Grand marshal Marty Crane

The state of Michigan has been a hotbed of high school track and field excellence for decades, but if you ask knowledgeable track and field fans about the most stellar coaches in the history of the state, the list composed

will most assuredly include the name Marty Crane, at or near, the top of the list!

Marty coached cross country and track and field at Flint Beecher High School for 34 years from 1969-2003. This followed four years running for the legendary Coach George Dale at Western Michigan University. His career as a followed four years running for the legendary Coach George Dale at Western Michigan University. teacher at Beecher spanned 36 years. Marty's track and field teams claimed 13 league titles, 19 regional championships, 3 state runners-up trophies, and 10 state titles. Along the way, he coached 83 all-staters. The coaching accolades followed accordingly. He was an 11-time Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association (MITCA) state coach of the year, a National High School Athletic Coaches Association (NHSACA) Coach of the Year four times, an inductee into the Greater Flint Sports Hall of Fame and the MITCA Hall of Fame, a member of the Michigan High School Coaches Association (MHSCA) Hall of Fame, and an inductee into the NHSACA Hall of Fame.

Coach Crane has contributed in areas beyond his work with Flint Beecher athletes. He was a four-year officer in MITCA, culminating

in his role as president of MITCA in 1984. He served for many years on MITCA committees and numerous Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) committees, was as an NCAA Indoor Track and Field Championship official from 1968-1983 when the Meletic Association and its a member of the Greater Flint Olympian/CANUSA Association and the Association of Track Official of Michigan, and is a member of the Greater Flint Olympian/CANUSA Association and the Association of Track Official of Michigan, and Island and Is ficials of Michigan (ATOM). His work as promoter of the sport and official has also been honored. Marty has won the Harold Webster award (CANUSA Games), the Mary Lavoie award (Flint Olympian Games), and the Bob Bloomer award (ATOM).

Coach Crane's connection to the Midwest Meet of Champions began in 1978 when he began serving as the men's jump coach. He

stayed in this role through 1996. Although he stepped away from the coaching staff in 1997, he began a 13-year tenure as the ACT coordinator for athletes taking the test on the weekend of the meet. Thereafter, he has continued to serve as an assistant to the coaching staff, and during the years when Michigan has hosted the meet, Marty has been the head long jump official, a role he has

also held at the Division 1 state finals since 2004.

Marty recalls that while serving as a Midwest coach, he simply, "encouraged the athletes to do what they had already been doing," since they were clearly highly successful. Crane feels the Midwest Meet has been a great "showcase of the best talent Michigan has to offer and the competition has bred some great interstate rivalries." He cites his most dynamic memory as that of Earl Jones performance in 1982, when the Taylor Center grad and eventual Eastern Michigan University athlete, not only set a still standing 1600 meter run record of 4:07.19, but anchored the Michigan 1600 relay team to a come-from-behind win with a spectacular 47-second split. Marty continues to be one of the most active track and field and cross country officials in the state. His footprint on track and field in Michigan is permanent and spectacular! Thank you, Coach Crane.

Grand marshal Jerry Sessions

Back in 1974, most folks in the Maple Valley school district probably could have told you that senior Jerry Sessions was a very good athlete. In fact, he was good enough to earn honorable mention all-state recognition in football was a very good atniete. A few could probably also have told you that he twice finished in the top 5 in the state in the pole vault. But how many could have predicted that Jerry would become one of the most recognized pole vault coaching experts in the entire state?!? Yet, that is exactly what Jerry has accomplished.

Shortly after graduation, Sessions went to work in local machine shops. He eventually landed at Allen Patterns in Battle Creek, where he has worked for 34 years and currently serves as shop supervisor. He helped his alma mater's track and field program off and on until 1985, when he signed on for the first of his now 34 consecutive years as an assistant coach for the girls in the jumping events. Teaming with now retired head coach Gary Hamilton, the Maple Valley girls won an MHSAA state title in 1992 and a MITCA team state championship in 2005, along with

numerous league and regional titles and top 5 state meet finishes.

Jerry has a passion for track and field, and he made that clear early in his coaching career by transporting numerous Maple Valley athletes to the Grand Ledge Summer Track and Field program on a regular basis. After doing so for about a decade, Jerry initiated a summer program in Maple Valley, managing it from 1994-2003. Prior to that, he had already developed a reputation as an outstanding pole vault coach. Clearly, this had been his #1 passion, dating back to 4th grade when he first decided he wanted to vault. Jerry said when he finished as state-runner-up in 1973 with his one pole, he knew then that he "wanted to share his knowledge and poles with others." Since then he has become a conduit for technique education, practice, and poles!

In 1999, with the assistance of the Maple Valley Public Schools, he was able to have an indoor vaulting facility developed at the high school. In 2001, he established a formal training program for vaulters throughout the Greater Lansing area and beyond. He called it Landon Athletics, in honor of his first grandson, Landon, born in 2000. This now includes his own indoor/outdoor vault facility. That program has served hundreds of pole vaulters from all over the mid-Michigan area, and, indeed, the entire state. In collaboration with the coaches at their high schools, Jerry has mentored 22 vaulters to 31 state outdoor titles as well as nine to indoor championships; has coached athletes who have held records in MHSAA divisions 1,2,3 and 4; and has coached three emerging elite champions and three all-Americans. Coach Sessions served as the pole vault coach for Team Michigan at the Midwest Meet from 1997-2014. He sti appears every year to accompany his current athletes. Jerry calls the Midwest Meet "a spectacular elite meet." He goes on to say, "I have always found it exciting, and I am impressed with the whole event!"

