today" commented Coach Smith. "Dan ran as our number 2 man many times for us last season. As he makes the transition from the 800 meters (spring track) to 3.1 miles I am confident that he will return to challenge the rest of our top 5. When that happens, we will be even more solid than we are right now".

Junior Chase Conrad was the 7th runner for Novi in the varsity race. Chase ran an 18:13 for 40th place. Last year Chase did not even finish this race due to an injury,



#### Rochester's Goethals continues domination at county cross country meet

#### Troy girls, Catholic Central boys win team titles



MILFORD — Rochester's Megan Goethals continued to widen the gap between herself and the rest of the area runners.

Running with the authority and passion of a national-class athlete, Goethals took first place at the Oakland County cross country championships, smashing the course record while leaving a stellar field of challengers in her wake.

Goethals clocked 17:40.25 for the hilly, five-kilometer layout, breaking her own course and Oakland County meet record of 17:55 at the Kensington site. No other Oakland County girl has broken 18 minutes on the course.

Novi Detroit Catholic Central's boys and Troy's girls each won

their second straight meet titles, while Mike Atchoo of Troy ran the third fastest Oakland County meet time at the Kensington site, winning in 15:54.

Troy's girls scored 110 points to sneak past rising Birmingham Seaholm, who finished with 112. Lakeland was third with 192 and Waterford Mott followed with 194.

For the boys, the Shamrocks, with five finishers in the top 25, won with 101 points with Novi placing second with 122 and Lake Orion (126), Milford (134), Troy (165) and Lakeland (200) following.

Ricardo Galindo (third), Andrew Garcia-Garrison (10th), Viktor Puskorius (14th), Austin Zebrowski (16th) and John-Paul Zebrowski (25th), returning from an injury, led the way for Catholic Central.

"I think having John-Paul coming back lifted our spirits," Shamrocks coach Tony Magni said. "It was the first time he raced in three weeks. We just ran as a unit and off we went."

So did Novi, whose Mike Blaszczyk (12th), Joe Schubring (23rd) and Dan Egner (27th) led the Wildcats. Coach Bob Smith, who only recently returned from a serious accident where he suffered a lacerated spleen, a separated shoulder and broken ribs. "I was shooting for a top five, so second was a pleasant surprise," he said. "Our fifth man (Brett Giampa) was 31st, (so) he was the unsung hero."

Atchoo, who has yet to lose a race this season, led virtually from the start. A large chase pack, which included teammate James Yau, Galindo, Lake Orion's Sean Bone and Notre Dame Prep's Chris Burns, was still in contact midway through the race.

Atchoo, still mindful of the runners chasing him, forged on as he continued his own pace.

"You never really know how close they are to you ... or if they're gaining on you," Atchoo said. "So you just have to keep running hard."

He did, fending off Bone, who had the only real chance to stay close in the last mile. "I was just thinking 'hold on to Mike and you'll have a good race,' " said the senior, who was second in 16:04.

Burns wound up fourth, Mott's Scott Albaugh was fifth, Walled Lake Central's Kyle Roche was seventh and Milford's Nate Huff was eighth, leading the Mavs to a fourth place finish.

On the girls front, Goethals, who usually bides her time until the last mile, pressed the pace from the start, per coach Larry Adams' orders. Waterford Mott's Shannon Osika and Troy's Michelle Moriset, a pair of All-State athletes, were the closest challengers and they were fighting for second place some 25 seconds behind midway through the race. Meanwhile Goethals, setting a relentless pace, continued to widen the gap. "It felt good to be able to let loose like that," said the senior, who won by nearly 50 seconds. "It really got hard the last mile because I didn't have anybody with me to push me up those hills."

Moriset was second in 18:29 and Osika came in at 18:44.

"I always go out with Shannon and Megan and see how long I can last," smiled Moriset, who handled the winning trophy. "It was a really good day to run. I'm proud of everyone on our team."

Indeed, the Colts had Sammy Johnson (15th), Julia Dinverno (16th), Madison Pines (30th) and a gallant effort by Katie Shaheen, the Colts' fifth runner.

"She had an asthma attack coming off that hill," said Troy coach Matt Richardson, whose Colts have won the last two county meet titles by a total of five points. "She lost some spots but she hung tough. She saved us."

Although Seaholm coach Jeff Devantier lamented the close loss, he was also encouraged.

"You can't be displeased in the way they ran when you have four girls in the top 19 in this competition," he said. "That's fantastic."