Jerry's efforts have not gone unnoticed. He has been given the Greater Lansing Honor Roll Eddy award to recognize his contributions. These go beyond the track to the 17 years he also served on the Maple Valley Public Schools Board of Education. Jerry is adamant in noting that none of this would be possible without the obvious dedication of the athletes as well as the continued support of the Maple Valley Public Schools and the contributions of his family. While all of these accomplishments helped to get Jerry to his current status as one of the elite pole vault coaches in the Midwest, he is still humble, noting, "There is nothing better than watching an

athlete set a new personal record, hit the mat, and leap up smiling!" Yes, indeed.

NOTE: Illinois and even West Virginia for a few years expanded the event beyond the three original states who competed in the inaugural 1974 meet. Indiana hosted the meet the first 22 years in Fort Wayne and at Indiana University-Purdue University-Indianapolis before it moved to Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, Ohio, for 10 years (except for 2002 at Wittenburg University in Springfield, Ohio). Jackson High School in Jackson, Mich., hosted from 2006-09; Northrop High School in Fort Wayne, Ind., from 2010-13; Denison University in Granville, Ohio, in 2014-15, Ohio Wesleyan again in 2016-17, and now Michigan State University in East Lansing, Mich, from 2018-21. The following early history of the meet is reprinted from 1986.

The meet originated as a result of interest and discussion in the fall of 1972 among members of the Indiana Track and Cross Country Association who wished to establish an all-star track and field meet.

Subsequent meetings with the state associations from Ohio and Michigan led to the finalization of plans for the first Tri-State Meet of Champions, which was held in Fort Wayne, Indiana, on June 8, 1974. The first meet was very successful with each state having 40 athletes compete.

With the advent of the fourth meet in 1977, some exciting changes and additions had taken place. The state of Illinois was added to the meet and the name changed to the Midwest Meet of Champions.

Two outstanding former Olympians were present to pay tribute to the meet. Jim Ryun, the outstanding U.S. miler, served as honorary referee, and Madeline Manning Jackson, former Olympic gold medal winner in the 800-meter run, was an honored guest and sang the National Anthem.

The first banquet for the athletes was held on Friday evening at the Summit Club, with Illinois

being the guest team. The budget for the meet went over the \$10,000 figure for the first time. A major change in the Midwest Meet occurred again in its sixth year. Four women's events were added, and a coach for the women from each state was also added.

Jimmy Carnes, the 1980 head United States coach, served as honorary referee, and Madeline Manning Jackson returned for a third straight year, not only to sing the National Anthem but to

run an exhibition mile with the girls in preparation for the 1980 Olympics.

The first full banquet for all four teams, sponsored by the Journal Gazette, was held, and the News Sentinel sponsored a Saturday morning brunch. An open 5,000-meter race was run on Saturday morning in conjunction with the meet. Because of the expansion of the meet with additions and other changes, the 1979 budget rose to \$18,000.

In June 1980, the women's events were expanded to six and the running events were changed to meters with meet records adjusted accordingly. Olympic 800-meter run champion Dave

Wottle served as honorary referee.

Subsequent meets since 1980 have seen much contnued expansion with the addition of several


more women's events.

In 1986, the meet will feature 14 men's events and 11 events for women. Approximately 300 athletes will compete in 1986, a vastly expanded number compared compared to the original 120 participants.

The meet has also continued to feature for Olympians and coaches as honorary referees and

guests, adding interest for meet participants and spectators alike.

Among those guests were longtime friend of track and field Hermon Philips, former Olympian Willie Davenport, 1976 U.S. team captain and triple jump 5th-place finisher Tommy Haynes. 1980 U.S. team captain and 100-meter dash world record holder Harvey Glance, Northwestern University women's track and cross country coach Dee Todd, 1976 Olympic silver medalist hurdler Mike Shine, and 1984 Olympic 1500-meter run 5th-place finisher Jim Spivey.

3 SIMPLE STEPS TO GOOD FORM

#1 POSTURE



Feet straight, knees relaxed.

Head level, eyes looking

Clasp hands, stretch and reach to the sky, elongating spine.

Drop arms to sides at a 90% angle. Keep arms & shoulders

Use compact arm swings, avoid crossing the body's center line.

#2 LANDING



Land midfeut first, not on heel.

Entire foot lands softly, under hip line, not out front (overstriding).

Run light, avoid pounding.

Landing under hips promotes a balanced running position minimizing friction (braking).

Increasing cadence (taking shorter, quicker strides) reduces the chance of overstnding.

#3 LEAN



Lean from the ankles without bending at the waist.

Keep weight slightly forward and flex at the ankles.

Use gravity to help generate forward momentum.

Reset posture, then lean tall

COMMON FORM RUNNING



Slouching posture, backward lean, heel striking & overstriding

lead to inefficient effort, excessive body shock, braking forces and many common injuries.

GOOD FORM RUNNING

Better body alignment, midfoot landing, higher cadence & a forward lean ensure an easier run, increased efficiency, and greatly reduce the chance of injury.