Triplets Mallory Wilberding (fourth), Tess Wilberding (sixth) and Aubrey Wilberding (14th) and Alex Mathews (19th), trying to work her way back into shape following an injury, led the Maples, while Lakeland continues its venture into unknown territory. "For us to finish third, incredible," he said. "We've never been third."

Bloomfield Hills Lahser had the top finishing boys and girls squads for Division 2-, 3- and 4-sized schools.



Rounding out the scoring for Novi were Joe Schubring, fifth (16:38); Dan Egner, sixth (16:39); Brett Giampa, ninth (16:44) and Geoff Giese, 13th (16:50).

"We ran with our strength - our depth," Novi coach Robert Smith said. "They know each other's strengths and weaknesses. If they're weak in a certain spot, there's another fellow there to pick them up. If they're strong in another spot, then another just goes for the ride and gets pulled through."



## Catholic Central, Novi advance to state cross country meet

BRIGHTON — A regional title was in grasp of the Novi Detroit Catholic Central cross country team at Friday's Division 1 regional at Huron Meadows Metropark. But the pesky Pirates of Pinckney were saboteurs extraordinaire, surging in the latter part of the race to capture the crown by a mere two points on a drizzly afternoon.

Pinckney scored 39 points and Catholic Central had 41. But the drama continued for the third and final qualifying spot for next week's state meet and Novi, which scored 91 points, squeaked past Brighton (93).

The Shamrocks' Ricky Galindo ran down Pinckney's Tanner Pesonen in the final 100 meters, clocking 15:32.3 for the five-kilometer course to win the regional title. Pesonen was a step behind in 15:33.

On the girls side, Pinckney (54), Northville (71) and Brighton (81) edged out fourth-place finisher Walled Lake Western (90) for the qualifying

berths.

Western's Lindsay Clark won the regional title, edging runner-up Jackie Mullins of Novi, who finished ahead of Julia Valencia of Western, as all three led the top 15 individuals who automatically qualify for the state meet.

The trio was locked in a tight race for much of the course until Clark and Mullins eased ahead of Valencia. Clark, though, went ahead with about 300 meters to go and powered through the finish line in 18:26.9, with Mullins (18:27.9) and Valencia (18:38.9) following.

"It was nerve-wracking the whole time," said Clark, smiling broadly despite her tired legs. "I was thinking the whole time, not to let her (Mullins) go. I kept telling myself I was going to do it, (and) don't stop."

Mullins recalled the battle, which left her breathless at the end.

"It was the hardest race I've ever run," said the freshman, who lost to Valencia in two previous races and now appears to be closing the gap.

"It was hard," Valencia said, "but I'm just looking forward to states."

Farmington's Gabby Deflorio clocked 18:50 in finishing fourth, while Western's Kelsey Young (13th) and Farmington's Olivia Salinas also earned state-qualifying berths.

For the boys, the Shamrocks looked strong early with Galindo, Andrew Garcia-Garrison and Austin Zebrowski leading the pack for the first mile. Pinckney's runners began working their way up through the latter stages of the race. Both teams had five runners among the top 16, but Pinckney had three runners ahead of Garcia-Garrison, the Shamrocks' second runner, who finished eighth.

"We ran tough, but we didn't run smart," Shamrocks coach Tony Magni said. "Pinckney ran a super race, and Viktor (Puskorious) came out of nowhere. (But) the thing is to qualify, and if you win it, it's a bonus."

Puskorius was 12th, and John-Paul Zebrowski 13th for the Shamrocks.

Galindo gave up the lead to Pesonen in the final mile, but still stayed on his heels.

"I couldn't give him an indication that I was tired or hurting," he said.

So Galindo fought to stay with Pesonen, and as the finish line neared, he felt more inspired with a strong sprint that closed the deal.

"It's always exciting running against Tanner ... (and) it's always exciting to have a close race like that," he said.

Novi coach Robert Smith breathed a sigh of relief after discovering the Wildcats were in.

"Ahhh, we made it," smiled the veteran mentor.

Mike Blasczyzk was third in 15:54 to lead Novi, whose Joe Schubring (15th), Geoffrey Giese (22nd), Brett Giampa (25th) and Dan Egner (26th) rounded out their scoring.





A junior on the Olivet Nazarene University (Ill.) team, MacDonough earned All-American honors Nov. 21 when he placed 20th of 323 runners at the NAIA Cross Country Nationals in Vancouver, Wash. with an 8k time of 25 minutes and 42 seconds.

"The race was not exactly how I thought it would be. It was not hilly, but it was sloppy and wet from raining all week," MacDonough said, who was about 60th place after the first mile, which he ran in 4:53. "I just wasn't expecting that many people to go out that fast. I was also concerned with our team. We had never been on a course

that small. People were throwing elbows."

His time ended up leading the Tigers to an 11th place NAIA finish among 32 teams. Silas Kisorio, a sophomore from Oklahoma Christian, won the overall race in 24:23.

"The All-American honor was great. I just wanted to get it to score as few points as I could so we could get a low team score," MacDonough said.

Although he was short of the 24:51 personal record he set in Wisconsin a few weeks prior, MacDonough said he couldn't have hoped for any better on the mucky Vancouver course and that he and his teammates left it all on the course. He also said the lessons he learned on Novi's cross country team continue to help him as a runner.

"Coach (Rob) Smith was a huge help just providing the base knowledge on how to run. He taught me what he calls 'battle and war.' If someone wins the battle up the hill, but you peak, you can win the war," MacDonough said. "I miss running at Novi a whole lot, but I love the program here."

MacDonough said it was a huge weight off his shoulders to earn All-American honors his junior year, so he can focus on getting his team into the top 10 next fall. He hopes to have current Novi senior Mike Blaszczyk running by his side as a freshman next season.

"I like him personally because he runs like me, a nice and skinny long-distance runner," MacDonough said.

Other former Wildcats had success without leaving the state. Alex Prasad, another 2007 Novi alum, led a group of former Wildcats running with University of Michigan-Ann Arbor's club running team, called Mrun, at Eagle Crest Golf Course in Ypsilanti on Nov. 14. Prasad's time of 27:03 was third on the Mrun team and 23rd overall, earning him NIRCA second-team All-American honors.

"Considering my struggles this season with various injuries, I'm very pleased with my race. Couldn't

## Moving On Up: Blaszczyk and Egner Take Their Show on the Road

It's not every day that a Novi High School sports program sends an athlete on to intercollegiate competition. But over the past week Novi Cross Country has had not one but two of its runner ink letters of intent to compete at the next level: Mike Blaszczyk and Dan Egner.

(Cronyism alert: as you know I've been intimately involved with Novi Cross Country for about seven years now, and further both Mike and Dan (left) are close friends. I don't think either of these realities has shrouded my judgment that this is a story worth telling however.)

Mike, the brother of Miss Michigan, Nicole Blaszczyk, will be headed to St. Francis, an NAIA school southwest of Chicago in Joliet. There he'll run for Drew Ludtke, long time director of Wolverine Cross Country Camp, which Novi attends annually during the last week of July. Mike thinks that played a key role in his recruitment. Familiarity with Ludtke made Mike feel "more at home" with St. Francis. He had a personal connection with UNO as well; Kenny MacDonough, Mike's former teammate at Novi, is currently the Tigers top runner.



Mike hopes to study marketing at St. Francis, and has a team first attitude towards his future at St. Francis. When I asked him what goals he had for his collegiate running career, the first thing he mentioned was getting his team to cross country nationals. Coming from such a strong high school program, it's no wonder Mike's goal is to replicate that team success at the next level.

Dan is headed just down M-14 to <u>Eastern Michigan</u>, and says proximity was the number one factor for him. Also, Dan is excited about the Animation Simulation and Gaming Major offered at Eastern. Mike ran cross country and track all four of his years at Novi, but Dan took a much more interesting path to becoming a collegiate runner. He played both basketball and baseball his freshman year, before making the unorthodox switch to cross country and track starting his sophomore year. If he could go back and redo high school, changing anything, he says he would have definitely ran his freshman year in both the fall and spring. Dan has been told that he'll redshirt his first year, and already has his eyes set on a spot on the varsity team of a program with 6 track national championships to its name.

While they took very different routes their present status as leaders of the Novi Cross Country and Track squads, there is one thing that both Mike and Dan agree on: the importance of Coach Smith in their running, and personal, lives. Mike "can't express how grateful" he is to have had Smith as a coach, and says he just calls him coach because "he's the only coach to me." Mike explains his commitment to running by saying running for Smith was "almost like trying to make your father proud...he gave me the inspiration to never give up." Dan too says Smith has made a huge impact in his life. "Smith really changed the way I see the world. He helped me learn how to work hard in everything I do. He is the best coach I have ever had in any sport."

In talking to Mike and Dan, I can see the immense value that sports have added to their life. The lessons they've learned from Coach Smith, and through running, now affect their daily non-athletic lives. I'd argue those are life lessons that may not have been taught without sports.
